OLYMPEX 2008

Olympic Expo Beijing 2008, Olympex 2008, is jointly sponsored by the International Olympic Committee (IOC), the Beijing Organizing Committee for the Games of the XXIX Olympiad (BOCOG), the Chinese Olympic Committee (COC), and China Post Group. Olympex, organized by China Post Group, will be held in Beijing Exhibition Center from August 8 to 18, 2008. The show aims to display Olympic history and development and promote Olympic spirit and culture with "Inheriting Olympic Spirit, Inspiring Beijing City" as its theme.

The success of the first modern Olympics Games in 1896 attributed to the fund-raising by issuing stamp. IOC decided to call this exhibition Olympex from Beijing Olympic Games 2008 in order to promote Olympic spirit, spread Olympic concept and carry Olympic culture forward.

As the first Olympex, Olympic Expo Beijing 2008 extends the tradition of the Olympic Philatelic Exhibition from collecting diversified Olympic related stamp products to treasures, souvenirs, arts and crafts. Olympex also integrates Olympic culture and collection significance involving three sections: exhibition, promotion, and special activities. The visitors will be really impressed by IOC Museum and former IOC President Juan Antonio Samaranch's personal collections and understand more deeply Olympic value of "Friendship, Respect, Excellence" and the Olympic spirit of "Faster, Higher, Stronger". As a platform for international cultural exchange, Olympex 2008 will be a showcase of the three concepts-"Green Olympics, High-tech Olympics and People's Olympics", and give the world an opportunity to experience the charm of Olympic Games and the profound and far-reaching influence of the Olympic culture. PHILATELIC EXHIBITS ONLINE

The ExpoNet http://www.exponet.info at present has 387 philatelic exhibits from 37 countries online. The Exponet has now decided to provide links to 151 online philatelic exhibits that are hosted elsewhere and thus becomes a guide to almost all exhibits online.

There are many reasons for an exhibit being not added on EXPONET such as: the owner wants to show it by himself, the exhibit is owned by a fellowship where the owners have decided not to connect it to another website or to a person they don't know, unable to obtain permission from its owner or couldn't get in touch with, the publication can be a big deviation of its design quality, the publication is too complicated or the presentation of the exhibit is very sophisticated and closely connected to a personal presentation, the presentation is deliberately individual - nonstandard, the presentation of the exhibit in disaccord with the dictum of EXPONET as Power-Point presentation or unrepresentative presentation by help of cuttings and html proceedings, and lack of time, or because EXPONET voted it out. From now on all online philatelic exhibits will easily be reachable thru EXPONET.

The new external exhibits are indicated by a different color in the menu. They are background-colored in light green, different from the beige color. Step by step the external exhibits will be added under the English menu, in their original language. One can find them by clicking at the respective category menu:

Ministry of Communications should do proper home work regarding the quantity of stamps to be issued. For Example Sai Baba stamps should have been issued in 10 million sheets of 35 stamps as there is sentiment behind this stamp. Ministry should have visualized the present demand. One cannot understand the logic behind to issue Sai Baba and Madhubala stamps in such small quantities. Is it not due to lobbying from the brokering communities!? The Ministry should take corrective measures in future to discourage hoarding of such stamps and to reduce the activities of brokers and middlemen and sufficient sheets are made available to the philatelists and general public.

Officially non issued stamps availability in the market at exorbitant rates can be avoided only by issuing such stamps officially at the earliest. We cannot avoid such stamps coming into the market as black sheep always exist in the system. It is for the Ministry to trace out such elements for awarding exemplary punishments. Otherwise such business is bound to thrive. It is high time that the Ministry should wake up to this existing mess before it goes out of control and receive more public reactions.

Yes, this is the best way to do business in India. We see people doing business in the name of God. Beggers, and Babas, are doing good business in the name of god by exploiting the religious sentiments of people. Philatelists in general are no exceptions.

Though the other stamps and pre-issues have obtained a good philatelic market throughout yet business in the name of SAI BABA is unbearable. The stamp is being sold for 10 to 15 times higher of its price. Philatelists in India are dieing to buy it and the dealers are using this opportunity to serve their financial interests.

I personally feel that at least when the celebrations are on, even the Department of Posts should have kept the price low and quantity high so to serve not only philatelic fraternity but people of India in general.

I appeal to my dear dealers and the staff of India Post not to charge any premium on this stamp and further to my collector friends to retain only one or two pieces with them so that maximum of aspirants get it.
