INPEX 08 UPDATE In the previous issue # 215 of November 15, 2007 we had exposed the 'apex' status of PCI. Here is an example of its affect -

Govindarajan A, Senior Superintendent of Post Offices Tambaram Division & on the Allotment Committee of INPEX 08, wrote in an email of November 20, 2007:

"I acknowledge that there was an error in Clause 5.3.4 of the Bulletin 1 released by the Organising Committee of INPEX 2008 (which sounded the 'essentiality of PCI affiliation' of the philately bodies a must..). Now I hereby clarify that the recommendation of any philatelic association/club/society (with or without affiliated to PCI)is necessary for those entries /collection from any Postal Circle where no exhibition has been held for the last 4 years and for those collections which have not participated in any exhibition /not secured any award. Applicants of such entries should also send photo copies of the introductory page and fifteen other important pages from the collection duly signed by the exhibitor".

The last date to submit entries was November 15, 2007 and INPEX 08 has found this blunder five days after!

Still, it is nice to note that they do carry out, although belatedly, the corrections when the wrongs are conveyed to them.

It would be appropriate to say to the organizers of INPEX 08 that there are a lot of corrections still needed to be carried out and they should get prepared to implement them for the promotion of philately in India.

MAHATMA GANDHI MS PACK

A special pack was recently brought out to commemorate International Non-Violence Day. The pack contains the miniature sheet issued to mark the centenary of Satyagraha and was produced in the quantity of 200.

NATIONAL PHILATELIC MUSEUM

The National Philatelic Museum has been closed for indefinite period from October 16, 2007 as it is being relocated to another site in the same compound.

GANDHI ASHRAM'S SPECIAL POSTMARK

Gujarat Philatelists' Association, Ahmedabad (GPA) decided to commemorate the first International Non Violence Day on October 2, 2007 by creating 350 individually numbered covers mailed and delivered from Gandhi Ashram Post Office in Ahmedabad. The Gujarat Circle of India Post responded enthusiastically and the Gandhi Ashram Post Office was suitably instructed to open on a postal holiday for this purpose. A special pictorial postmark was used on these covers. The computerized receipt for booking an article also carried 'International Day-Non Violence' in place of usual 'have a nice day'. The chief postmaster Ahmedabad GPO was also instructed to arrange the supply of new Gandhi stamps which were being issued that day for use on these covers. All the charges regarding the cover, stamps, postmark, and mailing through Speed Post were borne by GPA.

The official confirmation letter by the Gujarat Circle of India Post to GPA clearly stated that no other covers except GPA covers should be entertained for booking or servicing with the special postmark. Accordingly Gandhi Ashram Post Office after booking and duly servicing with special and delivery postmarks handed these 350 covers over to the GPA. Many members of GPA were present on this occasion along with philatelists from other parts of India including Arun Bhattacharya and C R Andhare.

However, the GPA has learnt that items with the special postmark of Gandhi Ashram Post Office of October 2, 2007 other than 350 Speed Post covers are in circulation. GPA questions the authenticity of these items. Are these items fake, reprints, or some 'philatelists' have obtained these by misleading India Post?

GPA requests the philatelic community to be vigilant of all items of dubious origins.

POST OFFICES TO DISTRIBUTE COINS

Delhi Circle of India Post has entered into an arrangement with Reserve Bank of India for distribution of coins and exchange of soiled notes through selected Post Offices located in New Delhi HO (Gol Dak Khana, New Delhi 110001), Delhi GPO (Kashmere Gate, Delhi 110006), Lodi Road HO (Lodi Road, New Delhi 110003), Ramesh Nagar HO (Ramesh Nagar, New Delhi 110015) and Krishna Nagar HO (Krishna Nagar, Delhi 110051).

BUY TRADE FAIR TICKETS AT POST OFFICES 35 selected post offices in Delhi are selling entry tickets for 27th India International Trade Fair being held from November 14 to 27, 2007. The tickets are also being sold at Bus Depots, Metro Stations, and Milk Booths of Mother Dairy. The tickets are priced at Rs 20 and 10 for adult and child respectively for weekdays; and Rs 50 and 20 on weekends and holidays. These prices are Rs 5 cheaper than those sold at the venue - Pragati Maidan.

STAMPS ON INDIA: CANADA'S WORLD RELIGION DAY - A STAMP THAT WASN'T Issue #312 of October 25, 2007 covered the details of the stamp to mark the World Religion Day by Congo issued on January 20, 2007. Sometime after the issue of the stamp by Congo, there was news about issue of a stamp on the World Religion Day by Canada. The news was accompanied by a picture of the stamp as well. Soon thereafter it was realized that it wasn't true and the story was pulled out of circulation.

The story however has resurfaced recently in India and this is to put the facts on record that the stamp was not issued. However the design of the purported stamp was so beautiful that it is a shame that it isn't real. See it for yourself at

ANIL DHIR, Bhubaneswar I have noticed a very morbid aspect of the miniature sheet of the Children's Day issue of 2007.

The miniature sheet is bordered in black, which is traditionally an attribute prescribed for mourning. Postal history is replete with many instances of issues of mourning covers and stamps, all being black bordered.

In fact I have a collection of mourning covers and stamps from across the world from pre Victorian times to the present day. Mourning covers can be briefly defined as black edged posted letters used in many countries especially during the 19th and early 20th centuries. These covers brought only bad news- relating to the death of a family member, friend or associate. During the heyday of these mourning covers, people generally used them in four situations: to announce a death, as a notification of the time and place of a funeral, to send or acknowledge messages of condolence and as a general correspondence for a reasonable time (usually one year) after a family member's death.

Mourning Stamps were issued as a commemoration of the death anniversary of statesmen, royalty and public figures. There are many cases where the regular stamps portraying the personality were overprinted with a black border after his death.

Why has India Post issued a black bordered Miniature sheet on the occasion of Pandit Nehru's birthday, more so when the day is celebrated as Children's Day? Maybe this error is intentional, or some divine intervention, through which the miniature sheet is mourning the state of the millions of poor and deprived children of our nation for whom Children's Day holds no meaning. Irony cannot get more ironic. If this is it, then kudos to India Post for a correct and appropriate presentation of the state of the nation's young.

INDIAN POSTAL GUIDE 1869
