NEW STAMPS RELEASED

Dr Manmohan Singh, the Prime Minister of India released a commemorative postage stamp on Dr J P Naik on the occasion of his birth centenary on September 5, 2007 at New Delhi.

Dr Naik was a freedom fighter in his youth. He spent his later years working for the advancement of social science research in the country. He was the founder Member-Secretary of the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR), New Delhi. The first ever education policy of independent India was drafted by Dr Naik.

Born on September 5, 1907 in a poor family, he had a brilliant academic career and his mind was equally interested in literature, history and mathematics. He was awarded the Padma Bhushan in 1974. He always worked

on a nominal salary of Re 1 per month as he was freedom fighter in his youth and wished to retain his freedom throughout his life.

Brahm prakash designed the Stamps and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. Security Printing Press, Hyderabad printed the stamps by Wet Offset in the quantity of 0.4 million each.

TILAK COMMEMORATIVE COIN

India Government Mint Mumbai will accept booking of Proof and Uncirculated coins on 150th birth anniversary of Lokmanya Bal Gangadhar Tilak. The booking will commence from September 17, 2007 and will remain open till 31st December 2007.

Dr Manmohan Singh, the Prime Minister of India unveiled the commemorative coin on July 23, 2007 at New Delhi. The initial supply of these coins had the Hindi inscription 'Bal Gangadhar Tilak Ji'. The word 'Ji' is an honorific and is suffixed to the names somewhat similar to English word 'esquire'. The correct usage of the honorific Ji is that it is added after the proper name and not after the family name as was the case here. Also the honorific as a matter of policy has never been used while issuing coins on other distinguished personalities.

The coin was expected to be available for circulation on August 1, 2007 however it has been now delayed as the inscription is revised and the honorific Ji has been dropped. Reserve Bank of India recalled about 2 million coins with the earlier inscription. The surviving coins with earlier inscription are fetching over US\$ 100.

I think this needs mention. If somebody has noticed the recent numbers of errors in perforation and errors in print appearing on eBay which has actually made lose the shine of errors and perforations. The expected price is sometimes so exorbitant I am not sure if deals also happen.

But the errors if you see are in Miniature sheets where the quality of sheets have deteriorated because of the kind of perforations which is not the normal square or rectangular ones but are skewed at times which causes more for errors. Our dear collectors have to be warned in investing into such things which might not yield the kind of results they should as the numbers are increasing day by day because of poor quality standards maybe.
