NEW STAMPS RELEASED

N M R SUBBARAMAN

Minister for Communication and Information Technology Dayanidhi Maran, released a postage stamp to commemorate the birth centenary of N M R Subbaraman on January 29, 2006 at Madurai in the denomination of Rs 5.

Subbaraman was born on August 14, 1905 at Madurai. He was an aedent follower of Mahatma Gandhi and chose to join freedom struggle in place of going to London for higher studies in 1922.

Widely admired as 'Madurai Gandhi', he participated in all Satyagraha Movements and courted imprisonment along with his wife for about five years. He held positions like Chairman of the Madurai Municipality, Member of then Madras Legislative Assembly before and after Independence. He was also elected to the Lok Sabha from Madurai Constituency.

Uplifting the lives of Harijans was a work dear to his heart. His work among Harijans to bring them into the main stream of socio-political life is legendary. Through Tamil Nadu Harijans Sevak Sangh, a unit of all India Harijans Sevak Sangh founded by Mahatma Gandhi, Subbaraman was instrumental in establishing a chain of Harijan Hostels.

Subbaraman was deeply involved in Bhoodan Movement started by Vinoba Bhave and donated 100 acres of his fertile land. He was instrumental in establishing the first Gandhi Museum in the country at Madurai.

Sankha Samanta designed the Stamp and the First Day Cover. Nenu Gupta designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. India Security Press printed the stamps by Photo Gravure in the quantity of 0.6 million.

 3^{RD} BATTALION THE SIKH REGIMENT

India Post released a postage stamp to commemorate 150 years of the $3^{\rm rd}$ Battalion of the Sikh Regiment on February 1, 2008 in the denomination of Rs 5.

The Battalion was raised as the Bengal Military Police Battalion by Captain Thomas Rattray on January 31, 1656 at Lahore (now in Pakistan) where a number of ex-soldiers of the old Sikh Army, who had earlier fought the British, were available. In 1856 it was renamed as 1st Bengal Military Police Battalion. In 1864 it was designated 45th (Rattray's Sikhs) Regiment of Bengal Native Infantry. In 1885 the Bengal Native Infantry was re-designated as Bengal Infantry. In 1901 it was renamed 45th Rattray's Sikh Infantry and again in 1903 as 45th Rattray's Sikhs. In 1922 it was incorporated as 3rd Battalion of 11th Sikh Regiment. In 1945 the 11th Sikh Regiment was renamed as The Sikh Regiment.

Kamleshwar Singh designed the Stamp and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. India Security Press printed the stamps by Photo Gravure in the quantity of 0.6 million.

UNGUMMED DEFINITIVE STAMPS

The first stamp of the 9th definitive series was on 'International Year of Physics 2005' and was issued on March 31, 2005. This was a strange choice for a definitive that remains in print and in use for several years. Perhaps it should have been designated as Special Definitive. Even more strangely the stamp was issued without gum. Some philatelists remarked that it may have been India Post's tribute to the first stamps of India which issued without gum on their 150th anniversary!

Since then, in the ensuing one year, all definitive stamps were issued without gum or so it seems and nothing seems strange anymore. So far we have recorded following values in 8^{th} definitive series: 25p, 50p, Re1, Rs 2, Rs 4, Rs 5, Rs 10, and Rs20 and in the special definitive series: Re1, and Rs2. This leaves out Rs 3, Rs 15, and Rs 50 in 8^{th} definitive series and Rs 3 in the special definitive.

This not only added an ungummed variety to the definitive stamps but also added a new kind of collectible - the packing label of the pack of 200 sheets. India Security Press Nashik that exclusively prints the definitive stamps prominently states the ungummed status.

SPEED POST GOLD

India Post launched 'Speed Post Gold' service between Delhi and Mumbai on February 1, 2006 that assures next day forenoon delivery for articles booked before 6 pm for selected delivery areas. This service was originally named 'Premium Post' but was renamed 'Speed Post Gold' to leverage the brand goodwill of Speed Post.

The tariff is Rs 100 up to 200 grams, Rs 120 between 201 and 500 grams and Rs 40 for every additional 500 grams or part thereof.

The booking is available at 8 post offices at Delhi - Speed Post Centre (Market Road), Connaught Place, Indraprastha HPO, Lodi Road HPO, Sansad Marg HPO, New Delhi HPO, Karol Bagh, and Nirman Bhawan and 6 post offices at Mumbai - Mumbai GPO, Ville Parle DMC, Mumbai Central HPO, Delisle Road, Parel, and Malad West.

The articles will be accepted for delivery in the following delivery areas in Mumbai - Mumbai GPO 400001, Kalba Devi 400002, Girgaon 400004, Colaba 400005, Marine Drive 400020, Nariman Point 400021, Mantralaya 400032; and in Delhi - New Delhi HPO 110001, Indraprastha HPO 110002, Lodi Road HPO 110003, Karol Bagh 110005, and Nirman Bhawan 110011.
