NEW PRINTERS FOR INDIAN STAMPS

The Security Printing Press (SPP), Hyderabad has begun printing postage stamps for India Post. The first stamp printed by SPP was released on June 15, 2006. SPP has been printing postcards, inland letter cards, and pre-stamped envelopes for India Post since 1982.

SPP will not replace but work in addition to India Security Press, Nashik Road, the other establishment printing postage stamps for India Post.

SPP is one of the four Government of India security presses that produce currency notes and all kinds of other security products. Interestingly it operates from the same premises that were known as Hyderabad Mint that produced postal and fiscal stamps of the Princely State of Hyderabad before 1947.

FORTHCOMING STAMP ISSUES

No dates are announced as yet; however the next issue is expected to be only in July 2006.

New issues along with the First Day Cover and the information sheet, at Rs 2 each, are put on sale on sale at nearly 1000 selected Post Offices including all Philatelic Bureaus and Philatelic Counters in India.

NEW STAMPS RELEASED

SRI PRATAP COLLEGE SRINAGAR

India Post released a postage stamp to mark the centenary of Sri Pratap College Srinagar on June 15, 2006 in the denomination of Rs 5.

Sri Pratap College, Srinagar is one of the most prestigious and oldest educational institutions of higher learning in the Jammu & Kashmir state.

The college came in to being in 1905 by upgrading the famous Hindu High School. In 1911 the college was taken over by the State Government and was renamed as Sri Pratap College after the name of then ruler of the State Maharaja Pratap Singh of Jammu & Kashmir. It was upgraded to degree level and was affiliated to Punjab University, Lahore in 1912. Since 1975 it has de-linked the Arts Faculty and is now an exclusive Science college.

Kamleshwar Singh designed the Stamp and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. Security Printing Press Hyderabad printed the stamps by Wet Offset in the quantity of 0.8 million.

STAMP PAPER VENDING MACHINES

Non-judicial stamp papers, so very vital for legal documents, will soon be made available round the clock in Jaipur. The Rajasthan state government's registration and printing department will install stamp vending machines, resembling ATMs, at key places in the city. Initially the vending machines will be put up at the Jaipur Development Authority, high court, Municipal Corporation, lower court and the Collectorate. In the beginning, the most widely used stamp papers, of Rs.10 denomination, will be made available. It is estimated that 3,000 such stamp papers are used every day in Jaipur. In the stamp vending machines, after inserting two coins of Rs.5 each, the buyer will have to punch in his name, address and other details.

12TH OLYMPIC COLLECTORS WORLD FAIR

From June 2 to 4, 2006 the weekend of Pentecost, with magnificent weather, the 12th Olympic Collectors World Fair took place. The Fair was held in Lausanne for the eighth time since its creation. As usual, it took up a spot on the Museum terrace, under a large tent specially pitched for the occasion.

Almost 60 tables were reserved by collectors from across the world who came to exchange, purchase, sell, compare and complete their collections of pins, mascots, torches, medals, official documents, stamps, photographs, films, autographs, posters, postcards or any other item bearing the Olympic rings.

On the evening of their arrival, the collectors were invited to a presentation of diplomas attesting to their presence at the Fair. These were presented by Juan Antonio Samaranch, Chairman of the Olympic Philately, Numismatics and Memorabilia Commission. The IOC Honorary President was accompanied by Ching-kuo Wu, a member of this Commission. The following day, the participants enjoyed a boat trip on Lake Geneva.

After Norway in 2005, China, the organiser of the next Olympic Games in 2008 in Beijing, was this year's honorary host.
