INDIA CHINA JOINT ISSUE

China will issue a set of 2 stamps on June 6, 2008 of China India Joint Issue. The issue first appeared on China's new issue program for 2006 and was postponed to 2007 and then to April 20, 2008 as reported in Issue # 320 of December 20, 2007 of this digital weekly. India Post has not yet announced a date of issue of its stamps.

The stamps in the denomination of 1.20 Yuan will feature China's White Horse Temple and India's Mahabodhi Temple. White Horse Temple was the first Buddhist temple in China, established under the patronage of Emperor Ming in the Eastern Han capital Luoyang in the year 68. It is believed that in the year 64 of the Eastern Han Dynasty (25-220), Emperor Ming sent a delegation of his men to study Buddhism in the western world. After three years two eminent Indian monks, She Moteng and Zhu Falan came back with the delegation. They brought with them a white horse carrying Buddhist sutras and Buddhist figures on its back. It was the first time, Buddhism appeared in China. The emperor built a monastery as an act of thanks to the two monks.

The Mahabodhi Temple is a Buddhist temple in Bodh Gaya, the location where Siddhartha Gautama, the Buddha, attained enlightenment. Bodh Gaya is located about 96 km (60 miles) from Patna, Bihar state, India. Next to the temple, to its western side, is the holy Bodhi tree. In the Pali Canon, the site is called Bodhimanda, and the monastery there the Bodhimanda Vihara.

NEW SPEED POST AND INSURED POST ENVELOPES

India Post launched customized protective envelopes for Speed Post and Insured Post on May 30, 2008 at New Delhi. The envelopes are in 2 sizes each for Speed Post and Insured Post and costs Rs 5 & Rs 8 and Rs 8 and Rs 10 respectively. These envelopes offering enhanced security and protection to the contents enclosed will soon be available to the customers in various Post Offices and Speed Post Centers across the country.

These envelopes are made of an innovative material, DuPont's Tyvek, with product qualities like water, tear, and abrasion-resistance, soft and smooth texture for excellent printability, environment-friendly and light-weight. The new Insured Post envelope with customized tamper-evident features is a very good option for sending secured consignments.

NEW FRANKING MACHINES

India Post introduced two models of Remotely Managed Franking System Machines, one each from Neopost and Piney Bowes on May 21, 2008 at New Delhi. Forbes, another manufacturer is also planning to introduce its franking machine very shortly. These machines have been fully tested as per the laid down specifications and cleared by the Electronic Testing Machinery under the Department of Information Technology. This new generation digitally operated franking system, on which these machines are based, has been appropriately named "Digi Frank Plus".

These new franking machines will use digitally controlled inkjet printing technology and will print a clear, clean, dynamically bar-coded secure frank that may even be used to offer track and trace by the India Post.

RMFS primarily means that the franking machines based on this system would not be required to be physically carried to the post office for crediting. The network that India Post is setting up with the help of the franking machine manufacturers, will enable the new technology

franking machine user to remotely credit his machine through dial up or any other network while sitting in his office.

The system involves setting up of Remote Resetting Centers by the Original Equipment Manufacturers (OEMs). India Post will set up their own Center for electronically receiving fund deposit instructions from the State Bank of India, which is the designated bank for receiving payments for the franking machine credits. The franking machine users will deposit funds through cash, cheque, draft, internet banking in any branch of the State Bank of India across the country. The bank will pass on the details to the India Post Server which will authenticate the transactions and pass the necessary instructions to the OEM's Remote Servers. The users will simply connect their machines to the OEM's server through a telephone line and download the required funds from their accounts maintained at the Remote servers. The complete transaction will take between 60-90 seconds only. The entire transactions are managed electronically, involving no manual intervention. It is fast, it is convenient and it is absolutely secure.

BUS, RAIL & AIR TICKETS AT POST OFFICES

Indira Krishnakumar, the Principal Chief Post Master General of Tamil Nadu Circle of India Post launched the sale of bus, rail, and air tickets at post offices on May 26, 2008. Tamil Nadu Circle has tied up with a private ticketing service, ARM i-Solutions, for this service being launched as a pilot project. The service will initially be available at 27 post offices in Chennai region and 10 post offices in Tiruchirapalli region before expanding it to Coimbatore and Madurai regions. Soon, hotel bookings and car rentals will also be provided by these post offices.

It has been more than five months to Inpex-2008. We had lot of opinions, reactions and sometimes over-reactions on judging of the exhibition. But as it is said that time is in itself the cure of all woes. We are able to forget our deepest disappointments, failures losses and frustrations as the time passes. It is good that many of us have forgotten their bitter experience. Now I am not going to provoke or repeat what has already been discussed in this esteemed column. But through this column I humbly request the members of Jury who read this column, to give their opinion too on the difficulties they face at the time of judging.

It's a fact what we assumed the basic cause of dissatisfaction among the participants on judging was due to insufficient time given to the judges to evaluate large number of exhibits and the number of judges was quite less than the required number of judges to evaluate several groups of exhibits. Now it is their turn to give their opinion if the existing system imposed by India Post with the kind advice of some senior philatelists, is correct or it needs to be moderated? What they think?

No member of Jury replied to either personal letters sent to them by participants nor did they ever try to express their views through any

of the philatelic publications. It's a healthy discussion not a rivalry fight between the exhibitor and a judge. The judges' opinion will certainly give a satisfactory answer to the exhibitors. The misunderstanding between the two will be solved to some extent.
