NEW STAMPS RELEASED

PANNALAL BARUPAL

India Post released a commemorative postage stamp in the denomination of Rs 5 on Pannalal Barupal, freedom fighter, Social reformer and parliamentarian, on April 28, 2006.

Barupal was born in Bikaner Rajasthan. He was an active participator in the Non-cooperative Movement and Quit India Movement. He was a Member of Parliament for 25 years (1952-1977) and raised his voice for the demands of the farmers, workers, laborers and weaker sections of society. Ideals of social justice, equality of men and women and eradication of casteism

were dear to him. He was a man of varied interests; his poetry and articles on contemporary social issues reveal the sensitive side of him.

Kamleshwar Singh designed the Stamp and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. India Security Press printed the stamps by Photo Gravure in the quantity of 0.4 million.

In Issue # 230 of July 21, 2005 we reported that the Minister for Communications and Information Technology, on July 18, 2005 at Chennai introduced the sale of special stamp packets, costing Rs 100 and Rs 200, containing postal stamps in the denomination of Rs 5 by the postmen. The Postmen will also collect mails from home and offices for dispatch.

We have been reporting packs issued by other postal circles from time to time since. We now report that packs also have been issued by Rajasthan Uttar Pradesh, and Maharashtra (2<sup>nd</sup> design).

SPEED POST TRACKING ON MOBILE PHONES

Speed Post articles can now be tracked on Reliance mobile phones. Initially, the service will be available on 'R World' and will soon be deployed SMS interactivity from any Reliance mobile.

A customer can log onto the 'R World' suite of applications, select India Post and submit the consignment number. The status of the consignment including the date and time, details of the mail send, current position of the consignment or delivery status among others would be displayed on the handset. The company is charging Rs 3 per query.

BANK ON YOUR POSTMAN

Andhra Circle of India Post has introduced 'Bank On Your Postman' scheme on May 23, 2006 wherein all savings bank account holders need not go to the post office to withdraw money from their saving account but can get the money delivered at their doorstep by the postal officials. The scheme will be available at 2,354 main post offices and 101 head-post offices across the state. A sum of Rs 5,000 can be drawn from the accounts at a given time in this scheme and the customers will be charged Rs 25 in the Hyderabad and Secunderabad and Rs 20 at all other parts of the state for this service.

MOBILE PHONE OPERATORS TIE-UP WITH INDIA POST

The Cellular Operators Association of India (COAI), which is acting on behalf of the industry have passed on the job of customer verification to India Post before issuing a new connection.

T V Ramachandran, Director-General, COAI, said, "This is just the beginning of the alliance with India Post. We will expand the scope of

this relationship in the next few months whereby we can use the unmatched postal network spread across the nook and corner of the country. With the kind of reach that the DoP has, it will be useful as operators roll out services in the rural sector."

##### SPECIAL CANCELLATIONS ON COMMEMORATIVE COVERS ISSUED AT PHILATELIC EXHIBITIONS By Dr Avinash B Jagtap Binningen (Switzerland)

In "Stamps of India" there is a special section devoted to special cancellations issued at various philatelic exhibitions held in different parts of our country. It is a very valuable service which is being offered periodically by "Stamps of India" weekly newsletter. Thereby enormous philatelic wealth is recorded and made available to thematic collectors. After all a thematic collection is not only merely a collection of stamps or miniature sheets, but it also includes among others, special pictorial cancellations. I must admire the design, logo and craftsmanship which are contributed towards the creation of such special cancellations. I may even go further and say that these special cancellations are far more superior to the regular first day cancellations which are drafted by professional artists employed by India Post.

However I observe that there are three aspects in presenting such special cancellations to the philatelists. The first and foremost is the stationery envelope (or a postcard), bearing relevant illustration of a personality, an institution or a monument on the left hand side of the envelope. It could be black and white or also colored. Then there is the special cancellation. In case of most of the envelopes which one can download in the special section "Recent Special Postmarks and covers" of "Stamps of India" Newsletter, there is a perfect concordance of these two elements. But so far as the stamp affixed to the envelope is concerned, it seems that the organizers of philatelic exhibitions pay very little attention to and devote less logic in selecting proper stamps. This point will be very clear to the readers, when I ask them to cast their eyes upon the special cancellation covers on Hirapex (Jan. 4, 2006 / Sambalpur) or M E S KEVEE YAM COLLEGE Silver Jubilee (Jan. 13, 2006 / Valancheri) covers to which the stamp commemorating M S Subbulakshmi has been affixed! Now any body would understand, that the famous singer has apparently nothing to do with the occasions, to commemorate which, the special cancellations have been issued!, so also the other cover issued with a special cancellation created to propagate "Sport Goods and Fitness"(Feb. 18, 2006 / New Delhi) bears a commemorative stamp issued to convey greetings on Pongal festivities! As against these, there are other special covers with Fruit and Flower Show (Feb. 4, 2006 / Calicut) and National Rail Museum (Feb. 23, 2006 / New Delhi) with the most appropriate stamps. I think the readers will agree that the choice of an appropriate stamp which is affixed to an envelope specially designed and printed for a particular philatelic exhibition, is also of importance.

Unfortunately in India we do not have so called "neutral" stamps, stamps without any proper theme, like those FRAMA labels with a price paid printed on them. These are obtained from automatic wending machines in

post offices. They are devoid of gaudy colors. Formerly they were red in color but nowadays they may bear designs which are very pale in color and thus never perform the function of attracting eyes of spectators. Our Indian stamps are very colorful and they, if wrongly chosen, do mislead the spectators, as these stamps seem to have been given much more importance than the special cancellation which they bear. India has issued so many stamps and most of them are freely available even after years, so there is always a possibility to choose one appropriate stamp for the purpose.
