STAMP WATCH

For the last one week Sai Baba stamp is under heavy selling pressure due to market rumors floated by certain dealers that (1) Department of Posts has issued and delivered additional 0.4 million stamps to the Sai Baba Trust and (2) some of the philatelic bureaus in South have also received couple of packets of this second printing. Both these rumors are UNTRUE and I warn the collectors and investors not to be the victim of this baseless information. The reissue of a stamp is a cumbersome process and India Post does not have the inclination for the same. Please hold your stock and be patience and you will be rewarded - Philatelic investment is a waiting game and the people who wait will be rewarded in due course.

MORE PREMATURE ISSUES

It is now confirmed that India Post sold Indian stamps and first day cover of India China Joint issue in China on June 6, 2008 while in India these are scheduled for release on July 11, 2008. R R P Singh, Deputy Director General of India Post heading its Philatelic Division was in China for the joint release ceremony during Pranab Mukherjee's, India's minister for External Affairs, visit to China.

Presently many items like Presentation folders, miniature sheet, max cards, sheetlets, greeting cards etc are being issued along with issue of stamp/stamps. All these items are not available at the philatelic counters on the day of issue. AND on later dates also these items are not available to the philatelists.

It is good if there is display of all the items being issued along with stamp. Many a times, even it is not known to the philatelists, as to what items have been issued. To me wide publicity should be given for all the items issued on the day of issue of stamps.

The cancellation design of Madubala has not done justice to the beauty of Madhubala ji. Cancellation design should have been at least as beautiful as the stamp & FDC.

I want to draw the attention of higher authorities of India Post through your esteemed column that the information given on the official website of India post is not updated. Whenever a new stamp is released it is uploaded on the site after a long time when other forthcoming issues have already come out.

For the last few months the date of Indian issues are quite confusing as the scheduled issues have been often postponed by India Post. We don't know which issue will come out suddenly without any prior information. It causes a lot of difficulty for the philatelists and those writing on Indian Stamps or issuing a philatelic newsletter. As an editor of a new e-stamp magazine, it is very difficult for me to get updates of Indian issues living at Chopal, a very remote and small place of Shimla district of Himachal Pradesh. Internet is the only way to get connected with the world. Therefore I would request the honorable Deputy Director General of Philately to look into matter and make philatelic updates available at official website of India Post.

Also, it is my humble request to the honorable editor of this Digital Weekly to put latest information on Stamps of India as soon as possible as this is the only source of latest information of Indian Philately in our country for the philatelists and as well as those writing on philately.
