India Post has again created history in printing different designs of stamps released on Kurinji on May 29, 2006 than the one appearing on the Brochure. It would be seen that in the stamp, the denomination of 1500 printed is in large numerical letters, whereas in the Brochure, the denomination is in small numerical letters.

Same feat is repeated again in the stamp released on Jun 5, 2006 on Rainwater Harvesting. In the stamp Hindi and English inscription (Rain Water Harvesting) are in one line whereas in the Brochure, it would be seen from the stamp design that this inscription is in two lines.

It is not clear how two different designs have appeared both on the stamp and in the Brochure. It appears, due care is not being taken by India Post and, thus, Indian Philately has become a laughing stock in the eyes of public at large. Would India Post take care?
