GRETA GARBO US SWEDEN JOINT ISSUE

Sweden Post and United States Postal Service are commemorating the birth centenary of Greta Garbo with a joint issue on September 23, 2005.

Greta Garbo (1905-1990) began her career at the Swedish Royal Dramatic Theatre's acting school in 1922. After working in several advertising films, she was discovered at the tender age of 19 by the famed director Mauritz Stiller, who gave her a part in the silent film The Saga of Gösta Berling. While filming in Berlin, Garbo was discovered by one of the most powerful men in Hollywood, Louis B. Mayer, who immediately signed the beautiful girl from Sweden. Garbo starred in several films made during the following years, including Queen Christina (1933), Anna Karenina (1935) and Ninotchka (1939). Her final film was 1941's "Two-Faced Woman," and at age 36, she chose to step away from the cameras and never again work as an actress.

Swedish Greta Garbo issue consists of two stamps in the denomination of SEK 10 each. The first stamp, to be issued jointly with the USA, is based on a photograph of Garbo at age 27, taken in 1932 by MGM's Clarence Bull during the filming of "As You Desire Me" and engraver Piotr Naszarkowski adapted that image for the stamp. The other stamp, only to be issued by Sweden, is engraved by Lars Sjööblom and shows Garbo's profile as drawn by the Swedish artist Einar Nerman.

Swedish stamps will be available in a booklet of 4 stamps. Sweden will also issue a collector's sheet priced SEK 64 depicting a poster for the film The Saga of Gösta Berling, drawn by Nils Hårde.

US stamp is in the denomination of 37 cents and will be issued in sheets of 20 stamps.
