As if putting together this newsletter and maintenance our websites wasn't enough we have undertaken to author and publish POSTAL STATIONERY OF INDIA 1947-2000 within this year. There will be a hardcopy edition, CD edition as well as an Online edition.

The first 25 years are well researched and documented though no research is ever complete. The real challenge is in collecting and documenting Modern Postal Stationery Of India with Advertisements –

Since 1975 ads have appeared on Postal Card, Aerogramme, and Inland Letter Card.

An illustrated, complete, authentic, and yearly updated checklist is desperately needed.

The Post Office rarely provides any information on these issues.

The ads have appeared in 14 different languages.

The ads are released in area/s specified by the advertiser and are not available on all India basis.

It is difficult to keep up with the new issues, as the current output is 100+ per year.

Four printers are employed and more than one printer has printed some of the issues.

Perhaps too numerous, an estimate is 1500+ different issues since 1975.

Many of the ads have popular thematic contents and demand far exceeds the supplies.

The quantity printed per ad is usually 1 million only, whereas demand for postal stationery is in billions per year.

No collector or dealer claims to have a comprehensive accumulation.

We can build a standard reference for these issues by pooling resources and by the cooperative efforts of all concerned. You are invited to partake in the challenge and the

fun of collecting modern postal stationery of India. REMEMBER these issues are not made-for-collectors issues.

GREETING POST LAUNCHED

"Greeting Post "a new product by India Post was launched by Mr. Ram Vilas Paswan, India's Minister for Communications, in a function organized at India Post's HQ "Dak Bhavan" on September 6, 2000 at New Delhi.

There are 32 different colorful designs of Greetings Cards with Pre-Stamped Envelopes. The postage stamps on the envelopes are an exact replica of the cards with name of the country, denomination and simulated perforations. The cards and consequently the envelopes are of two sizes - small (10.9 x 17.3 cm) and medium (12.3 x 19.3 cm). The envelopes for the small cards carry smaller size stamp imprint (4 x 3 cm) while the medium size cards have larger imprint (5 x 4 cm). The denomination of all stamps is Rs. 3 that prepays the postal charges within India. The small size greeting cards are priced at Rs. 12 and the medium size cards are for Rs. 15 each. A complete set of 32 greeting cards will cost Rs. 429 only.

Besides giving the name of the designer and printer, each design is numbered on the back and carries the logo of India Post. Calcutta Security Printers printed the cards numbered 0001 to 0022 and Madras Security Printers numbered 0023 to 0034. The cards number 0002 and 0008 shall be printed and issued later. The number is given in the

following format: 0000X00 - the first four digits are the design code, the letter "S" or "M" follows which stands for Small or Medium. The last two digits are the year of issue. Initially only 20,000 of each design have been printed.

Only 27 different designs were available for sale at the release function. 23 designs were later made available at the Philatelic Bureau, New Delhi. However these 23 designs contained 2 new designs that were not on sale at the release function bringing the total to 29 different greeting cards. No special first day of issue postmark was provided for this issue and regular date stamp of the Bureau was used. Only 6 collectors got the 29 pre-stamped envelopes postmarked.

All 32 designs will be put on sale all over India not only at the post offices but also at all outlets that stock and sell greeting cards, making it easier for the customer to purchase these cards.

The greeting cards carry either of the 2 messages - Happy Diwali or Seasons Greetings in English and Hindi. Of the 29 designs available on the first day 23 carried Happy Diwali and the remaining 6 Seasons Greetings. The balance 3 designs also carry Happy Diwali.

Several more designs are under print and will be put on sale to catch the festive season of Christmas and New Year.

This is a revised and updated edition of the report mailed earlier on September 6, 2000.

Foreign customers can also avail the facility by opening an account with Director (Philately), Mumbai GPO - 400001 with initial and subsequent deposits in foreign exchange equivalent to Rs. 1000.

INDIAN RAILWAYS

Maldives. June 8, 2000. Asian Railways/The Stamp Show 2000, London

4 Stamps and 2 Sheetlets of 6 se-tenant 10rf stamps each

The 4 stamps are on Japanese Railways, 1 Sheetlet is on Chinese Railways, and 1 Sheetlet on Indian Railways. The designs are:

- (1) East Indian Railway 2-2-2 Fawn, 1856;
- (2) East Indian Railway Standard 4-4-0 Express, 1893;
- (3) Bengal-Nagpur Railway 4-4-2 Express, 1909;
- (4) Great Peninsular Railway 4-6-0 Class HPS, 1924;
- (5) North Western Railways Class XS2 4-6-2 Pacific, 1932;
- (6) Indian National Railways Standard Narrow Gauge Class YP 4-6-2, 1949
