NEW STAMP RELEASED

Ram Vilas Paswan, Minister for Communications released a stamp to mark the Census of India 2001 in the denomination of Rs. 3, the inland letter rate, on February 10, 2001 at a function held at Central Secretariat of Government of India. L K Advani, Home Minister, Tapan Sikdar, Minister of State for Communications, and Registrar General of India were also present on the occasion. This stamp was earlier scheduled for release on February 8 and later rescheduled to February 9. Kamleshwar Singh designed the stamp and First day Cover priced at Rs. 2. The pictorial first day postmark was designed by Alka Sharma. An informative brochure containing write-up and technical data, priced at Rs. 2 was also brought out. Eagle Press Private Limited of Chennai printed the stamps by photo-offset in four colors on imported unwatermarked stamp paper in the quantity of 400,000. The issued sheet contains 40 stamps.

PAPER VARIETIES OF INDIAN COMMEMORATIVES

It has been noted that commemoratives on several occasions have been printed on more than one type of paper. It is a subject for study. Vijay Seth of New Delhi wrote in that he discovered a new distinctive type of paper while buying commemorative stamps from one of the stamp vendors in March 2000. The Rs. 3.00 stamp depicting Mask for Chhau dance of the UPU set was printed on white paper and the overall design was in a deep orange colour. The earlier stamp was available in cream paper. The Rs. 3.00 Muria Ritual object followed this, was also printed in white paper with the design in reddish colour. The Yeshu Krist Jayanti stamp followed this, also printed on white paper. In 2000 the First sunrise of the new millennium was printed on cream paper and in January 2001 it was available in white paper with the red colour being very deep, if compared to the earlier issue. To commemorate the National Philatelic exhibition MILLEPEX 2000, a setenant pair was issued on Turtles, this set was also available in white paper. It is presumed that the second printing of these commemorative stamps have taken place and on white paper. This forms an interesting study of the commemorative issues of the recent years.

ALSO IN THE NEWS

AUSTRALIA: DOMESTIC AND INTERNATIONAL STAMPS

From July 2000 Australia Post had two ranges of stamps, domestic and international, the domestic stamps are for use on domestic mail and international stamps for use on international mail. This ensures the customers pay no General Sales Tax (GST) on international mail but do so on mail sent within Australia.

Australia Post previously introduced a phasing in period from July 2000 to February 2001 to help customers adjust to the new arrangement. During this period mail users could continue to use domestic stamps on international mail but not thereafter. The current phasing in period will be extended to 4 March. From 5 March, if you prefer to use domestic stamps on international mail you may, but a 10% surcharge must be paid to cover the GST element of domestic stamps. This is because Australia Post must pay GST to the Tax Office on all domestic stamps sold, regardless of their use. For example, if you wish to use domestic stamps on a standard letter to Asia, you will need to affix stamps to the value of \$1.10. The same letter using international stamps

would cost \$1. If you wish to send a standard letter to Europe or the USA, you will need to affix domestic stamps to the value of \$1.65, while the same letter using international stamps would cost \$1.50.

The addition of the 10% surcharge was a suggestion made by a number of collectors, and was supported by the collector and dealer organizations Australia Post consulted to find a practical solution. The Australian Consumer and Competition Commission (ACCC) has been consulted on this approach and raised no specific issues.

READERS FORUM

Premnath Kudva, Mangalore

I wish to talk about the Indian definitive stamps, which seem to have deteriorated in quality. The earlier definitives starting with the architecture series all seem in very good condition even today.

From my subscription at the HPO I have now received the 10 stamps from the 8th series. And they all are uniformly bad in print, image, paper and perforations. The image of the tiger in the Rs 10 stamp is very bad; they could have used a better artist or maybe image. Likewise the Rs 5 Sanchi Stupa of the 7th series was very bad in execution in terms of image quality and also the coloring.

Even the Rs 20 and Rs 50 stamps are no better, with the perforations being of substandard quality, so much so that they cannot be torn of neatly.

I do not understand why Indian Post have to give definitives a step motherly kind of treatment, especially when they are earning more revenue from it, considering the issue will be running for a long time when compared to the commemorative stamps.

Also considering that most commemoratives are of the Rs. 3 denomination, and definitives in the 8th series have come with Rs 10, 15, 20 and 50 the quality of such stamps should have been far better than the affair dished out so far.

I collect mint stamps from various other postal administrations abroad, and find that their definitives are of the same quality as the commemoratives. In fact they sometimes look like a commemorative issue from the work that has gone into it.

I hope that someone somewhere is able to persuade the Indian Postal authorities to start improving their act on the definitives issues.
