NEWS & ANNOUNCEMENTS

MINISTER VISITS BHUJ

Ram Vilas Paswan, Minister for Communications visited quake-ravaged Gujarat on February 2, 2001. The minister ordered free postcards to be made available in the quantity desired to all victims of the quake. The postcards are to be written and returned to the post office and are not available for taking away.

A K Bhatnagar, Deputy Director General (postal operations) India Post HQ was on an official visit to Gujarat at the time of earthquake. He was asked to extend his stay and mobilize and supervise the relief efforts. He coordinated relief teams of officers from other postal circles and parts of Gujarat. India Post HQ rushed a team of 3 doctors immediately. A K Kaushal, Director (welfare) India Post HQ was deputed from January 30 to February 4, 2001 to visit the entire quake affected area. Aparna Mohile, Member (development) of Postal Services Board and Meera Dutta, Deputy Director General (postal operations) along with engineers from the Engineering Wing of India Post HQ left for Gujarat on February 7, 2001. Tapan Sikadar, Minister of State for Communications, S C Dutta, Member (personnel) of Postal Services Board, and B N Som, Director General of India Post are scheduled to visit Gujarat soon.

On January 30, 2001 the Gujarat postal circle established the Disaster Relief Fund. A number of postal employees have contributed their one-day salary to this fund.

The post office buildings at Surendranagar, Thangad, Halvad, Rampura, Wadhwan City, Chuda, Maliya, Samadhiyala, Vondh, Bhachau, Chirai, Gandhidham, Ratanal, Kukuma, Bhuj, Adipur and Rajaputpura are either totally or extensively damaged. In several of these places the post office are now operating either in a tent outside or shifted to another building.

The stamp to mark the launch of the decennial Census of India 2001 in the denomination of Rs. 3 shall now be issued on February 9, 2001.

A set of 4 stamps on International Fleet Review 2001 will be issued on February 18, 2001. Three stamps are in the denomination of Rs. 3 and one in the denomination of Rs. 15.

NEW STAMP RELEASED

A stamp to mark the centenary of the Western Railway HQ Building at Churchgate, Mumbai in the denomination of Rs. 15, the overseas airmail letter rate, was issued on February 6, 2001. Ratan Batra Private Limited designed the stamp, First day Cover priced at Rs. 2 is based on the photograph furnished by the Ministry of Railways, and the pictorial first day postmark was designed by Alka Sharma. An informative brochure containing write-up and technical data, priced at Rs. 1.50, was also brought

out. India Security Press of Nashik printed the stamps by photogravure in multicolor on imported unwatermarked adhesive gravure coated stamp paper in the quantity of 700,000 each. The issued sheet contains 35 stamps.

OVERNITE US SMART SEVA

United States Postal Service has tied up with Overnite Express Limited, an Indian courier company, to launch 'Overnite US Smart Service' on February 2, 2001. A 250-gram document to USA will cost Rs. 500 under this service. This is much cheaper than other couriers and slightly higher than India Post's Speed Post that charges Rs. 425 for similar weight documents. Robert J Edward, Director, Global Business Development, USPS was in New Delhi for the launch. USPS is targeting to increase its share in international market from present 2% to 15%.

THE ISSUES OF JANUARY 25 & 27

A set of four stamps on 'Personalities: Socio-Political Development' was scheduled for release on January 25, 2001. For some reason the set was split in two issues released on January 25 and 27. On January 25 only one stamp from the set was issued. The accompanying Informative brochure carried the description of all the four stamps. The FDC prepared for the series was also issued. The remaining three stamps were issued on January 27 with same FDC and Informative brochure. Understandably this has caused confusion among the stamp collectors.

HONG KONG 2001 AWARDS

We have not been able to obtain the complete list of awards for Indian participants despite our best efforts. However we have been informed of a Gold medal to Anil Suri for Fiscals of Cochin and Rajan Jayakar for Fiscals of British India 1800-1900. Latter also received a Large Vermeil for Fiscals of British India 1901-1947. Congratulations.

POSTAL HISTORY OF PAKISTAN – Part 8

NEW INTER-DOMINION AIR SERVICES

March 13, 1949: Pak Air is operating a daily air service between Lahore and Delhi, but in order to offer further facilities for the movement of passengers and freight between the two Dominions they have now decided to put on special services. These will be called "Dominion Special" and will operate from March 15, 1949 on Tuesdays, Thursdays each week.

On account of lack of railway facilities, this service will be welcomed....

15th March 1949 marks the beginning of India's own Airlink with Far East – Calcutta to Tokyo via Bangkok, Saigon, Hong Kong and Shanghai. – A Fortnightly service. Bharat Airways Ltd.

CALCUTTA – KARACHI AIR LINK

INDIAN NATIONAL AIRWAYS TO FLY VIA DELHI AND JODHPUR

March 14, 1949, New Delhi: Indian National Airways on March 15 will start a daily service from Calcutta to Karachi via Delhi and Jodhpur in both directions. This service will leave Calcutta at 9:30 am in the morning arriving in Delhi at 2 pm. After a stop of one hour the service will leave for Jodhpur arriving there at 4:35 pm. It will leave Jodhpur at 5 pm and arrive in Karachi at 7:05 pm. The service from Karachi will leave at 7 am and arrive in Jodhpur at 9:05 am. It will leave Jodhpur at 9:35 am and arrive in Delhi at 11:10 am leaving Delhi at 12:30 pm; the service will arrive in Calcutta at 16:45 pm.

BHARAT AIRWAYS SUCCESSFUL SURVEY FLIGHT TO SHANGHAI

March 14, 1949, Calcutta: Mr. T P Bhalla, DG of Civil Aviation, Dr. M B Sarwate, Director of Communications and Mr. M Mathur, Chief Engineer PWD who were among the passenger on board the Bharat Airways' Skymaster which left Calcutta on March 1 for Shanghai via Bangkok, Saigon, Hong Kong on the first flight, returned here on March 8, after having supervised preliminary arrangement at the terminal and intermediate status. The flight was described as a great success.

Bharat Airways will begin its fortnightly Far East service between Calcutta – Shanghai via Bangkok, Saigon and Hong Kong from March 15 and the flight will be completed in about 15 hours. There is every likelihood of the Calcutta – Shanghai route being shortly extended as far as Tokyo.

NEW POSTAL RATES NOW OPERATIVE IN INDIA

INTERIM INDO – PAKISTAN SCHEME FOR AIR LETTERS

April 1, 1949, New Delhi: India's existing postal rates, which are also applicable to Pakistan under agreement terminated at midnight last night.

While the new ordinary postcard costing nine pies and a letter costing two annas which has come into force from today will also hold good for Pakistan's airmail letters to Pakistan with a surcharge will now cost three and a half annas instead of three annas.

This agreement with Pakistan will, however, last for one month during which time the Postal authorities of the two Dominions will enter into a new agreement regarding the new postal rates becoming applicable to Pakistan.

AIR MAIL FREIGHT CHARGES IN INDIA

GOVERNMENT INQUIRY TO REDUCE RATES

April 6, 1949, New Delhi: The Ministry of Communication, Government of India is constituting a special inquiry with a view to reducing the mail freight charges of air companies.

At present the companies charges according to contract, a round sum of one rupee and eight annas per pound irrespective of distance. The future rates will be based on

mileage and the Ministry hopes to make a considerable saving despite the much larger payment it will have to make to the various air companies. A number of licenses for daily service are being issued to air companies which are prepared to run new sectional routes. The new lines are expected to be distributed among the present companies and since all of them are promised air mail freight in addition to passenger traffic, there is little fear of their incurring any loss.
