NEW STAMPS RELEASED

Pratibha Devisingh Patil, the President of India, released a set of 4 stamps and a miniature sheet on renewable energy to mark the Silver Jubilee of the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy on November 22, 2007 at New Delhi. The stamps in the denomination of Rs 5 each depict Solar Energy, Wind energy, Small Hydropower, and Biomass Energy.

Sankha Samanta designed the Stamps and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. India Security Press, Nasik printed the stamp by photogravure in the quantity of 0.8 million. The miniature sheet is printed in the quantity of 0.2 million.

FIRST BATTALION 4^{TH} GORKHA RIFLES India Post released a postage stamp in the denomination of Rs 5 to commemorate 150 years of the raising of the first battalion of the 4^{th} Gorkha Rifles on November 27, 2007.

The 33 Extra Gorkha Regiment was raised in 1857 at Pithoragarh. The first three battalions of Gorkhas were raised soon after the war with Nepal in 1817. It became the 4th Gorkha Rifles of the Bengal Infantry

and after the Coronation Durbar at Delhi, became the Prince of Wales' Own 4th Gorkhas. After Indian independence, the designation changed to the present one.

It operated in the Lushai hills in 1871, in China in 1900, and in Europe and Mesopotamia during the Great World War (World War I). There were four battalions of the Regiment during World War I. One of the battalions formed part of the Chindits under Wingate. The third battalion fought a fine action at Bilafond La, at heights of nearly 20,000 feet in 1987. Major Jackson in his book on the British Indian Army has called Fourth Gorkhas as the most traveled in the Indian Army. North Bengal and Sikkim Region of India Post released a stamp booklet with the theme 1857: The First War of Independence on November 27, 2007 during the Philatelic Festival at Siliguri. Noted philatelist S K Biswas has designed this stamp booklet.

GAURAV DALAL IS NO MORE

Gaurav Dalal one of the most active philatelists from Ahmedabad died on November 25, 2007. He was 42. He felt chest pain and drove to the hospital and died there due to a massive heart attack. In his untimely death Indian philately lost a devoted philatelist.

He was very friendly in nature. He was quite involved with the issue and promotion of special covers and postmarks. He will be missed by friends and family.

30TH ASIAN PACIFIC POSTAL UNION, EXECUTIVE COUNCIL MEETING A Raja, Minister of Communications and Information Technology inaugurated the 30th Asian Pacific Postal Union, Executive Council (APPU-EC) Meeting at New Delhi on November 27, 2007. More than 150 foreign delegates from 29 countries are participating in the five day Meeting from November 27 to December 1, 2007 with an aim to exchange views and discuss matters of mutual interest so as to strengthen cooperation amongst postal administrations and postal service providers in the Asia-Pacific region.

This is the third time India Post is hosting an APPU-EC meeting. India Post earlier hosted this meeting in the years 1980 and 1992. The APPU is an inter-governmental organization of 30 postal administrations of the countries of Asian-Pacific region founded in the year 1962. India became a member in the year 1973. APPU is affiliated to the Universal Postal Union, which is a specialized agency of the United Nations. The purpose of the APPU is to extend, facilitate and improve postal relations between member countries and to promote cooperation in the field of postal services.

FRANCHISING OF SERVICES OF POST OFFICE Dr. Shakeel Ahmad, Minister of State for Ministry of Communications and Information Technology gave the following information in the Rajya Sabha (Upper House of Indian Parliament) on November 22, 2007 in a written reply to a question by Supriya Sule.

Department of Posts has not decided to franchise its services to private players. The scheme of Franchisee Outlets launched by the Department and operated through individual Franchisees, in specified urban areas, aims at creating additional points of access to the postal network and provides counter services like sale of stamps and stationery, booking of registered/Speed Post articles, collection of bill payments, booking of money orders, etc. The Franchisee outlets are functioning like extension counters of Departmental Post Offices and after booking of articles, collection of payments of bills from public, the same are sent to the linked departmental post office for further transmission, etc. The delivery and transmission of mails and savings bank work (other than cheque collection) etc. has not been franchised.

At present 13 Franchisee Outlets are functioning in Maharashtra State.

Franchisee Scheme has been launched only in specified urban locations. The scheme has not been launched in rural areas. There is no proposal to open Franchisee Outlets in rural areas.

MODERNISATION OF POSTAL DEPARTMENT Dr Shakeel Ahmad, Minister of State for Ministry of Communications and Information Technology gave the following information in the Lok Sabha (Lower House of Indian Parliament) on November 26, 2007 in a written reply to a question by Kashiram Rana and Sangeeta Kumari Singh Deo.

In the Eleventh Plan the Department of Posts has submitted a proposal to the Planning Commission for computerization of 17598 Departmental Post Offices and 64,000 Branch Post Offices and network all computerized offices; provide Automatic Mail Processing Centres; Provide Remotely managed Franking Machines and Cash Counting Machines and provide anywhere anytime banking.

Following steps have been taken by the Department to enhance the revenue earning ability of the organization: Business Development and Marketing Directorate has been set up in the Department of Posts. It aims at developing new products and services and aims to make Department of Posts a customer oriented organization with business approach; A number of business products like Speed Post, Express Parcel Post and Business Post have been introduced; Value additions like collection from customer premises, credit facility, volume based discounts, door to door delivery, online track and trace system, premailing services etc. have been introduced; Retail network of the Department of Post has been leveraged for providing new services and generating additional revenue and The department has taken initiatives to work out various business alliances and partnership with public and private corporations for leveraging the postal network in rural as well as urban areas.
