NEW STAMPS RELEASED

India Post released a set of four postage stamps to commemorate President's Review of Fleet at Visakhapatnam on February 12, 2006 in the denomination of Rs 5 each.

The fleet review is a long-standing tradition observed by major navies. It is a ceremonial event where the president witnesses the navy's strength and reaffirms his faith in its ability to safeguard the nation's maritime interests.

In India, the President, as the Supreme Commander of the armed forces, reviews the Fleet once during his tenure. Eight Reviews have taken place in India since Independence in 1947. The first was held in 1953 and the last, an International Fleet Review in 2001 at Mumbai.

After a number of ceremonies ashore, the President's yacht steams past an impressive array of ships of both the Indian and merchant navies and the Coast Guard which together symbolize the country's maritime strength. The Indian Fleet Review varies from that of some navies of the world, where ships steam past the reviewing yacht or ship. In a tradition inherited from the Royal Navy, the President inspects the navy to ascertain its strength and reaffirm his faith in its readiness to safeguard the nation's maritime interests and its security.

President of India A P J Abdul Kalam will review the ninth President's Fleet Review (PFR) at Visakhapatnam on February 12, 2006. This is the first time that the President's Fleet Review is being held on the Eastern Coast. The review was held in Mumbai during the past eight occasions.

The Navy will showcase around 50 naval ships and 55 aircraft ranging from carriers, missile destroyers, submarines, stealth frigates, naval sea fighters and helicopters.

The stamps depict INS Virrat aircraft carrier, and fighter plane Sea Harrier; Talwar and Brahamputra class frigates and anti submarine Sea King helicopter; Sindhughosh and Sishumar class submarines; and Sandhayak class Survey vessel and off shore petrol vessel Vigraha of Indian Coast Guard along with a Dornier aircraft.

The First Day Cover depicts the Flag of the Indian Navy and the anchorage plan off Visakhapatnam Harbor. The first day postmark is an adaptation of two-masted ship from a $2^{\rm nd}$ century Satavahana coin.

Sankha Samanta designed the Stamps and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. India Security Press printed the stamps in sheets of 16 that is 4 se-tenant blocks by Photo Gravure in the quantity of 0.8 million blocks.

POSTAL STATIONERY UPDATES

India Post issued a stamped envelope in a revised size on July 18, 2005. The revised size of 110 x 220 mm conforms to ISO (International Organization for Standardization) 269 and is identified as "Dimension Lengthwise" or more commonly as "DL". This size is meant for A4 sheet folded in thirds and A5 sheet folded in half lengthwise. It is a very widely used standard size.

This also conforms to the requirements of the Universal Postal Union that the envelopes for correspondence (1) measure at least 90 mm x 140 mm (3 1/2" x 5 1/2") and no more than 120 mm x 235 mm (4 3/4" x 9 1/4"); (2) be oblong, with the dimension of the long side being at least 1.414 times that of the short side; and (3) be made from paper weighing at least 63 gsm (grams per square meter).

This issue was originally printed only by the Security Printing Press, Hyderabad in azure laid ivory paper as was currently being used for the stamped envelopes in smaller size. However vide a notification dated August 30, 2005 India Post informed that the printing of this envelope will now be undertaken also by India Security Press, Nashik Road. We are yet to see the envelope in azure by India Security Press, Nashik Road and request the readers to look around and report its existence.

A new Stamped Envelope in the denomination of Rs 5 was released at the closing ceremony of the Sesquicentennial Celebrations of India Post on October 18, 2005 at New Delhi. The envelope was on white paper in the new Standardized size of 220×110 mm. The stamp is the single color replica of the fourth stamp in the set of 4 stamps issued on October 4, 2004 at the inaugural ceremony of the Sesquicentennial Celebrations of India Post. It is printed by both the presses in blue color.

D MADHAO RAO IS NO MORE

Dharnikot Madhao Rao, the distinguished thematic philatelist has died on January 24, 2006 after a cardiac arrest at Bhopal.

Born on February 16, 1931, Rao was very popular and co-operative philatelist.

His contribution to the development of thematic philately in India was immense. He was the founder of Indian Topical Association (January 15, 1980) and edited India's only topical philatelic magazine TOP PHIL for about 20 years. Under his editorship it acquired an important place in the world of Thematic Philately not only in India but abroad also. He had to give up editing due to failing health about 5 years ago. And afterwards TOP PHIL became irregular and finally stopped it's publication.

He was Executive Secretary of Indian Topical Association and Vice President of Madhya Pradesh Philatelic Federation.

He had vast collection and his classic themes were Discovery of India, Hindu Culture and Great Britain. He had received many medals in National and International Philatelic Exhibitions. Hundreds of his articles on Philately were published in various news papers and magazines. He had conducted Philatelic Workshops in various Schools and was Jury member of various Philatelic Exhibitions.
