## INPEX 2008

The Bulletin 1 of INPEX 2008 India National Philatelic Exhibition containing regulations and entry form for participation was eventually made available on October 25, 2007 at the following web address http://www.tamilnadupost.nic.in/inpex/inpex2008.htm#downloads.

It is a good a thing to hold a national and we support this project in principal. However, this is also an example of how to do something right in a wrong manner. Thus we do have reservations as there are several violations of India Post regulations for philatelic exhibitions and are taking up the matter with organizers to avoid a repeat of 1993 or worse.

INPEX in 1993 was subject of a case still pending in Calcutta High Court where the Honorable High Court ordered the organizers, India Post, to maintain necessary particulars of each participating exhibit including materials brought out from the National Philatelic Museum.

The dates were fixed and the venue was booked for INPEX 2008 several months ago. The next priority as a norm should have been the publication of Bulletin 1 which for some reason was delayed inordinately. Even more strangely the first thing the organizers did was to select and obtain the consent from the Jurors!

INPEX 2008 is being organized by India Post in cooperation with Philatelic Congress of India (PCI) and another local body affiliated with PCI. PCI is leading an almost nonexistent status since the year 2000. PCI is supposed to hold elections every two years but no valid elections have taken place since 2000 and only two Annual General Meetings were held in 2001 and 2004. As per PCI constitution a Governing Council Meeting needs to be held once in every 4 months yet no Governing Council Meetings were held in 2003, 2004, and 2005. While in 2006 it suddenly started holding meetings of Governing Council again. The last Governing Council meeting was held on December 30, 2006 and once again there is no meeting for past 10 months. Therefore we are wondering who had any authority to enter in to an agreement with the organizers. PCI is subject of at least 3 court cases and its survival is in question.

INPEX 2008 is the 7<sup>th</sup> national philatelic exhibition being organized by India Post who had organized a national previously in 1993 at Kolkata. The mess at that exhibition was instrumental for a decision by India Post that it will not organize nationals in future but provide support from outside to philatelic organizations organizing such events. Thereafter India Post supported and recognized CENTIPEX in 1997, MILLEPEX in 2000, EMPIREPEX-INPEX in 2001 as national philatelic exhibitions while it neither supported nor recognized INPEX in 2003, DAK BHARATI in 2004, and SIPAGOLD in 2006 as a national.

Amazingly INPEX 2008 exhibition is being called as the 10<sup>th</sup> national. Even if the 3 nationals recognized by India Post are taken to account it will still only make it the 9<sup>th</sup> national and not the 10th. Interestingly INPEX in 2003 was also called the 10<sup>th</sup> national by its organizers.

Another glaring omission which has been noticed in the Bulleting and which has serious legal ramifications for the organizers is the absence of the ban on display of archives material such as essays proofs etc of India since 1947 at the exhibitions recognized by India Post. It was included in the Regulations of INPEX 1993, and INDEPEX 1997 and INDEPEX-ASIANA 2000 that were world and Asian International events respectively. It has conspicuously been absent from all other exhibitions including CENTIPEX in 1997, MILLEPEX in 2000, EMPIREPEX-INPEX in 2001, INPEX in 2003, DAK BHARATI in 2004, and SIPAGOLD in 2006. And now for the first time it is absent from INPEX 2008 a national organized by India Post

It seems the group of persons we prefer to call 'P Company' are at it again, misleading and misguiding India Post. Organizing a national involves public funds to the tunes of millions and these must be utilized for the benefit of as large number of philatelists as possible and not to serve the cause of personal interests of a handful of persons as unfortunately has been the case on past several occasions. We have refrained from writing about the activities of the 'P Company' for years out of sheer disgust and instead focused in a positive way on Indian philately. Following Meghdoot post cards with advertisement were recently released:

The grand total till date is now 465, with 189 added in 2007 alone.

These are the first Meghdoot Postcards with Mahatma Gandhi motif which was adopted by the Security Printing Press (SPP) Hyderabad with issues of October 2, 2007. Mahatma Gandhi motif was introduced by India Security Press (ISP) Nasik on March 1, 2007. The Meghdoot Postcards are produced by SPP which also produces Single Postcard, Inland Letter Card, and Prepaid Stamped Envelope.

EMIRATES POST TIES UP WITH INDIA POST FOR MONEY TRANSFER United Arab Emirates' Emirates Post and India Post have signed recently in New Delhi a Memorandum of Understanding to enable UAE residents to transfer money to India through India Post's vast postal network.

The MoU was by Salem Al Shaya, Assistant Director General, Operations, Emirates Post and Faiz-Ur-Rehman, Deputy Director General of India Post, during a recent visit of an Emirates Post delegation.

The move is aimed at helping UAE residents send money to relatives by using the secure UPU-approved IFS system that will ensure delivery of money to every corner of India at reasonable rates.

An India Post delegation will be visiting UAE next month to view Emirates Post's facilities and arrangements, including IT systems, before implementing the system.

VODAFONE TIES UP WITH INDIA POST IN KERALA British telecom major Vodafone announced its tie-up with the Indian Post in Kerala on October 23, 2007 to enable its customers to conveniently pay their bills at 337 designated post offices in the state. This will be extended to more post offices in the coming months.

STAMPS ON INDIA: INDIAN RELIGIONS

The Congo Republic issued a postage stamp for World Religion Day on January 20, 2007. The stamp depicts a globe surrounded by the symbols of 11 religions including Hinduism, Jainism, Buddhism, and Sikhism. Across the top it says, in French, "God is the source of all religions."

The World Religion Day, which always falls on the third Sunday in January, is celebrated with interfaith discussions, conferences and other events that foster understanding among the followers of all religions.

World Religion Day was first celebrated in 1950, when the national governing body of the Bahá'í Faith in the United States established it to call attention to the essential oneness of the world's religions and to show that religion is the motivating force for world unity.

Sri Lanka issued a World Religion Day stamp in 1985 that pictured symbols of eight religions. In 1999, Singapore issued a postage stamp that listed the names of nine major religions along with the words "Unity in Diversity" and a tribute to the 50th anniversary of the Inter-Religious Organization of Singapore. The release of the stamp coincided with World Religion Day, although it did not actually carry those words.
