#### NEW STAMPS RELEASED

##### INDIAN AGRICULTURAL RESEARCH INSTITUTE

Minister of Agriculture & Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution, Sharad Pawar released a commemorative postage stamp on Indian Agricultural Research Institute to mark the Centenary Year of the Institute on March 30, 2006 at New Delhi.

Dr Shakeel Ahmad the Minister of State for Communication and IT, Brijesh Kumar Secretary IT, Dr Mangala Rai Director General ICAR, Dr A K Singh Director IARI, Senior faculty members of Indian Agricultural Research Institute were present among a number of other dignitaries, agricultural scientists and experts.

The Indian Agricultural Research Institute (IARI) is the leading institution for research and advanced education in agricultural science in India. It was established in 1905 as the Imperial Agricultural Research Institute, and was recognized as a 'deemed university' in 1958 by an act of Parliament and since then it has awarded Masters and Doctorate degrees. It is financed and administered by the Indian Council for Agricultural Research (ICAR). The IARI was responsible for the research leading to the "Green revolution" of the 1970s.

The campus was originally located in Pusa, a village in North Bihar and was shifted after the devastating earthquake of Bihar in 1934 to New Delhi in 1936 to a place which is since called Pusa in New Delhi.

Kamleshwar Singh designed the Stamp and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. India Security Press printed the stamps by Photo Gravure in the quantity of 0.8 million in sheets of 35.

62 CAVALRY

India Post has issued a Commemorative postage stamp in the denomination of Rs 5 on the Golden Jubilee of the 62 Cavalry, on April 1, 2006

62 Cavalry has the dual honor of being the first Armored Regiment to be raised in Independent India, as also the first raised on Tanks. It was on 1st July, 1956 that raising orders were issued and the Regiment was declared fit for war on 31st March, 1957.

It may be recalled that in the 1965 Indo-Pak war the regiment proved its excellence in the battle as well as in capturing Phillora.

In the 1971 war, the regiment was the first to be formed as an independent combat group of the Indian Army tasked to launch an audacious offensive into the enemy territory.

On March 31, 1981, on the occasion of the Silver Jubilee of the Regiment, former President Neelam Sanjiva Reddy presented the Guidon to the Regiment.

The Regiment has been successfully deployed during Operation Trident, Operation Vijay and Operation Parakram.

FAREWELL TO THE POSTMASTER GENERAL NORTH BENGAL & SIKKIM

Siliguri Philatelists Society and Sikkim Philatelists Society organized a function to bid farewell to the outgoing Post Master General of North Bengal and Sikkim Region - John Samuel on the evening of March 12, 2005 at Deokota Sangha in Siliguri.

The two hour long event was a not only about Samuel's contribution to the growth of philately in this region but also a tribute to philately in this region and was attended by a large number of the philatelists.

Samuel quoted famous philosophers to stress the need to develop stamp collection as a hobby. He said that it is not an easy task to promote philately in North Bengal and Sikkim, "we had to face great odds while working here", he recalled. Samuel shared his views on Siliguri- calling Siliguri as one of his two favorite towns, and said that he had no doubt that it would emerge as one of the top cities in India in the coming years. He remarked before looking back with pride at having successfully organized several philatelic shows and competitions in the region, bringing out several special covers at regular intervals and achieving

the rare distinction of being the postal region in the country to have published the largest number of the different varieties of stamp booklets on the natural and cultural heritage of North Bengal and Sikkim. Samuel said "the dollars and yens are pouring in" the United Kingdom's Royal Mail has offered to sell our Darjeeling Tea Post through post office throughout England. After years in shadow philately in this region is suddenly basking in limelight and now its time for a big push.

Samuel and his wife Ramola were presented with a citation by the members of the two societies.

The President of Siliguri Philatelists Society, Surya Kanta Biswas emphasized the need to develop philately as a vocation. The Secretary of the SPS Pawan Kumar Agarwal suggested that the pursuit be made a subject of study in schools and colleges and even at post graduate level. Among the other philatelists, Padam Parajuli spoke about the establishment of the societies. Ramesh Sewa, the Additional Director of Postal Services also spoke on the occasion. Chiranjib Chakraborty, Convener of SPS, delivered the vote of thanks.

The society also congratulated the silver medal winner Shashank Agarwal, the bronze medal winners Manoranjan Sharma, Biswajit Bhattacharya, Surnima Parajuli, and Chiranjib Chakraborty for their success in the Stamp Show 2005, held in December, 2005 at Kolkata.
