Tapan Sikdar, Minister of State for Communications released Children's Day Stamp on November 14, 2000 in a function organized at the Committee Room of India Post HQ at 11.30 am.

Calcutta Security Printers Limited printed 3 million stamps by photo-offset in panes of 40 stamps each. The FDC is priced at Rs. 2 each.

Eulogizing D N, Madhukar Jhingan as convener of the meeting started by talking about the personal loss to so many collectors and friends of DN.

G B Pai, one of the senior most philatelists in India paid rich tributes to D N. He recounted his association with DN from the first day when he met him, the philatelic experiences that they shared and the career graph of D N.

B N Som, during the course of his tribute he said that we do not yet know what we have lost. It is only in the times to come, we will realize true value of DN's contribution. The unprecedented amount of respect, admiration that DN commanded from fellow philatelists everywhere needed to be seen to be believed. As most of us had the opportunity to work with him closely we did not recognize his true genius. It is most unkind that he has been snatched away from our midst when the 14th Asian Philatelic Exhibition was only days away. It was planned for Calcutta, as it was his city of residence, in his honor. There was a program planned to felicitate him publicly there.

A 2 minutes silence was observed as a mark of respect to the departed soul. It was decided to forward the heartfelt condolences of the philatelists and officials of India Post to Mrs. Jatia to let her know that we share her grief.

A condolence meeting was also organized at the Conference Room of Yogayog Bhavan, Calcutta on November 15, 2000, at 3 pm. Philatelists and postal officials attended the meeting. B N Som, Director General of India Post, & Chairman of the World Association for Development of Philately (WADP) talked about the

loss to philately and to philatelic world. M G Pittie, Secretary General of Inter-Asia Philatelic Federation (FIAP) read out the condolence messages pouring in from all over the world. P Gupta, Dipok Dey, and R D Binani also spoke on the occasion.

The District Collector of Satna, T Dharma Rao, and City Magistrate Naveen Tiwari were the guests of Inaugural Day and the Mayor of Satna city Dr B L Yadav distributed the prizes on concluding day.
