V LAKSHMINARAYANA STAMP RELEASED

India Post released a stamp in the denomination of Rs5 to commemorate the Professor of Music who introduced the western violin to Indian music, V Lakshminarayana on April 14, 2004.

At the age of 29 he became a professor of music and a talented composer, his compositions have been recorded and published and are performed even today. The rich tradition and heritage left behind by him has been carried forward by his son Padma Bhushan Dr. L Subramaniam nationally as well as internationally. The Lakshminarayana Global Music Awards have been instituted as a tribute to his memory by his son and the winners have been talented international artists including Yehudi Menuhin, Steven Seagal etc. Prof Lakshminarayana continues to live in the notes of music that has reached across the world.

Sankha Samanta designed the stamp and the First Day Cover and Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs2 each.

India Security Press of Nashik printed the stamps by Photo Gravure in the quantity of 0.4 million in the sheets of xx stamps.

FAKE STAMP SCAM UPDATES

The General Manager of Nashik-based India Security Press, Ganga Prakash has been dismissed from service on April 1, 2004 in the interest of the security of the state after a probe by the Central Bureau of Investigation found that he had helped stamp scamster, Abdul Karim Telgi. Prakash was arrested by the CBI on December 19, 2003 in Hyderabad for alleged security lapses which helped Telgi, prime accused in the multi-billion Rupee fake stamp paper case, in spreading his network across the country. CBI registered a case into the security lapses at the press in which Telgi was also named as an accused and searched Prakash's house from where it said Rs 186,000 in cash and some other material were found. CBI findings said the official had committed various acts of omission and commission which facilitated Telgi and his associates to acquire technical know-how for printing fake stamps and non-judicial stamp papers. Prakash sought help of the scamster in getting a promotion and, in return, promised all help from the press.

Besides Telgi and Prakash, four other employees of India Security Press named in the case were retired machinist N A Bhusare, works manager Mahendra Singh, assistant controller of stamps, P P Konkane and head clerk D S Shaligram. The works manager, who was then in-charge of the disposal cell in the ISP, had allowed Telgi to visit the letter-press section of the ISP and also facilitated his meeting with Prakash, the CBI alleged. The retired machinist had helped Telgi in repairing the printing machines which were brought from disposal cell of the ISP by one J K Singh, an accomplice of the scamster. The machinist also provided perforating pins for use in the old perforating machine. The assistant controller and head clerk were instrumental in creating artificial scarcity of various fiscal stamps to different states even though sufficient stock was available with the ISP, it alleged. The CBI said that Prakash had not dismantled the printing machines as per the rule after being sent for auction by the government.

APFELBAUM CHARGED WITH FRAUD

US Stamp dealer John D Apfelbaum of Philadelphia was sentenced to three years' probation on March 31, 2004 by United States District Court Judge John E Sprizzo in New York City in connection with an auction bidrigging scam that ran from the early 1980s until at least 1997.

In addition, his company, Earl P L Apfelbaum Inc, was fined \$130,000 and John Apfelbaum himself, the firm's executive vice president, \$20,000, the Department of Justice told The Virtual Stamp Club.

The company also agreed to pay \$200,000 in restituting to satisfy a judgment in a case brought by the Attorneys General of New York, California and North Carolina.

Under federal sentencing guidelines, Apfelbaum could have received up to six months in prison after pleading guilty January 28, 2002, to two felony counts of violating the Sherman Antitrust Act in a criminal probe of bid rigging at stamp auctions.

However, because of his "substantial cooperation with the government in the case, probation became an option," prosecutor Charles Reilly, the U.S. Department of Justice Antitrust Division office in New York City, told Linn's Stamp News.

According to the plea agreement filed in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York, Apfelbaum and his firm agree to continue to cooperate with the Antitrust Division "and provide full, complete and truthful information concerning any matter about which" the government asks - which could mean providing information about the activities of the other alleged auction bid-riggers.
