LIFE TIME ACHIEVEMENTS AWARDS

The Indo French Philatelic and Numismatic Association (IFPNA) decided to honor two eminent persons every year in order to recognize those who dedicate their life for philately by presenting the prestigious Life Time Achievement Award in Philately. This year IFPNA honored two philatelists, Noren Singh Nahar of Pondicherry and Man Mohan Singh of Bangalore.

Noren Singh Nahar was born on December 1, 1920. He graduated from Kolkata. In 1939 he joined Sri Aurobindo Ashram, Pondicherry. He was associated with Miter Stamp Collection and developed pen friends all over Europe. After that a great development in the collection of Philately Department of the Ashram started and he is the one who maintained it till date with the help of his sister, Suprabha Nahar. He visited France in 1975 and attended an International Philatelic Exhibition. He was member of Philatelic Advisory Committee from 1990-1992. He wrote many articles about the stamps of the French Settlements in India in India Post, the Journal of India Study Circle for Philately.

Man Mohan Singh was born on September 27, 1946 at Amritsar. His father Sardar Manohar Singh was also an eminent philatelist during his time. He joined stamp trade in 1968. He runs a stamp shop in Bangalore. He has won many awards in various exhibitions in Karnataka. Although he suffers from Parkinson's disease he manages to attend a lot of exhibitions all over India and is very popular with the philatelists.

The Eastern India Philatelists' Association, Bhubaneswar introduced a 'EIPA-Life Time Achievement Award for Promotion of Philately' that will be given to the philatelists having outstanding contribution for the promotion of Philately every four years.

The first 'EIPA-Life Time Achievement Award for Promotion of Philately' was given to Jadunath Kanungo, one of the three nominees. Kanungo received his award with citation from the Governor of Orissa on October 25, 2008.

Aug 8-10: Pondicherry, IFPNAPEX

Indo French Philatelic and Numismatic Association formed in the year 2007 under the leadership of the Founder President Norensingh Nahar of Sri Aurobindo Ashram and Secretary, A V Jeyachandran comprises a team of 25 members. In celebration with the first anniversary of the association, IFPNAPEX was organized between August 8 and 10, 2008. 120 frames of Stamps and 20 frames of Coins and Notes were on display.

Oct 25-26: Bhubaneswar, Eastern India Philatelic Exhibition The 1st Eastern India Philatelic Exhibition (EIPEX-2008) was organized by the Eastern India Philatelists' Association (EIPA) with active support of the Department of Posts, Orissa Circle at Jayadev Bhawan on October 25 and 26, 2008. Two special covers were released during the exhibition. The theme of the exhibition was Unity in Diversity. The exhibition was inaugurated by His Excellency Muralidhar Chandrakant Bhandare, the Governor of Orissa as the Chief Guest. He also released the special cover on peace depicting Mahatma Gandhi, Mother Teresa and Swamy Vivekanand with cachet cancellation of Pigeon. K V Sundar Rajan, The Chief Postmaster General, Orissa Circle was the Guest of Honor. The meeting was presided over by Bijayshree Routray, the Chairman, EIPEX-08 and President EIPA. Anup Kumar Raut, Organizing Secretary, EIPEX-08 introduced the Guests. Ajit Kumar Dash, Secretary, EIPA presented the Report of EIPA. Vote of thanks was given by Shanti Swarup Rath, Convener, EIPEX-08. READERS FORUM

NIKET BUBNA, USA

I am writing after a very long time, last being about the Madhav Institute of technology postage stamp. Since then, I have moved to the USA for higher studies and currently in Evanston near Chicago, taking my masters program in Biotechnology. I have been reading the updates and news about Indian stamp issues via 'Stamps of India' and a few other resources.

It is astonishing to note the exorbitant number of stamp releases planned for the remaining two months of 2008. I personally believe that many of the unprinted stamp issues would be shifted for release in 2009 and most of the non-personality issues will fall under that category. The Department of Posts, though has a rebranding exercise in place, it thoroughly needs a rebranding of their way of working and not the logo. Releasing 30-40 stamps in a month's period cannot be justified as being professional. It does not give ample opportunity for the philatelists to plan their purchases and shape their needs to enhance their collections. This mass release, if done, would result in confusion for the collector and, some may also miss out on a few issues. In regard to the Gur-ta-Gaddi celebrations, I would like to pitch in for the demand of a postage stamp on the Gur-ta-Gaddi being celebrated at Nanded on October 30, 2008 via Stamps of India. It is an occasion that deems fit for the release of a stamp, as we may recall the Prime Minister of India had approved three postage stamps on Sikh related events (<u>http://www.tribuneindia.com/2005/20050607/punjabl.htm</u>) in 2005 and none of the releases have happened so far. The Pakistan postal department is being so genuine in their gesture by releasing a stamp for the Gur-ta-Gaddi and had also commemorated Guru Arjan Dev's martyrdom in 2005, when the mess with Guru Granth Sahib postage stamp in India was created.

As for the recent confusion about the pricing of miniature sheets of 'Dakghar' and 'Commonwealth Games 2010' postage stamp, I think a clarification letter to the bureaus from the higher authorities in Delhi would clear doubts about the rate the department plans to charge. If they confirm to charge Rs 20 for a miniature sheet, they would have to explain their rationale for the decision. Also, when the packing labels of the miniature sheet says Rs 20 as the cost, the total income anticipated from the printing would have been calculated with that amount, and if a change is affected, to reduce the price to Rs 15, it is going to be a sheer confusion for all the stakeholders. Wish lots of luck to the Department for this venture.

Adding to the mayhem, I would like to bring to notice a mistake in the Commonwealth Games 2010 postage stamp on Shera, the mascot for the games. The postage stamp shows Shera, the mascot for the 2010 games and its cartoon shown on the postage stamp and the miniature sheet have India's national flag on his vest and is barefoot on the miniature sheet. After the release of the 2010 Games logo in January 2008, changes were affected in the mascot too. Shera, in his new avatar has the Games logo on his vest replacing the national flag and also wears blue colored shoes, instead of being barefooted. The new logo is very much put on the official games website (www.cwgdelhi2010.org). The stamp designers should have taken in account the new design and not gone ahead with the old Shera. As a philatelist, I definitely look into details and that is where I take pleasure. This error is visible and will get clearer once the mascot dons the streets of Delhi, when the Games begin.

It is with reference to your latest issue wherein you mentioned about the premium charged by the postal authorities. Earlier also in case of Mahatma Gandhi South Africa Joint issue (1995) the premium charged was more than 150%. The price printed for the Miniature was Rs.8 whereas the price of both the stamps together was Rs.3. The Miniature was sold at Rs.8. From the price confusion it is very clear that there is no philatelist to consult for the Department of Posts or they don't want to consult philatelists on price issue.

One more concern is the quality of design, printing and paper. Definitely it needs a lot of improvement. As some of your readers expressed it should be taken seriously. Only a handful of people are engaged in designing the stamps. Why not the designing be open to other agencies also? Even foreign agencies can also be invited to participate. On competitive basis the designers should be selected. Besides, the designs can be published well in advance to get the opinion from the public. It will prevent the mishap which happened to the Guru Granth Saheb stamp.

The paper used for commemorative stamps, in most cases, is too fragile to handle. The paper used particularly in United States is strong and will withstand vagaries of time. We may also follow the same.

One more, grave problem which has developed of late is the indiscriminate issue of Miniature sheets. It is like killing the golden goose. The latest premium pricing will only worsen the situation.

Another important issue is related to the information provided in the so called the Technical data in the Brochures. Instead of improvement it has deteriorated. Perforation details and the exact number of stamps, sheets /sheetlets with the number of stamps per sheets/sheetlets can be restored in the Brochure.

Probably India is the only country wherein there is no proper planning on the issue of commemorative or definitive stamps. Programme for the year 2008 and 2009 was uploaded in the site of Department of Posts only recently. Now it is October and a number of stamps for 2008 are yet to be decided as per the plan. Schedule and reschedule and cancellation have become a standard rule of the Department of Posts. Even released stamps are not sent to the Bureaus in time or in sufficient quantity. Of course we cannot blame the Department of Posts for this, as they may be busy otherwise to take care of the traders of premature issues. In case of Coast Guard the matter was taken up by the India Today and the date was hurriedly fixed for release. If this is the state of affair, nobody can save Indian philately. India may soon be black listed by the world philatelists.

I wonder whether the authorities concerned read and understand the voice of the philatelists raised through respectable journals like this one.
