This year, the United Nations will celebrate its sixtieth anniversary. The year 2005 also marks the birth centenary of its former Secretary-General Dag Hammarskjöld.

In addition, by resolution 53/197, the UN General Assembly designated the year 2005 as the International Year of Microcredit to give impetus to microfinance programs throughout the world. The international community has been observing the period 1997-2006 as the first United Nations Decade for the Eradication of Poverty. The microcredit programs have successfully contributed to lifting people out of poverty in many countries around the world and have especially benefited women and have resulted in the achievement of their empowerment.

2005 was also proclaimed by resolution 58/5 as the International Year for Sport and Physical Education, as a means to promote education, health, development and peace.

This year was also proclaimed International Year of Physics by resolution 58/263. Telephone 91-0253-2465583 FAKE STAMP SCAM UPDATES Delhi North District police arrested Deva Nand Sharma for selling fake stamp papers from the Tis Hazari Courts complex on January 17, 2005. Counterfeit stamp papers worth more than Rs 87,000 was recovered from him. A decoy customer was sent to strike a deal with Sharma to buy stamp papers worth Rs 5,000 for Rs 2,000. As the deal was struck, the police team arrested him from the parking area of the court complex. Sharma was carrying a bag containing forged stamp papers worth more than Rs 70,000. On checking, it was found that the stamp papers had already been used and the accused had removed the written matter with the help of an ink remover and was re-selling it. During the course of investigation, stamp papers worth Rs 12,000 were also recovered from his house. Sharma disclosed that his wife, Babita, had a licence of a stamp vendor and he would sit in her place to sell the papers. Sharma's cousin, Yogender

Kumar Sharma, also a stamp paper vendor, used to arrange the used stamp papers and one Som Dutt would remove the matter and seals from the used ones with the help of the ink remover. Sharma then sold these stamp papers to the customers at half rates. Four years ago, Sharma was arrested in a similar case.

Its content include: Chief Officers of the Department, Exclusive Privilege of Indian Post Office, Inland Post, Postage stamps, List of Indian Post Offices, District Post, Foreign Post, Official Correspondence, Registration, Time Tables of Mail steamers, Government Bullock Train, Passenger Service, Money Orders, and Telegraph Department.

The 236 page hardbound reprint is a facsimile enlarged from original octavo to A4 size. This limited edition is available at a special price for €50 post paid anywhere in the world or Rs 2750 post paid in India.

## ATISH KUMAR JAIN, Kottayam

On 26 Dec 2004, whole of south Asia was stuck by deadly Tsunami which claimed hundreds of thousands of lives. Recently, our philatelic bureaus have been stuck by a Tsunami sweeping the miniature sheets and within last month all the stocks miniature sheets (released two years ago also) have been swept away by our philatelic hoarders through out India. While millions of rupees have flooded philatelic bureaus for purchase of these miniature sheets, not a single philatelic organization has come forward with a helping hand to orphaned children and widowed ladies.

## ZULAIHA MOHAMED

I am a member of the philatelic bureaus of Trivandrum & Kochi (Ernakulam). I was told by both these bureaus that they did not receive sufficient number of Miniature Sheets of Taj Mahal. Actually there was a notice in the Trivandrum bureau saying that there was no stock and that too on the day after the release of the stamp. I was told that they don't have enough sheets to fulfill standing orders to the philatelic deposit account holders.

The same thing has happened with the stamps on Dogs. Though I went to the bureau on the 3rd day, again they said that they had not received enough number of stamps and so had restricted the sale of stamps to just one sheet each to those who came to the counter.

Can you do anything about this & officially bring it to the notice of the higher authorities?

Is it true that there is a shortage of miniature sheets as most of them are being bought up in large numbers by dealers?

I understand that Department of Post brings out a stamp to commemorate every Bharat Ratna recipient. It has been brought to my notice by many that a stamp on Dr P V Kane, a Bharat Ratna recipient (at least about 3 decades ago I guess), has not been released for whatever reason. Department of Post may want to correct this lapse. They can get all the information regarding Dr Kane from central government as he was awarded Bharat Ratna.

PRIVILEGED POSTAL RATES FOR SOLDIERS & SEAMEN The special postage rates applicable on soldiers' and seamen's letters posted in India were revised as follows with effect from April 1, 1895:

To the United Kingdom or any British possession or colony served through the United Kingdom, by P & O contract steamer Via Brindisi, By ordinary train service across the continent of Europe - Anna 1

To the United Kingdom or any British possession or colony served through the United Kingdom, by P & O contract steamer Via Brindisi, By special train service across the continent of Europe - Annas 2

To Cyprus (through Egypt) - Annas 2

To any British possession or colony (and Zanzibar) served direct by British or Indian services only - Anna 1

TSUNAMI RELIEF STAMP

France became the first country to issue a stamp on the Tsunami disaster of December 26, 2004 that affected several countries from Indonesia to Somalia.

The stamp was issued on January 8, 2005 along with the series of new definitves. The non-denominated stamp is priced at Euro 0.70, Euro 0.50 for postage (inland first class letter rate) and Euro 0.20 as contribution towards French Red Cross.
