STAMP WATCH

MADHUBALA SHEETLET - The correct picture of the availability of this issue can been seen now more clearly. The market has around 12 to 16000 sheetlets after the philatelic bureau has separated the blocks of four from the sheetlets - thus destroying around 14000 sheetlets. The availability of this sheetlet may become scarcer and the price for this sheetlet may surpass the previous records created by other sheetlets. The market gossip is the investors will be sitting tight on this issue. Even at the present price this sheetlet is a good buy due the technicalities involved.

Sai Baba continues to rule the market - if the Department of Posts delivered the requisite quantities to the Sai Baba Trust the available quantity in the market may come down sharply and the price may shoot up.

Do not ignore the high values of 1973-77 and sets of 1989-95. The other miniature sheets waiting in sideline to join the difficult-to-get team of first 6 miniature sheets, are Mother Teresa, Asiana/Indipex, Snakes, and Waterfalls. Watch and buy before the price goes up.

LARSEN STAMP RELEASED

The Minister for Communication & Information Technology, A Raja released a commemorative postage stamp in honor of the co-founder of

the Larsen & Toubro, Henning Holck-Larsen on June 12, 2008 at New Delhi.

Henning Holck-Larsen was from Denmark who co-founded the Indian engineering firm Larsen & Toubro (L&T).

Henning Holck-Larsen was educated at the University of Copenhagen. He came to India in 1937. In 1938, he set up Larsen & Toubro in partnership with his former schoolmate Søren Kristian Toubro. L&T went on to become one of the most successful Indian companies. After retirement, he served as the chairman emeritus of the company. He used to call India his "adopted homeland" and divided his time between Denmark and India.

He was honored with Ramon Magsaysay Award for International Understanding (1976), Knighthood from Queen Margarethe II of Denmark (1977), Sir Jehangir Ghandy Medal for Industrial Peace (1980), Chemtech Foundation's Chemical Industry Stalwart Award (2000), Bombay Management Association's Lifetime Achievement Award (2001), Citation from the Indo-European Union Business Summit for promoting business beyond boundaries (2002), and Padma Bhushan (2002) for contribution to Indian industry.

He passed away in 2003 at Mumbai after a brief illness.

Sankha Samanata designed the Stamps and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs2 each. Security Printing Press, Hyderabad printed the stamps by wet offset in the quantities of 2.4 million in Sheetlets of 16.

Sahadeva Sahoo, India's national commissioner to EFIRO 2008 world philatelic exhibition at Bucharest, Romania from June 30 to 28, 2008 succeeded in obtaining the necessary permissions for participating exhibits from India.

The High Court of Orissa had given directions to the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) to issue the Temporary Export Permit in its order of June 12 2008. ASI convened a meeting of National Screening & Evaluation Committee on June 17, 2008 which approved the exhibits enabling ASI to issue the necessary permit.
