#### ACCESS TO YAHOO GROUPS BLOCKED

An order from the Department of Telecommunication issued on September 10, 2003 instructed all the Internet service providers (ISP) in India to block the website: groups.yahoo.com/groups/kynhu as it was found to be promoting anti-national news and containing material against Government of India & State Government of Meghalaya.

These orders were issued by the DOT as per the instructions of Indian Computer Emergency Response Team, (CERT-In) under Department of Information Technology (DiT) who are duly authorized for this purpose. This is the first time that a website has been blocked under CERT since it came into being in July this year.

ISP's have implemented this order by blocking the entire domain groups.yahoo.com saying that blocking of a sub group is not technically possible. Consequently Indians are deprived of access to any yahoo groups several of whom serve public interests. There are hundreds of philatelic groups at yahoo and yours truly subscribes to about a dozen groups and hopes for an early resolution of this problem.

The official release of September 22, 2003 says that the representatives of Yahoo in India were requested to remove the objectionable material but they declined to comply.

# NEW STAMPS ON WATERFALLS

India Post will issue a set of 4 special stamps on Waterfalls on October 3, 2003. A miniature sheet will also be issued on the occasion. The stamps depict Athirapalli Fall, Jog Fall, Kakolat Fall, and Kempty Fall in the denomination of Rs 5, Rs 15, Rs 5, and Rs 5 respectively. The miniature sheet is priced at Rs 30.

This issue along with the First Day Cover and the information sheet, at Rs.2 each, shall be available on sale at nearly 1000 selected Post Offices including all Philatelic Bureaus and Counters in the country.

### JANARDAN SWAMI STAMP RELEASED

The Vice President of India Bhairon Singh Shekhawat released a commemorative stamp on Janardan Swami at Kopargaon, Maharashtra on September 24, 2003.

Brahm Prakash designed the stamp and Binoy Verghese designed the First Day Cover, and Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark.

Information Sheet containing write-up and technical data and priced at Rs.2 was issued on the occasion. The FDC is also priced at Rs 2.

India Security Press of Nashik Road printed the stamps by photogravure in single color on imported un-watermarked adhesive gravure coated stamp paper in the quantity of 0.4 million in the sheets of 48 stamps.

# FAKE STAMP SCAM UPDATES

Hyderabad Police Commissioner M V Krishna Rao has placed under suspension four policemen who were directly associated with the investigation into the fake stamp case when Telgi, the main accused in the scam, was arrested in the city in 1999. The four, K Vijendhar Reddy, Ashwaq Ahmed Khan, Janaranjan Das and Sridhar were directed not to leave the headquarters without prior permission.

While Vijendhar Reddy worked as Begum Bazar inspector when the scam first broke out in 1999, Ahmed Khan and Sridhar were sub-inspectors. Janaranjan Das was in the Crime Investigation Department (CID) to which the case was entrusted later. The four are alleged to have manipulated the investigation and colluded with scamster Telgi. The officers, despite knowing that Telgi was the kingpin, listed him as the 28th accused in the case. The officers are also accused of registering cases under bailable offences which helped the accused get out soon after their arrest. After the case was handed over to CID, Das reportedly went slow in the investigation.

Member of Legislative Assembly (MLA) and former Minister C Krishna Yadav, whose police custody expired on September 20, 2003 in the multibillion fake stamp scam was produced before the court of judicial magistrate M N Bondre at Pune and remanded to further police custody till September 26, 2003.

Yadav, accused in the countrywide fake stamp racket was picked up on September 6 from Hyderabad and brought to Pune after being arrested. He was produced before the court and was remanded to police custody.

Of the 54 arrested, so far only five remain to be chargesheeted. They include Yadav, senior police inspector of crime branch Mumbai, Dattatrey Dhal, and Abdul Wahi who looked after Telgi's finances.

Telgi and others are facing charges of printing and distributing counterfeit stamps and stamp-papers allover India causing losses to the government to the tune of several billions of Rupees.

A Special Investigation Team of the Maharashtra police, investigating the multi-billion fake stamp scam, has raided the houses of C Krishna Yadav in Hyderabad. The raids, led by Deputy Commissioner of Police P R Choudhary, began on the night of September 18, 2003 and continued on the next day at the MLA quarters at Hyderguda, in another house at Lal Darwaza in the old city, Yadav's petrol pump at Amberpet, a farmhouse in Gandipet and in Saidabad.

The legislator's brother Mahender Yadav and other family members were questioned about his financial dealings. The Maharashtra police are on the lookout for Yadav's associates to ascertain their role in the racket. Police also questioned his associate a local jeweler. Some documents have been seized.

Two other Andhra Pradesh legislators offered to resign after their names were published in the media for their alleged links to the multibillion-rupee stamp racket. Chief Minister Naidu had directed his two party legislators, P Rama Rao and Srirambhadriah, on September 17, 2003 to wait for his return and not to resign in haste in an attempt to prove their "innocence".

# STAMP DESIGNED BY LENNON SOLD

A lot of stamps designed by Beatle John Lennon sold for £1,200 against a pre-sale estimate of £800 at Sotheby's rock 'n' roll and film memorabilia auction sale at in London on September 17, 2003.

Lennon's support of postal staff was typical of his political activism and the stamps designed by him to support striking postal workers in 1971 depict a clenched fist.

During the 1971 postal strike in UK, the Royal Mail licensed several private business and institutions to carry mail. Several of these carriers issued their own stamps.
