### PCI MEETING AT MUMBAI

Philatelic Congress of India organized a regional meeting at GPO, Mumbai on March 18, 2001. B N Som, Secretary to Government of India, Chairman of the Postal Services Board, Director General India Post, & Chairman of the World Association for Development of Philately was the Chief Guest.

The meeting was presided over by Sahadeva Sahoo, President of Philatelic Congress of India (PCI). Dhirubhai Mehta, President of Philatelic Society of India - the oldest philatelic society in Asia, and past president of PCI welcomed the participants. P Gupta and Vispi S Dastur, past presidents of PCI also addressed the gathering. In the open session Dr. Jivraj Thakkar, President of Kutch Hobby Circle led the discussions. Rajan Jayakar, National Commissioner for Hong Kong 2001 and Dhananjay Desai, substituting for the National Commissioner for NEPHIL 2001 read the reports on recently concluded international exhibitions.

B N Som addressed the meeting in his inimitable hard-hitting style. He also felicitated the Indian Grand Prize winners, P Gupta, Grand Prize of Honor for his exhibit on Nepal at Argentina in 1983, Dilip Shah, Grand Prize of Honor for his exhibit on Indian Classics at Korea in 1984, Ajit Singhee, Grand Prize of Honor for his exhibit on Postal Stationery of Indian Feudatory States at Calcutta in 2000, and Damayanti Pittie, National Grand Prize for her exhibit on Handstruck Postage Stamps of British India 1779-1854 at Calcutta in 2000. Ajit Singhee responded on behalf of the Grand Prize winners and thanked B N Som.

The Meeting concluded with a vote of thanks by Dilip Shah, President Elect & Secretary General PCI, followed by Lunch.

WADP NUMBERING SYSTEM

World Association for the Development of Philately (WADP) is concerned with the enormous numbers of illegal issues during the last years and has held discussions in this regard with its partners. This matter was also discussed at WADP Seminar at Calcutta in December 2000. The WADP project team on Illegal issues held a meeting at Berne, Switzerland on January 16, 2001. Earlier FIP President wrote on the subject in June 2000 issue of Flash. UPU has been issuing regular bulletins informing the members about these issues.

Recently FIP submitted a proposal at Tunis, Tunisia at WADP Symposium and Workshop for postal administrations in Africa from February 19 to 23, 2001. The Objectives of the proposal are (1) Collectors know that it is a genuine stamp they collect, (2) Collectors and dealers get an easier identification of stamps issued, (3) Postal Administrations get publicity for their stamps, (4) To bring back the millions of dollars spent on illegal issues every year to the hobby.

The details of the proposed system are as follows: All postal administrations shall inform UPU/WADP about planned new issues as early as possible before the issue is released. The communication to UPU regarding new issues must be signed by an authorized person from the list of persons accepted as responsible. This list must be forwarded to WADP periodically and whenever there is a change. WADP shall allot a number starting with international code for the country. This information shall be sent to New Stamp Office (NSO) that shall present it on Internet with all information about date of issue, quantity planned to be issued, short write up about each issue. A list of all issues shall be permanently available on the Internet. All ASCAT members shall use WADP number along with their own number. Only stamps carrying a WADP number can be shown or sold at exhibitions arranged by FIP or their members. Dealers within IFSDA or national dealers federations of UPU members can sell only stamps carrying a WADP number. NSO shall charge a fee to all postal administrations at the time they submit the details of forthcoming issues and this will finance the expenses incurred to maintain these lists. All postal administrations shall inform WADP and take necessary steps every time an undesirable issue comes to their notice. WADP shall do their utmost to avoid earlier illegal issues entering the market.

COMMUNICATIONS WITH KOREA SUSPENDED

Mail communication with Korea will be suspended with immediate effect, says a Press Note issued by Pakistan Ministry of Communication on Tuesday. (August 15, 1950)

DESIGN OF PAKISTAN NON-POSTAL STAMPS

August 29, 1950: The Government of Pakistan have decided to introduce with effect from September 15, 1950 the following kinds and denominations of the new designs of Pakistan Non-Postal Stamp says a Press Note.

The Bharati Stamps of the same kinds and denominations bearing the facsimile signature of the issuing authorities in Pakistan will also continue to legal tender along with the new stamps till further order:-

Notorial Stamps – All denominations upto Rs. 6

Brokker's Notes – Annas -/2/- and annas -/4/- denominations

NEW PAKISTAN AGREEMENT STAMPS FROM SEPTEMBER 17, 1950

The Government of Pakistan have decided to introduce from September 17, 1950 new designs of Pakistan Agreement Stamps of the denominations of As 2, As 3, As 4, As 8 and As 12 says a Press Note.

The Indian Agreement stamps of the above denomination bearing the facsimile signature of the issuing authorities in Pakistan will also continue to be legal tender along with the Pakistan Stamps till further order.

RS 100 HIGHEST DENOMINATION OF PAKISTAN NOTES

September 21, 1950: A case has come to notice in which a bank note of the denomination of Rs 1,000 purporting to have been issued by the 'Reserve Bank of Pakistan' was presented at a bank in a foreign country, says a Press Note issued by the Ministry of Finance.

It may be notified for general information that the State Bank of Pakistan has not issued any notes of the denomination of Rs. 1,000 or any note of higher denomination than Rs. 100/-. Notes of Higher denominations were issued by the Reserve Bank of India during the pre partition period and were demonetized by the undivided Government of India in 1946.

These notes are neither legal tender in Pakistan or in Bharat. In fact no notes issued by the Reserve Bank of India, which ceased to be the Note Issuing Authority for Pakistan on June 30, 1948 are now legal tender in Pakistan. Even the Reserve Bank of India notes inscribed with the words "Government of Pakistan" issued as a temporary measure prior to July 1, 1948, have been demonetized.

The Bank Notes issued by the State Bank of Pakistan denomination of Rs 2, 5, 10 and 100 and of rupee one issued by the Government of Pakistan only are Legal Tender in Pakistan.

#### AIRMAIL ARTICLES FOR FOREIGN COUNTRIES

It has been noticed that members of the public do not often fully prepay their 'Air Mail Letters' for foreign countries and sometimes prepay such letters at the same rate which is applicable to 'Air Letters' for foreign countries says a Press Note.

The term 'Air Letter' applies only to a specially manufactured light weight air letter stationery imprinted with a 6 anna stamp sold by the Post Office, with writing space on one side and space for the address on the other, which can be folded along the dotted lines into the shape of an envelope and in which no other paper is to be enclosed. The rate of postage for 'Air Letter' is, at present, 8 annas from the USA, Canada and Newfoundland, and 6 annas for every other country to which 'Air Letter Service' is available. But the rate of airmail postage on 'Air Mail Letters' for foreign countries is higher than the above-mentioned rates.

The result of not fully prepaying 'Air Mail Letters' for foreign countries or of prepaying them at the rate which applies to 'Air Letters' for such destinations is that such letters are treated by the Post office as insufficiently prepaid and taxed accordingly.

The members of the public are, therefore, requested in their own interests to prepay their 'Airmail Letters' for foreign countries at the appropriate rates of postage. The latest rates of airmail postage have been notified in the Postal notice No 26 dated January 19, 1950 which may be referred to on the Notice Board of the local Post Office and are also contained in the Pakistan Posts and Telegraphs Pocket Guide, 1949 Edition, a copy of which can be had from the local office at the nominal price of 4 annas.

#### AIR INIDA SERVICES INCREASED

August 24, Bombay: Calcutta will shortly become the terminal for Air India International constellation services operating between India and the United Kingdom, an official of the airline said here today.

The present terminal is Bombay.

The airline will operate two routes – Calcutta, Bombay, Cairo, London and Calcutta, Bombay, Cairo, Geneva and London.
