NEW STAMPS RELEASED

India Post released a set of 2 se-tenant stamps, in the denominations of Rs 5 and Rs 15, to mark the 30^{th} Anniversary of Aga Khan Foundation on May 17, 2008.

A miniature sheet was to accompany the issue but even after a week of the issue date, it has not been on sale in any post office in the country although a pack for it also has been issued by India Post.

The Aga Khan Foundation is a non-denominational, international development agency established in 1967 by His Highness the Aga Khan. Its mission is to develop and promote creative solutions to problems that impede social development, primarily in Asia and East Africa. Created as a private, non-profit foundation under Swiss law, it has branches and independent affiliates in 15 countries namely Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Canada, India, Kenya, the Kyrgyz Republic, Mozambique, Pakistan, Portugal, Switzerland, Syria, Tajikistan, Tanzania, Uganda, the United Kingdom, and the United States of America.

The Foundation focuses on a small number of specific development problems by forming intellectual and financial partnerships with organizations sharing its objectives. Most Foundation grants are made to grassroots organizations testing innovative approaches in the field.

The Foundation looks for innovative approaches to generic problems. Projects are designed to be learning experiences that contribute to the understanding of complex issues and identify solutions that can be adapted to conditions in many different regions. Replicability is essential to the creation of useful models. Wherever appropriate, approaches are tested in urban as well as rural settings, and in different cultures and geographic environments.

In every undertaking, the goals are essentially the same: To make it possible for poor people to act in ways that will lead to long-term improvements in their income and health, in the environment and in the education of their children. To provide communities with a greater range of choices and the understanding necessary to take informed action. To enable beneficiaries to gain the confidence and competence to participate in the design, implementation and continuing operation of activities that affect the quality of their lives. To put institutional, management and financial structures in place to ensure that program activities are sustainable without Foundation assistance within a reasonable time-frame.

The golden jubilee of the `Imamat of Prince Karim Aga Khan' is also being celebrated this year.

Brahm Prakash designed the Stamps and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. India Security Press, Nasik printed the stamps by photogravure in the quantities of 8 million each and 0.2 million miniature sheets.

STAMP THEFT ALERT

The car of Dr Ritvik Amarchand, PhD Scholar at the Center for Community Medicine, All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), New Delhi was stolen on the morning of May 19, 2008 from the AIIMS premises. In addition to things related his PhD, Dr Ritvik lost a bag full of stamps as he is an active and enthusiastic philatelist.

The stamps in the bag included 3 1948 Gandhi stamps one hinged two unhinged, hinged stamps from 1946-1954 plus some, and a big stock of 1949 definitives. Also a good stock of stamps from 1996-2000. Additionally there were stamps worth 200 GBP face from current issues of GB.

It is expected that the thieves might try to sell the same to a local philatelist. Some stamps can be identified with Dr Ritvik's ebay listing 180243217395.

I wonder whether any of the other collectors are as furious as I am about the continuing stream of premature issues. Once is an accident, but if it gets repeated again & again, either it is intentional or there is a scam going on. Within the past 3 months, I am shocked to note (from stamps of India website) that three stamps have been released prematurely. Why has this become a continuing process? I am sure someone is making a lot of money by this scam. I am sure there is a stamp mafia like the land mafia, with involvement of the concerned post office, some dealers and big business people. I cannot think ther is any political involvement in this matter

Doesn't the post office or the Post Master General have any control of this? Is it not punishable as those involving money? Sometime back I had written a personal letter on the official Indian posta site but had no response to it. Can't you with your influence do something more about this? Can all the philatelists join together and send a sort of petition?

From my experience as a member of Cochin & Trivandrum philatelic bureaus, I cannot understand how such a thing can happen in the post offices which keep prematurely releasing stamps! In our bureaus, stamps arrive 'prematurely' but sometimes even on the day of release, they do not issue the stamps if the relevant 'papers' are not received, which is going to the other extreme.

I hope someone will come out with a solution.

I am very much delighted to receive the recent issue from Tel Aviv as it was expected that the issue will be delayed due to exhibition at Israel. It was really a pleasure when the newsletter suddenly appeared in the mailbox. Through this esteemed column I also want to draw attention towards Indian premature issues as well as special covers issued by private organizations and philatelic clubs during the philatelic exhibitions and special events. The premature issues have caused hazard to Indian Philately. It has hit like a strong virus as every month we are coming across to new premature issues. Philatelic material is highly confidential item before it is officially issued by the Department of Posts. How this material comes out in the hands of general public. There is no doubt that it comes through the staff of postal department itself. It must be noticed that such things happen at philatelically active places only. One may not hear of leaking out such material at remote places. This shows that there is some mismanagement at philatelic bureaus and malpractice involved between postal staff and philatelic dealers. Now the postal staff is also well aware of the high cost of premature issue items. It is a big question mark on the working

of India post. The high officials of the department must have to be vigilant and strict to check such malpractices in future.

Another important matter these days is the issue of special covers by private organizations and philatelic clubs of different sizes during philatelic exhibitions and special events. Sometimes the postmark is not actually given by the postal department but it is created by other means like printing which is against the rules. Recently a thought provoking article on "Rules for special Covers" by Ajit Kumar Dash was published in different Philatelic periodicals and newsletters which has specified the special rules and regulations for the issue of special covers. But recently I came across different special covers issued during the exhibitions which do not follow the rules. India Post must approve the size and design of the cover and Postmark on its own terms and conditions before these are finally printed by the organizations to check this prevailing practice in issue of these special covers. India Post must reject the covers which are not prepared according to its standards. It seems that the design of the cover and cancellation is not approved under proper supervision of the philatelic officer. If it was done it would have not happened frequently.

I am amazed by the keen observation and deep interest shown by the philatelists like Mr. Anil Dhir and Sri Premnath Kudva in pointing out the location and other postal features shown in Vodaphone Advertisement recently being shown on TV.
