A private first day cover of 1948 Mahatma Gandhi issue sold for a record US\$ 2717 that is Rs 109,000, at ebay.com on March 23, 2008. It was won by an Indian bidder. The cover by cachet-maker Advani is commonly referred to as mourning cover being printed in black. There were 6 bidders competing for it. The cover was registered from Bombay GPO and addressed to Tanganyika with delivery markings on the back. The unusual destination contributed in achieving the record price.

When I read about the poor show at the exhibitions, I feel that Philately in India is in very low profile.

Please do something about this.

In response to the letters of the participants of Inpex 2008 published in previous issues of this newsletter one can easily conclude that the participants are too close observers and have sound philatelic knowledge. Their views cannot be ignored at any cost. Winning a gold in exhibitions does not mean that the person is an authority in philately. It is their tag that has given them the position of jury.

In my opinion there should also be a panel of general philatelists who give points to exhibits secretly and on the basis of average marks given by jury and the panel of general philatelists the final result should be declared. The general philatelists too should have the right of voting in certain classes like one frame or thematics in which large number of entries are sent by the exhibitors. At least 30% marks should be in hands of general philatelists. This may be a solution to give satisfactory result at the exhibitions to some extent.

Mr. Rajesh Verma should have elaborated the "Flag and Map mentality of the jury members" as some readers might have not understood the meaning of this line. But those participating in exhibitions since a long time have well understood its meaning and sense and must have enjoyed the content.

Now after reading lot of comments I have come to the conclusion that we should find the way out of this existing situation at all level of exhibitions. There is a big need of some senior as well as young philatelists and the philatelic societies to come forward in this regard and join hands with each other and send representation through proper channel to the Philately Section of India Post against the irregularity prevailing at the exhibitions. India Post is the highest authority responsible for holding and managing exhibitions. So it is necessary that the real facts must come to the notice of concerned officers of Philately section. Mere discussion on the problem is not a way out to curb the present situation of philately in India.

It's also a fact that officers concerned of philatelic section of India Post are not philatelists, they are simply administrators. Many of them are ignorant about the basics of philately. The detailed report must be sent to them for clear understanding about the exhibitions. After all we the philatelists make the Postal Department to earn a big amount of money through purchase and publicity of philatelic items. We must send our representation to it for the betterment of Indian Philately.
