PORT BLAIR CHENNAI FIRST FLIGHT

India Post issued a Special First Flight Cover on March 28, 2004 for the inaugural flight of Airbus A320 introduced on Chennai-Port Blair-Chennai route by Indian Airlines.

The cover also commemorated the 1<sup>st</sup> regional philatelic exhibition at Port Blair from March 27 to 29, 2004. The exhibition was visited by the Lieutenant Governor of Andaman & Nicobar Professor Ram Kapse, Commander in Chief of Andaman & Nicobar Command Lieutenant General B S Thakur, Chief Secretary of Andaman & Nicobar V V Bhat, and Joint Commissioner of Income Tax Vasundhara Upmanyu along with a large number of citizens and students.

The First Flight Cover designed by the well known artist, stamp designer & philatelist, Dipok Dey of Kolkata was flown and the delivery postmark was provided at Chennai. Only 200 covers were produced and may still be available with the Philatelic Counter, Head Post Office, Port Blair 744101 at Rs 100 each on first cover first served basis.

DESIGN-A-STAMP CONTEST RESULTS

India Post held 'Design A Stamp' Contest 2003 on 14th November, 2003 on the topic 'My Village/My Town/My City', results for which have been announced on April 6, 2004.

First Prize: S Vindhya, Class IX(A), Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan's Public School, Jubilee Hills, Hyderabad, Andhra Pradesh.

Second Prize: Sudha Singh, Class XI, Tara Mahila Inter College, Baharaich, Uttar Pradesh.

Third Prize: Debesh Kumar, Vill: Budhudih, P.O. Bena, District Jamtara, Jharkhand.

The entry which won the First Prize will figure for the Children's Day stamp of 2004 and the Second Prize, on its First Day Cover.

India Post has been holding nationwide stamp design competitions from the year 1998 onwards. The prize winning entries have been used as designs for different Stamps and First Day Covers.

9 MADRAS STAMP RELEASED

India Post released a stamp in the denomination of Rs5 to commemorate the tercentenary of the 9<sup>th</sup> Battalion of Madras Regiment (Travancore) on April 1, 2004.

In 1741, the Dutch settlers led a trade expedition to Travancore under the captaincy of Flemish Officer Captain Eustace de Lenoy and invaded the town. The invading army was annihilated by the forces of Maharaja of Travncore that were raised as his personal bodyguards in 1704.

In 1935, the unit then known as Travncore Nayar Brigade was amalgamated with Indian Army under Indian State Forces Scheme. On 1 April 1951, the battalion was integrated with the Indian Army and on 1 April 1954 it merged with the Madras Regiment and was renamed as the 9th Battalion of the Madras Regiment (Travancore).

Sankha Samanta designed the stamp and the First Day Cover and Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs2 each.

Calcutta Security Printers Limited of Kanpur printed the stamps by Photo Ofset in the quantity of 0.8 million in the sheets of 40 stamps.

VATICAN COINS SOLD OUT IN 3 HOURS

Vatican's Philatelic and Numismatic Office started selling the coins on April 2, 2004 at 7:30 am and by 10:30 am, doors were closed with the last 200 buyers still inside. Many of the collectors were thus disappointed after having waited in line since the night before.

The coins, which feature the profile of Pope John Paul II, are part of a very limited series of Vatican euros coins with a face value of 3.88 euros, for the price of 21 or 25 euros.

Euro coins are different in all 12 EU countries which have adopted the single currency. Vatican has been minting coins since 1929.
