YOUTH ACTIVITIES PLANNED

Mr. R R P Singh, Director Postal Services, Delhi Circle called a meeting on August 29, at the Committee Room of the Office of the Chief Postmaster General. Mrs. Savita Jhingan, Mr. Pulak Gupta, Mr. Vijay Seth and Mr. Madhukar Jhingan represented the philatelists.

The agenda of the meeting was to organize (1) Painting Competition, (2) Letter Writing Competition, (3) Quiz Competition, and (4) Sit & Draw Contest on the occasion of INDEPEX-ASIANA 2000. In addition to organize regional and circle level competitions Delhi plays host to North Zone finals. The north zone includes 7 postal circles - Jammu & Kashmir, Punjab, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, and Bihar besides Delhi.

The All India finals shall be held on December 9 at Calcutta during the INDEPEX-ASIANA 2000. The regional level competitions shall be held between September 17-30, the circle level between October 15-25, and Zonal finals on November 10 at Delhi for North, on November 13 at Mumbai for West, on November 16 at Chennai for South and on November 19 at Calcutta for East Zone.

OLYMPIC ISSUE RESCHEDULED

India is issuing a set of four diamond shaped stamps to mark the 27th Olympic games at Sydney, Australia. These stamps earlier were expected to be released on September 15 to coincide with the opening of the games. However the stamps shall now be issued on September 17.

Mr. Tlak De, Director (GPO), Calcutta shall be representing India Post at OLYMPHILEX 2000, Stamps & Coin Expo, being held from September 15 to 28 as a FIP World Specialized Show as a part of the Olympic games. Mr. De will get the Indian stamps released on September 17 that is the Stamp Day at OLYMPHILEX 2000. We hope the First Day Cover of these stamps postmarked at Sydney shall also be put on sale at philatelic bureaux in India.

ALSO IN THE NEWS

STAMPS FOR USE OF INTERNATIONAL OLYMPIC COMMITTEE

The International Olympic Committee (IOC) with its headquarters in Lausanne, Switzerland, which is also home of the famous Modern Olympic Museum, needs no

further introduction. Every two years IOC acts as patron to the world's biggest sporting events – the Summer Olympics and Winter Olympics.

As an international organization the IOC is entitled to its own official stamps. Under an agreement with Swiss Post a booklet of two round-shaped self-adhesive stamps to mark Sydney Olympics are being issued on September 15, 2000. Belgian artist Jean-Michel Folon designed the stamps.

LUPHILA 2000 August 26-27

We apologize for incorrect reporting in the last issue that this exhibition was postponed to March 2001. IT WAS NOT.

Mr. Suraj Jaitly, our correspondent for Punjab, reports that it was successfully held on August 26-27. Nineteen entries in Competition Class were exhibited in 52 philatelic frames.

The exhibition was inaugurated by Mr. Vivek Kaul, Director Postal Services, Punjab Postal Circle on 26th. Mr. Kaul also released a special cover on Tiger Safari with a special postmark of a Tiger head. A painting competition was organized in two groups – the subjects were Road Safety and Ludhiana City & Pollution. About 300 students participated in this competition. A Seminar on “Philately – King of Hobbies” was also organized on the same day, in which about 25 students took part.

On 27th Mr. Suraj Jaitly, Vice Chairman of Luphila 2000 organized a Workshop on Philately that was attended by more than 100 students. In the evening Mr. S K Sandhu, Deputy Commissioner, Ludhiana released another special cover on Horticulture Tools for Garden Lovers along with a special Souvenir that contains articles on youth philately and information about Ludhiana. He also gave away prizes to the participants. A Large Silver, ten Silver and eight bronze medals were awarded. The show was a grand success.
