NEWS & ANNOUNCEMENTS

MORE NEW DEFINITIVES

India Post will issue two stamps in denomination of Rs. 15 and 20 in the $8^{\rm th}$ definitive series featuring Natural Heritage. This will be the $4^{\rm th}$ issue in the new series introduced on April 30, 2000. The Stamps depict Butterfly and Amaltaas respectively.

The Rs. 15 denomination reappears in the definitive series after a gap of 52 years. The last time it was issued in the first definitive series of India after independence in 1949, more popularly known as archaeological series.

PRINT ORDER FOR NEW ISSUES

Further to our report in the last issue on the commemorative stamp of October 16 that was sold out due to the small print order of 100,000, we are happy to inform that the print order for next two issues, Children's Day and Maharaja Bijli Pasi, is now 300,000 and 400,000 respectively. In our opinion these should be available freely. However please do buy your requirement early noting the low face value of Rs.3 of these issues and the greeting card season being on, to avoid disappointment.

The India Post officials informed us that the decision to print 100,000 only for lesser-known personalities was taken by the Philatelic Advisory Committee (PAC) of India Post chaired by the Minister for Communications Ram Vilas Paswan. The Philatelic Congress of India, the national federation of philatelic societies, represents the interests of the philatelists by nominating six members, including its president and a member of the trade, on the PAC.

INDEPEX-ASIANA 2000 MEETINGS

The philatelist members of the committee present were M G Pittie -Co-Vice Chairman, Sahadeva Sahoo, Dilip Shah, Vispi S Dastur, Ajeet R Singhee, G Madan Mohan Das, Yogesh Kumar, and Manik Jain. The Commissioner General Rajesh K Bagri, Assistant Commissioner General B N Majumdar, and Dhirubahi Mehta, were unable to attend the meeting.

Sudhir Jain, our correspondent for Madhya Pradesh, reports having received a cover with special postmark of Bilaspur bearing date 1.Nov.2000, words "Creation Of Chhatisgarh" and the map of new State. The cover was mailed by Atul Jain of Bilaspur.

The Chhatisgarh was inaugurated on November 1, 2000 as the 26th state of India. The new state is craved out of Madhya Pradesh. Bilaspur is the seat of the new High Court, 19th in the country, of the newly formed state while the capital is Raipur. There are 16 districts in the state with a population of 176 million.

The 27th state of India, Uttranchal, will be created on November 9, 2000 and the 28th, Jharkhand, on November 15, 2000. We hope India Post will provide some philatelic commemoration on those occasions too.
