NEW STAMPS RELEASED

RANI VELU NACHCHIYAR

India Post released a commemorative postage stamp in the denomination of Rs 5 on Rani Velu Nachchiyar on December 31, 2008.

Security Printing Press, Hyderabad designed the Stamp. Alka Sharma designed the First Day Cover and pictorial the first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. Security Printing Press, Hyderabad printed the stamp by wet offset in the quantities of 0.5 million.

LOUIS BRAILLE

India Post released a commemorative postage stamp in the denomination of Rs 5 to mark the birth bicentenary of Louis Braille on January 4, 2009.

This is the 2^{nd} stamp of India to have the Braille characters. The first one was issued on 2007.

Louis Braille (January 4, 1809 - January 6, 1852) was the inventor of braille, a world-wide system used by blind and visually impaired people for reading and writing. Braille is read by passing the fingers over characters made up of an arrangement of one to six embossed points. It has been adapted to almost every known language.

Sankha Samanta designed the stamp. Alka Sharma designed the First Day Cover and the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. India Security Press, Nasik printed the stamp by photogravure in the quantities of 3 million.

KASINATH R, Madurai

This was an experience happened to me this week. I went to the GPO here at Madurai to send a speed post. The clerk at the counter said if I affix stamps, they would not take the cover as they got instructions from higher officials to not accept such covers. They want to fix only barcode stickers and printed slips to reduce manpower in selling stamps at the counter.

The Department of Posts is supposed to promote philately and not to discourage. In my opinion, only philatelists are those who are affixing stamps on the covers. If they too not allowed to fix stamps, then who is going to promote philately?

If this will be the case, then why they are printing and issuing so much stamps per year? Is that just to squeeze out money from us philatelists? Then it is not called philately bureau, it is just looting from us. I guess many of us throughout India, if not, at least at major GPOs experience like this and not many of us come out with this problem. Something must be done to accept speed post covers with stamps at all speed post counters across the country. Already the hobby is dying, and if they start doing like this, we won't be getting any cancelled stamps or used stamps any more.

JEEVAN JYOTI, Kullu

I recently came across an article by a noted philatelist of India who has been the commissioner in International Philatelic Exhibitions. It reflects his resentment and vows on the result of his own collection

displayed in an International Philatelic Exhibition. When I went through the whole article I found he felt very bad when his own collection was downgraded by one medal. He put his views in the critique session as to why was he downgraded. In response he got the explanation which was unsatisfactory and baseless according to him. He was fired for the poor choice of the subject. Then he explained his subject and its importance. Similarly we face such humiliating situations in India at national level. When a participant is downgraded, obviously he feels disappointed. Now it is to be noticed that the same persons when acting as the members of Jury in India don't realise the disappointment faced by participants. He agrees with the statement that "judging is different when the candidate is known". But I just want to express that the similar disappointments are faced by the philatelists in India in Thematic category in which the number of participants is quite big and the panel of jury members appointed to judge the exhibits is not sufficient. This is the only reason that the collections are judged with a flying look. There is nothing to comment on the fact that "judging is different when candidate is known as everyone agrees with the statement and the several exhibits can be observed after the results are declared". The subject matter of the exhibits is not properly read by the jury members which is visible from the fact when the subject of the exhibits is discussed with them they give a very vague explanation as they have not understood the subject. I have faced such situation in last National Philatelic exhibition and many others might have faced too. As we are all aware of the post exhibition reactions of the participants published in this digital weekly. The next National Exhibition is proposed to be held in Bangalore. Hope this time the judging will be fair and flawless.
