HIKE IN POSTAL RATES

In the Finance Bill 2001-2002 presented to the parliament on February 28, 2001 by Yashwant Sinha, the Finance Minister, proposed an increase in inland postal tariff as follows: Postcards – from 25 paise to 50 paise, Postcards with Printed Matter – from Rs. 2 to Rs. 3, Postcard for competitions – Rs. 4 to Rs. 5, Letter first 20 grams – from Rs. 3 to Rs. 4, Registration Charges – from Rs. 14 to Rs. 17, Acknowledgement Delivery Fee – from Rs. 2 to Rs. 3, Parcels first 500 grams – from Rs. 12 to Rs. 16, Book Pattern & Sample Packets for first 50 grams – from Rs. 2 to Rs. 3, every additional 50 grams or part thereof – from Rs. 3 to Rs. 4, Book Packets containing printed books and periodicals for every 100 grams – from 50 paise to Re. 1, Registered Newspapers Single Copy below 50 grams – from 15 paise to 25 paise, between 50-100 grams – from 25 paise to 50 paise. India Post will announce the date from which the new rates shall be applicable after the bill is passed in the parliament and receives President of India's signature.

'ON POSTAL SERVICE' ON POSTCARDS OF INDIAN PRINCELY STATES

In the late 1960s the IPTD authorized the use of stocks of mint Indian States postal cards and envelopes (Travancore, T-C and Hyderabad) for post office business (test letters, reminders of overdue licence payments etc.) provided they were overprinted with a suitable IPTD slogan (e.g. On P&T Service). I am coordinating a research group into these overprints for the Indian Study Circle for Philately. Whilst I would welcome any information, what I particularly want is a copy of the actual wording of the IPTD notice allowing this - if possible from government/PO records, failing that from reports in contemporary newspapers or philatelic magazines.

CHINA NATIONAL AVIATION CORPORATION

Announce a regular weekly service operated by Skymaster for passengers, mails and cargo between Pakistan – China – USA with effect from Monday, October 17th, 1949. The service leaves at 4 AM from Monday, October 17, 1949.

SCANDINAVIAN AIRLINES

October 18 (APP) 1949, New Delhi: The Government of India have granted temporary authorization to the Scandinavian Air Lines to operate a bi-weekly service across India.

The service, which is scheduled to begun on October 29, will follow this route: Oslo to Copenhagen, Frankfurt, Zurich, Rome, Lydda, Damascus, Basra, Karachi, Bombay, Calcutta, Bangkok and Hong Kong.

SERVICE STAMPS SALE TO COLLECTORS

October 24, 1949 (APP), Karachi: Attention of the Government has been drawn to reports appearing in a certain section of the Press alleging that 'Service' stamps are not available to the public, states a Press Note. "It is notified for general information that 'Service' stamps of all kinds are sold to philatelists through the Philatelic Bureau, CPO Karachi. Orders may therefore be placed with the Bureau."

INSCRIBED PAKISTAN NOTES TO BE WITHDRAWN ON MONDAY

In terms of Government of Pakistan Notifications Nos. 5467 and 5468/F/49 dated September 17, 1949, inscribed Pakistan notes of all denomination will be demonetised with effect from November 1, 1949. They will then cease to be legal tenders.

On and after November 1, 1949, inscribed Pakistan notes will be accepted at the office of the State Bank of Pakistan, Treasuries, Sub Treasuries and branches of the Imperial Bank of India in Pakistan.

PAKISTAN 6-ANNAS AIR LETTER FORMS FROM NOVEMBER 1, 1949

October 27, 1949, Karachi: The Government of Pakistan have decided to introduce, with effect from November 1, 1949, 6-Annas air letter forms of new Pakistan design. The India 6-Annas air letter forms over printed Pakistan will become obsolete on and after November 1, 1949.

NEW PAKISTAN AIR MAIL ENVELOPS

November 19, 1949 (APP), Karachi: The Government have decided to introduce ten-anna, new design Pakistan Air Mail envelope on December 16, 1949, states a Press Note.

All Indian Air Mail envelope overprinted Pakistan, posted after December 15, 1949, shall be treated as unpaid.

The period of currency of Indian Air Letter forms overprinted Pakistan expiring on November 30 has also been extended to December 15, 1949. Such air letter forms, posted on or after December 16, shall be treated as unpaid.

JUNGSHAH AIR CRASH

December 13, 1949, Karachi: a Pak Air Dakota, flying from Lahore to Karachi, crashed into 1,000 foot hill last night near Jungshahi, 45 miles north east of Karachi. 26 killed in Pak Air disaster.

PAK AIR SUSPENDED FOR INDEFINITE PERIOD

December 14, 1949, Karachi: Under instructions from the Ministry of Defence, Pak Air Limited have suspended all their services for an indefinite period of time, it was learnt on Wednesday morning.

COMMEMORATING FIRST AEROPLANE FLIGHT

TRUMAN'S MESSAGE TO BE FLOWN ROUND THE GLOBE

December 1, 1949, Washington: Wartime fighter pilot Tom Lanphier will leave Washington by airlines tomorrow to try to take a message from President Truman round the world in five days to commemorate the first aeroplane flight by Wilbur and Orville Wright, 46 years ago.

He expects to be back in New York next Wednesday. The present record is six days three hours. The President's message emphasizes the need for free to make the aeroplane a force for Peace. Reuter

SOUVENIR ENVELOPE TO COMMEMORATE THE FIRST IIEE

December 4, 1949: Pakistan's Ministry of Communications has designed a souvenir envelope to commemorate the first International Islamic Economic Exhibition. The brightly designed envelope bears a map showing airmail routes linking Karachi with other important countries of the Muslim world.

INDIAN PLANE FORCE – LAND

December 31, 1949, Dacca: A Bharat Airways four engined Skymaster... which was on its way from Agartala to Calcutta force-landed at Akhora, a town on the Pakistan side of the East Pakistan - Tripura state border, at about midday yesterday.

INDIA TO TAKE OVER CONTROL OF HYDERABAD CURRENCY NEXT APRIL

December 29, 1949, New Delhi: The Government of India and Hyderabad have accepted the Krishna Manlari Committee's recommendation for the federal financial integration of the State with India, which certain modifications it is officially stated. According to the scheme which is subject to final ratification after the settlement of the State's constitutional relationship with the center, the Government of India will take over the entire currency administration of Hyderabad State from April 1950.

ANNOUNCING A NEW AIR INDIA INTERNATIONAL CONSTELLATION SERVICE TO NAIROBI VIA ADEN

Air India Karachi – Bombay. Air India International constellation service, Bombay – Nairobi in 17 hours. Inaugural flight January 21st, 1950, successive flights every alternate Thursday, commencing Thursday, 9th February.

SALVAGED MAIL FROM PAK AIR CRASH

January 21, 1950, Lahore: Some more mail salvaged from the ill-fated Pakistan Dakota which carried mails posted at Peshawar, Rawalpindi and Lahore and crashed at Jungshahi was received by the Posts and Telegraphs Department and disposed of, according to a Press Note.

BOAC ARGONAUT SERVICE VIA ROME

From January 19, 1950 the weekly BOAC service, London – Karachi – Calcutta is calling at Rome instead of Malta for additional capacity from Pakistan and India to Rome.

This change has been made possible by the introduction on January 21 of a second London – Cairo Argonaut service to Cairo was routed via Rome.

The twice-weekly York Service between London and Cairo via Tripoli has been withdrawn from January 17, 1950.

DACCA AIRPORT CLOSED TO TRAFFIC

February 5, 1950, Dacca: Dacca Airport at Tejgaon is to be closed to all scheduled traffic for about three and a half months for reconditioning, it was learnt.

Kurmitola airport will be used for scheduled air traffic during this period.

USE OF QUID-E-AZAM MEMORIAL STAMP TO BE STOPPED

Government of Pakistan have decided to discontinue the use of the Quid-e-Azam memorial stamps after March 3, says a Press Note issued yesterday. All stocks left with the Posts and Telegraph department at the close of business on that date will be destroyed, the Press Note adds.
