NEW STAMPS RELEASED

NEWBORN HEALTH IN INDIA

Dayanidhi Maran, Minister of Communications & Information Technology released a postage stamp in the denomination of Rs 5 on Newborn Health in India to mark the Silver Jubilee Year of the National Neonatology Forum (NNF) on November 24, 2005 at New Delhi.

NNF started in 1980 as an organization of pediatricians of tertiary care institutions to promote neonatology, soon became a catalyst for advancing newborn health throughout the country and helping to expand newborn care beyond the nurseries in hospitals. NNF currently has over 2500 members as well as chapters in 18 states and is operating in 140 districts of the country. The Government had supplied the equipment and the NNF trains healthcare workers at district hospitals.

In India, 529,000 women die during childbirth each year and 10.6 million children do not reach their 5th birthday. The neonatal mortality accounts for two-third of infant mortality. India accounts for a maternal mortality rate of 400 per 100,000 live births, an infant mortality rate of 60 per thousand live births and a neonatal mortality rate of 40 per thousand live births. India is committed to the Millennium Development goals to bring down the neonatal mortality rate to 20 per thousand.

NNF is a member of the National Technical Committee on Child Health apart from many other advisory formulations and is routinely consulted on policy and program issues. Likewise, many state leaders of NNF are involved in different ways in assisting the respective state governments in newborn care initiatives.

NNF is assisting the government, WHO and UNICEF in adapting the Integrated Management of Childhood Illness (IMCI). The draft Indian version of IMCI is christened Integrated Management of Newborn and Childhood Illness (IMNCI) underlining the added emphasis on the neonatal component.

Sankha Samanta designed the Stamp and the First Day Cover. Nenu Gupta designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. India Security Press printed the stamps by Photo Gravure in the quantity of 0.8 million.

OLYMPIC GAMES 2008 STAMP PROGRAM

The Beijing Olympic Games' Stamp Program was officially launched on November 7, 2005 by signing an agreement between Beijing Organizing Committee for the Games of the XXIX Olympiad (BOCOG) with the State Post Bureau of China. According to the program, the Post Bureau is licensed to issue a number of sets of stamps with the theme of the Beijing 2008 Olympic Games and Paralympic Games, including their emblems, mascots, competition sports, venues, and the torch relay to meet demand from home and abroad. A portion of royalties collected by the State Post Bureau will be used to fund the preparations for the Beijing Olympiad scheduled for August 8 - 24, 2008.

The Post Bureau issued the first set of 6 stamps of the Beijing Olympics on November 12, 2005. The stamps in the denomination of 80 fen each, depict the logo of the games and the five mascots of the Beijing Olympics unveiled on November 11, 2005, exactly 1,000 days before the Games' opening ceremony. There are 3 sheets of stamps, a sheet of 10 carrying 2 se-tenant strips of five mascots stamps, a sheet of 10 of the logo stamp, and a sheet of 12 self-adhesive stamps - 10 mascots and 2 logo stamps.

The Mascots consists of five figures, officially named the Five Friendlies. They include Beibei the Fish, Jingjing the Panda, Huanhuan the Olympic Flame, Yingying the Tibetan Antelope, and Nini the Swallow.

The first characters of their rhythmic two-syllable names form a line that reads "Beijing Huanying Ni," or in English "Welcome to Beijing." The color of each mascot was chosen in line with the colours of the Olympic Rings.

This stamp issue has provided a much needed boast for the stamp market in China that has not been so hot for almost a year. The first set of Beijing Olympics is already offered at 20 times the face value in the local market and expected to rise further.
