NEW COLLECTOR PACKS

The long wait is over. India Post has finally ordered the sale of the annual collector Packs of stamps for the year 2005 and 2006 as well as annual pack of the first Day covers with Brochures for 2004, 2005, and 2006.

The Price of pack of stamps is Rs 350 and Rs 450 for 2005 and 2006 respectively. The price of pack of FDC is Rs 540, Rs 450, and Rs 590 for 2004, 2005, and 2006 respectively.

AUCTION ACTION

59 imperforates, progressives, and plate proofs, including 3 photographic proofs, in issued and unissued colors of India 1948 Mahatma Gandhi issue were sold on April 20, 2007 for Euro 75,000 plus 19.5 buyers premium (over Rs 5 million) in David Feldman auction at Geneva, Switzerland.

This was one of the over 300 lots comprising The Courvoisier Archive that was donated by the stamp printing firm Courvoisier to International Life Giving Project Foundation in September 2001 after it ceased its printing activities. It printed stamps for over 60 countries worldwide in past 75 years. The archive was created by drawing from the company's files of unfinished stamps, imperforate (as issued) and usually with progressive proofs showing each component color of the final product, as well as (when available) unadopted essays or color trials. From the sheets in their possession, only one of each item was retained, and it was neatly mounted on specially printed archive pages and housed into a series of uniform blue albums that numbered nearly 100 when they ceased stamp production a few years ago.

Mar 28-30: Ranchi, District Philatelic Exhibition Three special covers were released, one on each day, as follows: Mar 28 - Flame of forest (Palash, the State Flower of Jharkhand) on postmark and 'Save Tree, Plant Tree' on cover Mar 29 - Sword and Shield on postmark and 150 Years of First War of Independence on cover. Mangal Pandey had started revolt against the British on this day 150 yeaes ago. The descendents of 2 martyrs of 1857 revolt from Jharkhand - Vishwanath Shahdev and Tikait Umrao Singh were special guest during the cover release function. Mar 30 - Local pot for measure on postmark and Hat Bazar on cover.

On Match 30 a postal runner carried special covers from Ranchi GPO to the Town Hall, the venue of the exhibition. One of the cover carried a cheque for contribution to the Chief Minister Relief Fund.

Participation was as follows-Invitee class-10 entries in 50 frames Post Office exhibits- 11 Frames Competitive class- Senior 15 participants in 39 frames Competitive class- Youth- 19 participants in 28 Frames

Members of the Jury A S Prasad, Chief Post Master General of Jharkhand Circle, Dr R S Gandhi and S S Basan awarded 1 Gold, 6 Silver and 14 Bronze medals were awarded. Ashok Kumar Tiwary was Apprentice jury.

Prizes were distributed by the Chief Minister of Kharkhand, Madhu Korha. In the Senior Category: Best exhibit + Gold Medal were won by Lalit K Bajla for "India pre Independence". In the Youth class the Best Exhibit + Silver Medal were won by Ridhi Choudhary for "Indian miniature sheets" Beside philatelic exhibition, varieties of cultural programs and competition were held during the exhibition.
