NEWS & ANNOUNCEMENTS

THE FIRST CUSTOMIZED GREETING CARDS

India Post issued the first customized greeting card for 'NovaPen' -'the convenient insulin experience' in January 2002. The card, in small size, is for birthday greetings and printed in the quantity of 10,000. The sponsors of the issue intend to send it to the doctors on their birthdays. This issue is not available to public or philatelists.

INDIA POST'S VSATS ARE DOWN

The VSAT (Very Small Aperture Terminals) system introduced two years ago by India Post is not working apparently due to shifting from INSAT 2C satellite to newly launched INSAT 3C satellite. The new and faster system is expected to be in place in a few days. There are 77 VSAT stations in the country. They are connected to the Extended Satellite Money Order Stations via telephone. Over a million money orders are sent every day. Post offices all over the country have not been sending money orders via the speedy VSAT over the last few weeks, leaving thousands of people who have already sent money through the service in the lurch. With the temporary stoppage of VSAT, post offices are currently sending money orders via the older, manual system. This is causing an inordinate delay in dispatching money orders. VSAT came as a breath of fresh air, as it promised to transfer money within hours, as compared to the lengthy manual money order system prevalent earlier.

NEW SPECIAL POSTMARK

On 2nd March 2002 a special cover has been issued at Patna on Jainism. India Post has provided a special postmark on it. In the 2600th birth year of Lord Mahavir, Bihar Puravid Parishad and Jain Sangh of Patna jointly organized National Seminar on Lord Mahavir in Art, Archeology & Literature at Patna (Bihar) on 2nd & 3rd March 2002. Special cover issued on this occasion depicts photo of an idol of Jain Tirthankar of Maurya Period, 3rd Century B C that is the oldest Jain idol of the world. It was found in Lohanipur, near Patna and exhibited at Patna Museum. Special postmark bears line sketch of bronze Jain Dharma Chakra of 2nd BC Naresh Kumar Jain of Patna was instrumental in this issue.

CABLE TV OPERATORS REGISTRATION The Post office has provided all kinds of services to citizens. The government does not have any other organization that can match the reach and area of operation of the Post Office. Recently we learned another such service that is being provided at the state level.

In Tripura State the Cable TV operators are required to get their licenses registered with the Head Post Office concerned prior to starting of business in the state. The registration charges are Rs. 500 for a calendar year. The operators are to renew their license on payment of renewal fee of Rs.500 for every calendar year 15 days prior to expiry of the validity of their license. The State Government may take necessary action on the Operators running their business without any valid registration.

Our Indian readers may let us know if other state governments are using post office for this or any other service that is not available countrywide.

WORLD'S OLDEST POSTCARD SELLS FOR RECORD PRICE

A picture postcard, believed to be the world's oldest, was sold on March 8, 2002. Eugene Gomberg, a collector from Latvia, paid 31,750 pounds for postcard put up for auction at the London Stamp Exchange by postal historian Edward Proud. This is a new record price for a postcard.

Dating from 1840 the printed, hand-colored caricature postcard is believed to be 20 years older than rival claimants from Germany, U.S. and Austria, which all date from the 1860s. Proud discovered it in February after a private collector brought it to his attention. Victorian eccentric Theodore Hook had mailed it to himself as a practical joke in 1840, the same year that Britain started the world's first prepaid postal system by issuing the "Penny Black" stamp.

The British Philatelic Association authenticated the "Penny Black" on Hook's card. Proud earlier hailed the postcard as an important find. "It proves that Hook was behind one of the greatest Victorian inventions," he said.

INDIA POST IN THE YEAR 1873, PART 4

POSTAL NOTICE

Consequent upon the establishment of a British Post Office at Beyrout, correspondence may now be sent to that place at the following rates: Correspondence for Beyrout via Bombay through British Post Office at Alexandria Letters per ½ oz. ... 8 annas 8 pies

Newspapers not exceeding 4 oz. ... 1 anna 4 pies Packets of books and patterns:

- not exceeding 1 oz. ... 1 anna 4 pies

- exceeding 1 oz. and not exceeding 2 oz. ...2 annas 8 pies
- exceeding 2 oz. and not exceeding 4 oz. ...4 annas

- every additional 4 oz. or part thereof ... 4 annas

2. Letters for Beyrout can be registered by the above-mentioned route on payment of a fee of 8 annas.

3. The prepayment of letters is optional, and that of newspapers, books and patterns compulsory.

This completes all the postal notices known for the year 1873. There was a long Notification on 'Inland Rates' and 'Official Correspondence Rules' from this year that we shall serialize from the next issue. In addition there were the half-yearly 'Mail Steamer Calendar' that we plan to put up later on the site with link here.

DÉJÀ VU We reproduce a very interesting postal notice dated March 28, 1899 that is very current in content. See 'A New Breed of Post Card' story in the previous issue.

With effect from the 1st April 1899, single and reply cards of private manufacture may be posted for transmission by the Inland post as post cards, provided that they are in conformity, as regards size and weight, with the inland post cards issued by the Indian Post Office. Such postcards may be posted either with or without adhesive stamps affixed to them in payment of postage; if sent unpaid, however, double the postage rate for a postcard will be charged on delivery.

2. With effect from the same date, advertisements, engravings, and certain other matter, viz., the name and address of the sender and the date of posting, will be allowed on the address side of postcards whether issued by the Post Office or of private manufacture. The heading "Post-card" or "Reply post-card" will also be allowed to be written, printed, or otherwise impressed on the address side of cards of private manufacture. This will be subject to the condition that sufficient room shall be left for a clear address and for the official marks of the Post Office.

DR. AVINASH B. JAGTAP ON PEN CANCELLATIONS I read the letter by Mr. Manssor B. of Magalore in your News-Letter No. 55 of March 7, 2002.

Naturally it is disgusting when one receives an envelope with beautiful pictorial stamps affixed to it that have been pen cancelled. If the envelope is from a foreign country, the stamps, which had not been previously cancelled in the country where the letter had originated, may face the pen cancellation. Even in Europe I receive such letters (mostly from UK) with stamps, which had not been postmarked in Great Britain, pen cancelled. This pen cancellation is undertaken in Great Britain itself and not in Switzerland.

Many times the stamps are not at all defaced. This is equally true in case of Indian stamps affixed to the envelopes, which I receive from time to time. Since there is no international rules or regulations, regarding how these stamps should be rendered useless, so that they cannot be used once again, we cannot expect any other possibility than this easy way of canceling them, namely "pen cancellation".

The question of Indian stamps delivered in India, may also be pen cancelled, if they miss the obliterator of a postman in the post office. This is then objectionable, since the un-cancelled stamps can be still obliterated anywhere in India, even when they miss the sight of a postman at the originating location. The foreign stamps on foreign mail, as a rule cannot be and should not be cancelled by Indian obliterator! Otherwise it will be a foreign stamps used in India! and perhaps it will fetch more money than it is really worth.

I have such Indian stamps of 1900-1920 era, where these stamps bear French or Portuguese obliterator. Could these then be treated as Indian stamps used abroad? I have also an Indian stationary cover addressed to Germany, bearing one KG V stamp, which was cancelled in Germany with the wording "Entwerted in Leipzig" ("Cancelled in Leipzig"). This German obliterator was specially designed for cancellation of foreign stamps and the cover should be regarded as unique, even it should not be looked upon as an object for speculation!

At present we have two alternatives, either stamps on your cover (received from India or abroad) may not carry any cancellation at all or they may bear pen cancellation. In both cases the stamp or stamps on the cover will have no value and this cover should not be exhibited as such in any display.
