POPULARITY POLL RESULTS

India Post conducts a Stamp Popularity Poll to ascertain the relative popularity of commemorative and special stamps issued in a year. The Stamp Popularity Poll 2000 was conducted across the country in October 2000 for the stamps issued in 1999. For the first time the poll was also promoted on India Post's official web site. Nearly 100,000 people participated. The results are now in the Technology Day stamp issued on May 11 is the Most Popular Stamp of 1999. The stamps to mark the Golden Jubilee of Defense Research & Development Organization issued on January 26, and the Golden Jubilee of National Defense Academy issued on February 19 are the first and second runner-up respectively. Science & Technology was voted as the most popular theme of 1999.

Prizes of Rs. 5000, 3000, and 2000 were awarded to P J Pal of Mumbai, A Anand Raj of Trichy, and D Vinoth Kumar of Salem respectively. A draw of lots was held at the Dak Bhavan, India Post's HQ, on February 16, 2001 with eminent philatelist G B Pai as the Guest of Honor to choose the winners.

## NEW STAMPS RELEASED

Atal Bihari Vajpayee, Prime Minister of India released a set of four stamps to mark the International Fleet Review 2001 in the denominations of Rs. 3, the inland letter rate, and Rs. 15, the overseas airmail letter rate, on February 18, 2001 at a function held at Mumbai. Ram Vilas Paswan, Minister for Communications and Admiral Sushil Kumar, Chief of Naval Staff were present on the occasion. The design of the stamps and First day Cover, priced at Rs. 2, is based on the inputs from Naval Headquarters, New Delhi. The pictorial first day postmark was designed by Alka Sharma. An informative brochure containing write-up and technical data, priced at Rs. 2 was also brought out. Calcutta Security Printers Limited of Kanpur printed the stamps by photo-offset in five colors on matt chromo paper in the quantity of 700,000. The issued sheet contains 40 stamps.

All these issues were printed by Calcutta Security Printers Limited. Soaking these stamps in water for about 20 minutes results in disappearing of the colors in patches.

COURIER OF QUAKE RELIEF by Neeraj Agarwal

[This is not on the web hence an excerpt from the article]

A major earthquake shook Bihar on January 15, 1934 with an intensity of 8.25 on the Richter scale with its epicenter on the Indo-Nepal border creating mass destruction in cities like Dharbanga, Motihari, Patna and Kathmandu. To create awareness among people for help, various efforts were made. Special flights were organized for the Bihar earthquake. On one such flight, Capt C D Bernard of the RAF carried airmail on January 20, 1934 having labels of "Bihar Earthquake Relief Fund" of Rs. 2 from Dum Dum – Calcutta – Falta – Salt Lakes – Dum Dum and on January 17, 1934, between Muzaffarpur – Dharbanga – Dum Dum and Patna – Dharbanga – Dum Dum". Fifty such mails were known to have flown. On January 30, 1934, another emergency flight piloted by Flt K D Knocker of the RAF was flown between Dum Dum – Dharbanga with only six airmails. They had a triangular label "Earthquake Emergency Flight" on them. It is coincidence that all this had happened in the month of January. It is another surprising fact that the first stamp on earthquake was issued in Ahmedabad.

It is time for the Postal Department to create awareness amongst the citizens of Bihar and other states to come forward and help the victims in Gujarat by providing various postal slogan cancellations on letters and other postal articles. Slogans like "Donate blood for Gujarat" "Lend a helping hand" "Donate generously to Prime Minister Relief Fund" should feature on postal articles.

### THREE PEPSU STATES TO LOSE 60-YEAR POSTAL PRIVILEGE

August 30, 1949, New Delhi: The Postal system of the PEPSU states Patiala, Jind and Nabha, will it is understood, be taken over by the Government of India Postal Department with effect from September 15, 1949.

These three East Punjab States and Gwalior – under a convention concluded during the Eighties were given the privilege of issuing Government of India stamps with their overprint for posting them within their respective jurisdiction for delivery any where in India. This privilege was not conceded in any other state, not even Hyderabad.

Other Indian States which had their own postal stamp had only the privilege of use and posting within their own jurisdiction.

Arrangements are now being finalized and the Government of India will set up an agency system to come into force from September 15. The Gwalior Postal system will continue for a further period but all postal system now controlled by the Indian States will be gradually transferred to the Government of India by April 1950.

### INDIAN POSTAGE STAMPS OVERPRINTED 'PAKISTAN' SALE AND USE TO BE DISCONTINUED

September 26, 1949, Karachi: The Government of Pakistan have decided to discontinue the sale and use of Indian public and service postage stamps overprinted "Pakistan" with effect from November 1, states the Ministry of Communications.

All articles and letters posted on and after November 1, if bearing such overprinted stamps, will be treated as unpaid and disposed of accordingly.

### JINNAH MEMORIAL STAMPS

August 27, 1949, (Reuter) London: The London firm Messrs Thomas De La Rue have printed a memorial set of stamps to be released by Pakistan Government on September 11, 1949, the first death anniversary of the founder and first Governor General of Pakistan, Quid-e-Azam Mohammad Ali Jinnah.

In conformity with Islamic traditions, the stamps will not bear any portrait but instead will be inscribed with the words "Unity, Faith and Discipline".

This memorial set designed by Pakistan's Ministry of Communications is of three denominations – one and a half annas, three annas and ten annas.

Messrs Thomas De La Rue and Company, as their contribution to the Quid-e-Azam Memorial Fund, have shared half the printing cost.

### QUID-E-AZAM STAMPS ARRIVED IN KARACHI BY AIR

August 29, 1949, Karachi: An air consignment of the Quid-e-Azam memorial stamps reached Karachi from London today.

The stamps, commemorating the death anniversary of the founder – architect of Pakistan, will be on sale in all the principal Post Offices of Pakistan on September 11, 1949.

A special consignment of the stamps will be flown to Dacca by air so as to synchronize the opening sale in Western and Eastern Pakistan.

Arrangements, it was learnt here, have been made to fly consignments of these stamps from London to the different Pakistan Embassies to reach their destinations before September 11.
