## DANDI MARCH STAMPS BOOKLETS

Northern Region of the Kerala Postal Circle, Calicut issued a stamp booklet on May 26, 2005. The booklet is priced at Rs 40 and contains the 4 commemorative stamps issued to mark the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi's March to Dandi. Only 300 booklets are produced.

Philatelic Society of Rajasthan (PSR) issued a stamp booklet on June 1, 2005. The booklet is priced at Rs 50 and contains the 8 commemorative stamps as well as 8 self adhesive labels issued by the PSR to mark the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi's March to Dandi. Only 500 booklets are produced.

Earlier this year a set of 5 stamp booklets were issued by Chhattisgarh Postal Circle on February 26. The themes were Tajmahal, Mahatma Gandhi, Peacock, Dances, and Festivals. North Bengal & Sikkim Region of West Bengal Postal Circle issued a set of 4 stamp booklets on April 28. The themes were Orchid, Yak, Satyr Tragopan Pheasants, and Red Panda.

# UNIQUE PORTUGUESE INDIA STAMP AUCTIONED

The only known used example of the Portuguese India 1872 second issue 100 reis on soft wove paper that was recently listed by Scott (as no. 7A) on the basis of this example was sold by David Feldamn in an auction on May 24, 2005 at Geneva, Switzerland for Swiss Franks 24,000 (Indian Rupees 850,000).

Gerry Gonyea of New York, the consignor of this stamp, read in the issue No. 137 (Vol. 35, year 2000) of Porto Info, the official journal of the International Society for Portuguese Philately about an unused example that is in the collection of Bob Huggins, a knowledgeable specialist of Portuguese India. This prompted Gonyea to search his extensive holdings and find this gem. This find was also reported in 'Stamps of India Collectors Companion' issue # 49 of August 23, 2001.

This stamp was certified as genuine by both the ISPP (2001) and the APS (2001). Both certificates note repairs (to the top right corner) and a small scrape below "D" of "INDIA". It has decent margins; fresh color and sharp barred-numeral "5" cancel. This undoubtedly is the most important used stamp of the Portuguese Colonies and was offered for the first time at public auction.

The earliest-known reference to the 100r yellow-green on soft wove paper appears in the December 1930 issue of the Philatelic Journal of Great Britain. Writing in that publication, R B Yardley declared that "some time ago I acquired a damaged specimen [illustrated in the article] . . . in the normal pale yellow-green of the first issue, which is certainly not on the thin brittle paper of the first issue." Yardley stated that the stamp had been submitted to the expert committee of the Royal Philatelic Society London and that the committee was "satisfied that the stamp is genuine, and that the paper is not that of the first issue." "It is, in fact, on a medium, somewhat hard wove paper . . . " Yardley speculated that a small part of an early printing of the 100r yellowgreen was completed on the thick paper, because the printer ran out of the thin paper. Regarding Yardley's 75-year-old revelation, Gonyea makes a tantalizing observation: "It appears that there may be one more used example somewhere in the world because the stamp shown in the 1930 article is not the one I have."

# FAKE STAMP SCAM UPDATES

More than 1,000 people were involved in the illegal business of printing fake stamps and stamp papers in the country and the government has so far not been able to nab them, according to Abdul Karim Telgi, prime accused in the multi-crore fake stamp paper case. "There is a huge stock of such stamp papers but nothing is done to check its proliferation", Telgi told his lawyer Harshad Nimbalkar at Yerawada Central Prison at

Today I received the Book 'INDIAN POSTAL GUIDE 1869'. On the outer wrapper of the book you have affixed a block of 4 of Rs50 stamp plus one Rs.20 Stamp. But the post office in New Delhi has put a registration Code Label exactly in the middle of the Block of 4 and rendered it useless for all philatelic purposes as can be seen by the scans <a href="http://www.stampsofindia.com/newssite/newspost/223b-pix.htm">http://www.stampsofindia.com/newssite/newspost/223b-pix.htm</a>

In the past I had received two registered covers, one from Varanasi and the other from Jamnagar. Here also as you will find in the scan, the registration code label has been affixed exactly on the stamps!

I do not understand why the post offices in India put the label exactly on the stamps? Is there an internal convention that the label should be affixed to the stamps?

I feel that India Post should take notice of this malpractice that must be stopped forthwith.

STAMPS ON INDIA

#### INS Delhi

Fiji will issue a set of 10 se-tenant stamps in the denomination of 83¢ each on June 27, 2005 to mark the  $60^{th}$  Anniversary of the End of World War II. The first stamp depicts HMNZS Achilles that was later acquired by India and served as INS Delhi, independent India's first flagship of Indian Navy.

The INS Delhi was a Leander class cruiser built for the Royal Navy in 1931 as HMS Achilles and commissioned into the New Zealand Division of the Royal Navy in 1937, becoming HMNZS Achilles on the formation of the Royal New Zealand Navy in 1941. She was returned to the Royal Navy at the end of the Second World War and was sold to the Indian Navy in 1948. The ship was re-commissioned as HMIS Delhi on July 5, 1948 and after India's independence was known as INS Delhi. In December 1961 she took active part in liberation of Goa. She served Indian Navy for 30 years and was decommissioned in 1978.

New Zealand had earlier issued stamp on this ship thrice on three different occasions.

# PORTUGUESE OLYMPIC STAMP WINS GOLD

Portugal has won the 2004 Olympia Prize gold medal. This distinction, awarded by an international jury of renowned philatelists, artists, journalists and IOC members, honors the best stamps of the 2004 Olympic Games. The stamp shows an athlete clearing the high jump bar. The Prize will be presented to Portugal at the 117th IOC Session on 7 July in Singapore.

The 2004 Olympia Prize silver medal was awarded to Ukraine for its stamp illustrating the Games of Antiquity, while Australia won the bronze medal with a modern subject: the start of a race. Singapore's stamp received the distinction for originality for a historic subject showing athletes engraved on a stone.

The International Olympic Philately Federation (FIPO), which organizes this contest after each edition of the Olympic Games, will present, during the 117th IOC Session, the Olympia Prize finalists as well as some new philatelic items, particularly the stamps of the candidates cities for the organization of the 2012 Olympic Games.
