##### POSTAL STRIKE ENDS

Postal strike that began on December 5, 2000 formally ended on the 14<sup>th</sup> day, although in some parts of the country it ended earlier. It will take some time to restore normalcy in all services. We received the first post strike mail on December 16. Government of India remained firm during the strike, their stand being to resolve the matter legally. The Supreme Court of India and High Court of Delhi heard the cases.

NEW STAMPS RELEASED

Defense Minister George Fernandes, released the special stamp to mark the 400 years of Kunjali Marakkar, the Admirals of the Zamorin of Calicut under the Maritime Heritage series at a special function at Town Hall, Kozhikode (Calicut) on December 17, 2000. Dr. K K N Kurup, Vice Chancellor of the Calicut University presided over the function. The stamp in the denomination of Rs. 3, the inland letter post rate, depicts 'paroe', a small craft used by the Kunjalis during wars.

Sankha Samanta designed the stamp and First day Cover, priced at Rs. 2, and the pictorial first day postmark is designed by Alka Sharma. An informative brochure containing write-up and technical data, priced at Rs. 2, was also brought out on the occasion. Calcutta Security Printers Limited of Kanpur printed the stamp by photo-offset in five colors on matt chromo unwatermarked paper in the quantity of 700,000.

Following is gleaned from the Civil & Military Gazette, published from Lahore from the microfilms available at the Nehru Memorial Library, New Delhi.

## POSTAL HISTORY OF PAKISTAN – Part 1

### LAHORE – CALCUTTA DAILY AIR SERVICE

April 20, 1947: Indian National Airways announce that from April 23, 1947 they will extend to Lahore their daily Viking "East Indian" service now operating non stop between Delhi and Calcutta. The schedule of the new operation is as follows:

06.00 – Departure – LAHORE – Arrival -19.00

07.30 – Arrival – DELHI – Departure - 17.30

08.30 – Departure – DELHI – Arrival - 17.00

12.15 – Arrival – CALCUTTA – Departure - 13.00

### HYDERABAD – BANGALORE AIR MAIL SERVICE

April 27, 1947: The Deccan Airways Ltd. are now operating a thrice-weekly airmail service between Hyderabad (Deccan) and Bangalore. The service leaves Hyderabad in the afternoon of every Tuesday and Thursday and Leaves Bangalore on every Wednesday and Friday in the morning.

This service provides an immediate connection at Hyderabad with the Delhi – Madras airmail service run by the same company.

Surcharged inland airmail correspondence can be sent by this service at the same rates and under the same conditions as are applicable to inland airmail correspondence generally.

### INDIAN NATIONAL AIRWAYS – NEW KARACHI – CALCUTTA SERVICE

May 20, 1947, Karachi: Indian National Airways will be operating "Vikings" with 24-passenger capacity between Karachi and Calcutta next month. The new aircraft will have a cruising speed of 220 miles an hour and will reach Calcutta the same day.

### DALMIA AIRWAYS TO OPERATE BETWEEN CALCUTTA & SRINAGAR

July 17, 1947, Srinagar: The Kashmir Government has granted permission to Dalmia Airways to operate a bi-weekly chartered air service between Srinagar and Calcutta through Delhi. The service will begin towards the end of this month.

#### ORIENT AIRWAYS LIMITED

#### MADRAS – COCHIN AIR SERVICE

July 29, 1947, Ernakulam: From August 1, 1947 the present air service between Cochin and Madras will be increased from five to six times a week and from October 1, 1947 next there will be daily service with an additional halt at Coimbatore, according to N B Menon of Tata Airlines who arrived here after making necessary arrangements at Trivandrum.

#### INDIA POSTAGE STAMPS TO BE RECOGNISED IN BOTH DOMINIONS TILL OCTOBER 1, 1947

August 12, 1947, New Delhi: The existing postage rates are to continue to operate in both Dominions between the transfer of power on August 15, 1947 and March 31, 1948, says a Press Communiqué.

During this period, the exchange of postal traffic will also be governed by the arrangement that exist today. There will also be no restriction on the sale of Indian Postal orders, National Savings Certificates or on the issue of Money Orders or the booking of Registered and Insured mail of V P P articles.

India Postage Stamps will be recognized in both Dominions till October 1, 1947. With effect from October 1, 1947, arrangements will be made to establish appropriate offices of exchange at border towns through which all accountable articles like money orders, registered and insured articles and value payable parcels and articles will pass, the exchange being on International or Empire basis.

#### AIR ROUTES TO BE RE-DIVDED

August 21, Karachi: With the partition of the country all air contracts between the Government of India and other parties concerned have lapsed, it is learnt. All air routes will be re-divided in the near future. The Oriental Air Service is contemplating a non-stop daily air service between Dacca and Karachi to link the capitals of Eastern Pakistan with the center.

#### AMRITSAR TO BE INCLUDED IN INDIAN NATIONAL AIRWAYS DELHI-LAHORE SERVICE

The Indian National Airways have decided to include Amritsar in their daily service between Delhi and Lahore with effect from August 31, 1947

#### DESPATCH AIR MAIL ARTICLES

August 30, 1947, New Delhi: All air services that are being run to Lahore Rawalpindi, Amritsar and Srinagar for evacuation purpose will be utilized for the dispatch of air mail articles to these places, says a Press Note. Letters should bear the usual blue airmail label and extra postage to cover airmail charges.

#### ADVERTISEMENT - INDIAN NATIONAL AIRWAYS

September 9, 1947: An announcement. Indian National Airways are now operating the following services:

1. Three daily services between Delhi and Lahore in either direction.
2. Daily service between Delhi and Rawalpindi in either direction.
3. Daily service between Delhi and Karachi in either direction.
4. Daily service between Delhi and Calcutta in either direction.

##### THEMATIC SHOW AT BANGALORE

The weeklong thematic stamp exhibition held in Malleshwaram Education Society (MES) College, Bangalore from December 11 to 16, 2000 and was open to public from 10 am to 3.30 pm. The exhibition was a joint effort by the M E S College and Ms Keerthi Sangoram Memorial Foundation. Dr R G Sangoram exhibited a different thematic exhibit on each of the five days, and said he welcomed any philatelic material on the themes exhibited either for sale or exchange, as he wanted to expand his collections.

On Monday the 11<sup>th</sup> the theme for the day was "Our Solar System." This theme seemed very popular with teachers and students alike, as many teachers came along with their students to see the exhibition. As Karthik from seventh standard, M.E.S.

Kishore Kendra School said, "it was very nice to see pictures of the planets, comets and other things we learn in our science text books and I never knew stamps were issued on such topics."

There was no exhibition on Tuesday, December 12, due to the passing away of the former Chief Minister of Karnataka J H Patel, schools and colleges were closed.

On Wednesday the 13th the theme for the day was "Space programs." The long queue of students waiting to see the exhibition was proof of the popularity of stamps. Stamps, first day covers, miniature sheets and other philatelic material were used to illustrate various aspects of space programs. There were topics like telescopes, space missions and even the mythology associated with solar system. A maximum card on G S Titov seemed to be the most popular item in the exhibition. The school children seemed to love the space mission stamps and were even taking down notes.

Thursday 's theme was "Communication". The various stamps, and philatelic material attracted non-philatelists as well. One thing that was most evident was that miniature sheets are the most popular philatelic item among children.

Friday the 15th had the theme of "Nobel laureates." It was surprising that many people who had come to the exhibition knew the names, dates and categories of the Nobel Prize winners by heart. This must be the effect of Kaun Banega Crorepati (see our disclaimer at the end of this newsletter). But whatever it was it proved to be beneficial to philately as this exhibition was very popular. Not only that but the young visitors commented that it was previously unheard of theme in their school circles and one, which they are going to actively pursue. According to a young visitor 'Alfred Nobel' stamp was the best thing in the whole exhibition.

Saturday had the theme of minerals and birds. This theme according to the visitors to the exhibition was very informative and educative. The stamps from other countries seemed to attract the most attention. Children seemed to think that all stamps from any country other than India is "rare".

Each day a written quiz was given on the topic of the day and useful books as prizes were distributed. There was also an overall prize given on Saturday. The second prize was a science book won by Avinash V of first P.U.C. The first prize was a cup won by Balaji also of first P.U.C.

The exhibition was very helpful in creating awareness about both stamps and science. There was also a one-frame exhibit on the theme of " India." Overall, the exhibition was a great success among students. It was a fitting tribute to Kirthi Sangoram who was an ardent philatelist and her special interest was in the solar system and comets. There was a visitor's book kept for comments on the exhibition and the pages were filled with appreciation about the exhibition.
