NEW STAMPS RELEASED

India Post released a commemorative postage stamp in the denomination of Rs 5 in honor of saint Sai Baba on May 20, 2008.

Sai Baba's early life was enshrouded in mystery. It is stated that he was born of Brahmin parents in the Nizam's State. In infancy he was supposed to have been deserted by his parents. Sai Baba first came to Shirdi, when he was a lad of 16, and lived there for four years. Then suddenly he disappeared and after many years returned to Shirdi in 1859. Sai Baba taught only through a medium of the spoken words in the pattern of our ancient sages. His teachings and life have captured the imagination of the people in India and abroad as well. On October 15, 1918 he passed away breaking forever the barriers of existence and left behind a rich heritage of enlightened followers.

C R Pakrashi designed the Stamps and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. India Security Press, Nasik printed the stamps by photogravure in the quantities of 0.4 million.

27TH INDIAN ANTARCTIC EXPEDITION

The 27th Indian Scientific Expedition to Antarctica returns back on April 11, 2008 having left Antarctica in the early hours of March 10, 2008. The covers mailed from the branch post office operating at the Maitri, the Indian base at Antarctica were carried with the returning team.

The total team strength of this expedition under the overall coordination and supervision of the National Centre for Antarctic & Ocean Research (NCAOR), Goa was 66 members comprising scientists, engineers, doctors and logistic support personnel. The expedition members traveled in four batches by two different modes- by air and by ship- based on the operational requirements.

First three groups flew all the way to Antarctica via Mumbai, Johannesburg and Cape Town in South Africa from Dabolim Airport in Goa. Their passage from Goa to Mumbai was by Air India; Mumbai to Cape Town by South African Airways and from Cape Town to Maitri, Antarctica by a chartered flight operated under Dronning Maud Land Air Network (DROMLAN) agreement.

The first contingent of the XXVII Indian Scientific Expedition comprising 6 persons departed from Goa on October 30, 2007 and reached Maitri, Antarctica in the early hours of November 3, 2007. The second contingent of 4 personnel left Goa on Sunday, November 4, 2007 and reached Antarctica in the afternoon on November 8, 2007. The third contingent of 16 members left Goa on November 11, 2007 and reached Antarctica on November 15, 2007, early in the morning.

The fourth contingent, comprising 33 members led by Arun Chaturvedi, the leader of the Expedition was flagged off by Dr P S Goel, Secretary Government of India, Ministry of Earth Sciences, on December 5, 2007. The chartered vessel MV Emerald Sea sailed off from Mormugao port at 13:45 IST on December 6, 2007. The expedition team was joined by two members and three helicopters with their pilots at Cape Town, South Africa.

The team is composed of institutes represented by Indian Institute of Geomagnetism, National Centre for Antarctic & Ocean Research, Geological Survey of India, National Geophysical Research Institute, National Physical Laboratory, Survey of India, Centre for Space Physics, Zoological Survey of India, India Meteorological Department, All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Snow and Avalanche Study Establishment, Indian Navy, Naval Hydrographic Office, Border Road Organisation, Indo-Tibetan Border Police, Defence Electronics Application Laboratory, Electronics Corporation of India Ltd., Shriram Institute for Industrial Research, Universities of Awadh, Barkatullah, Shanti Niketan etc.

This expedition undertook specific scientific tasks at Larsemann Hills region, the site of the proposed new Indian research base as well as in central Dronning Maud Land where India has its permanent research base "Maitri" at Schirmacher Oasis region. To facilitate real time data transfer an Earth Station at Maitri has been installed. This would give direct access to the data on real time basis as also the scientific community would be able to stay connected with the happenings back home in India.

More than 450 sheets will be displayed in this exhibition in thirty unconventional frames.

The exhibition is being organized to celebrate the Birth Centenary of Legendary Bengali Actress and co-founder of The Bombay Talkies Ltd. DEVIKA RANI. On May 31 at 6.30 pm the film 'Achhut Kanya' starring Devika Rani and Ashok Kumar will be shown.

The organizers applied for bringing out a Special Cover on Devika Rani, but the 'competent authority' of the West Bengal Circle of India Post regretted it without assigning any reasons. However the organizers will bring out a Stamp Booklet.

WADP ROUND TABLE

Avi Hochman, President and the CEO of Israel Post and Louis Virgile, Chairman of the Round table of the World Association for the Development of Philately opened the Round Table on May 18, 2008 at Tel Aviv, Israel.

The focus of the Round Table was 'The Importance of the Innovation in Philately'. Te representative of the postal administrations of France, Switzerland, and Israel, and of security printers Cartor and Enschede gave interesting presentations on the subject.

Jean-Francois Logette, Philately & IRC Program Manager, International Bureau of the Universal Postal Union (UPU) presented a review of activities undertaken since $23^{\rm rd}$ UPU Congress, survey results of World Numbering System (WNS), and resolution drafts for consideration at $24^{\rm th}$ UPU Congress.

There are 225 stamp issuing authorities from 191 UPU members. 184 stamp issuing authorities have already joined WNS and 5 more are expected to join it shortly. The WNS lists 230 stamp printers worldwide.

There will be a competitive class for postal administrations at world philatelic exhibitions and International Philatelic Federation has agreed to introduce the same at next world show at Bucharest in June 2008. This class will be judged by 4 judges, 2 from UPU and 2 from FIP.

The resolution drafts for consideration at $24^{\rm th}$ UPU Congress at Geneva, Switzerland in July 2008 pertain to development of philately, philatelic code of ethics, and defining the status of stamp to keep pace with the developments. UPU is going to ask its members to provide legal framework for personalized stamps.

Dr Balzs Bodai who was instrumental in getting the law changed in the USA to enable the postal service to issue charity stamp for the breast cancer was a special invitee to the Round Table. Dr Bodai after the unprecedented success of the US stamp has taken his mission global and has successfully persuaded 8 postal administrations to issue stamp for this noble cause. He presented the case for issuing a stamp for breast cancer to enhance public awareness and to raise funds for research to fight the dreaded disease.

The Round Table was attended by the representatives of WADP partners, International Association of Philatelic Journalists (AIJP), International Federation of Stamp Dealer Associations (IFSDA), International Association of Security Printers (InterGraf), UPU and about 20 postal administrations. The FIP and International Association of Philatelic Publishers (ASCAT) were not represented in this Round Table.

IRC DESIGN COMPETITION

The International Bureau of the Universal Postal Union (UPU) is organizing a design competition for the next International Reply Coupon (IRC) due to go on sale in 2009. The IRC currently in circulation will expire on December 31, 2008 and need to be replaced. The theme chosen for this competition is "The Postage Stamp - A Vehicle for Exchange".

The last date to submit a design by the participating postal administrations is June 15, 2008. The heads of delegations of UPU members present at the $24^{\rm th}$ UPU Congress will form the international jury for selecting the design for the next IRC. The winning postal administration will receive free of charge 10,000 of the new IRC.

Several Indian Dealers are seen indulging in getting personalized stamps in the name of Gandhi and selling at exorbitant prices. Why are we in for such doomed philately?

I am not writing something new about Pre mature issues of Indian Commemorative since this is there in our Postal Philatelic Division since ages. The editors of this news letter have several times mentioned on this and it seems the India Post is not bothered to take effective steps to prevent and failed to take action against the offenders. These premature issues on philatelic point of view may look good if happen once in blue moon but now a days every issue which reaches certain postal circles are released before the issue dates, some times 2 to 3 months before - example the issues of Jasmine, Coast Guard etc. Another interesting aspect is that the errors on these issues are also coming into the market comfortably. Why India Post is not taking effective steps to stop this unethical practices performed by their staff in spite of making them know the facts through this media? Are they hand in glove with the offenders? For the sake of promotion of Indian philately the philatelists and dealers should come

forward to discourage this practice not buying or selling these items and should inform the name of the person/s who handle these items to Department of Post for necessary action.

Philatelic bureaus had been opened and are still being opened at places to serve the philatelic community at local level mainly and to promote Indian philately in general but again at local level. As many as 54 philatelic bureaus are opened so far along with philatelic counters all around in India.

The basic functioning of the bureau is to provide Indian philatelic material to the philatelists such as stamps, S/s, M/s, FDC's., cancellations etc. primarily to their members as well as to other local genuine philatelists. Department has its motto to promote philately at first and then the sale of stamps too to earn revenue also. But of late, it is seen that department has changed its motto i.e. to supply material to the Philatelic Dealers who then do a sought of BLACK MARKETING of the philatelic material as they either store it for some time or sell it to their overseas clients at premium. This temporary storage creates an atmosphere of desperation and then prepares Indian buyers to buy at much much higher price. Here the main thing to be noted is that even the members having account in bureau are deprived of the delivery of such material. Now this happens as dealers and the dealing clerk at bureau have their connivance/setting. I have seen dealers sending their persons to far off places to buy the material on the date of issue or just after that.

Several account holders are buying material at premium from outside as either the material is not sent, and if sent, it is sent quite late that too in damaged/bad condition.

A problem of premature issues is also a good setting by the department and the dealers which certainly deprive the genuine philatelist from its delivery and further cost much higher when bought from outside. Also sometimes the delivery is not made with a plea that relevant order not reaching them. All in all, so many excuses are there to help the dealers or to harass the philatelists.

Even the internal set ups of the bureau is not convincing, lack of sitting space and space for display. The bureau should have enough good sitting arrangements for the philatelists, should have sufficient material for display, information board for the recent development, good cheerful person available all the time not only to give material but to entertain/handle the visitors properly. But leaving aside a few, most of the bureaus lack all this.

In Bilaspur Chhatisgarh, the bureau person handles 3/4 job sitting there only on the same table where files are spread, the bureau is never found cleaned up as one can found thick dust spread all over even on the so called sofas kept there, one could see a temporary canteen too inside with heater, cups, plates etc. kept and most importantly the harsh look and the non co-operative behavior of the dealing clerk (Only with the genuine philatelists and not dealers). Further, may be the bureau has never sent material to the account holder and the initial money deposited is still with them.

Either the department should close this concept which does not promote philately at all or should look in to the matter seriously. Some people might say, this can be sorted out locally but no because the dealer network is so badly spread that a strong collective action at Directorate level will only help.

I call for comments and views from the reader's and look forward for a strong step from Mr. Jhingan $\,$
