It is nice to see the developments made by India Post. The recently introduced colorful quarterly journal Phila Post and gold plated silver replicas of 25 best stamps of India are praiseworthy. The DDG philately gives assurance in his editorial of recent issue of Phila Post that India Post is working on a major project to establish a world class Philatelic Museum at Delhi. It is good to know but what about the basic website of India Post which has not been maintained and updated regularly. There should be a separate website for philately with updates and complete information on recent and old philatelic items issued by India Post along with complete information about each issue provided on the brochure. The website of a postal administration plays a key role in popularising its stamps around the globe. It is highly disappointing that information about new issue is uploaded quite late on the website of India Post. The website is very poorly maintained by the staff of the philately section. It does not stand any where amongst the websites of other postal administrations of the world. A change can be brought by maintaining the basic requirements of the philatelists like availability of philatelic items on regular basis with proper distribution of philatelic items in all philatelic bureaus of the country and providing latest information about new issues on its website. Every philatelist is aware of the fact that stamps/FDCs/ cachets do not reach timely at philatelic bureau. Once a stamp is

released in New Delhi it reaches with the snail speed at various philatelic bureaus of the country and sometimes takes months to reach the hands of the collectors.

I notice there is no mention of the surprise stamp on Medical Council of India released on 2nd March. What is happening to the definitives of Builders of Modern India? I suppose they are going to spread out over the year, as in the past!

Is the prematurely released 'Spices of India' stamps going to be released any time? I noticed that you have removed the premature release section from Stamps of India.

As for the heroines of Indian screen which was on the anvil from 2007? I wonder what is happening.

In last week's Stamps of India Collector's Companion, Mr Tej Singh suggested change in paper used for brochures and covers. What about the paper used for printing the STAMPS themselves. Some of them are atrocious.

SWAPAN KUMAR CHAKRAVORTY, Ranchi My sincerest thanks and gratitude expressed towards your endeavor to keep us absolutely updated in the entire gamut of Philately. I have a few suggestions to make to the authority, which I feel can be reached through your this forum. a) Many stamps are issued both definitive and commemorative. However, very few of those carry their introduction. A very brief introductory note in smaller fonts may be included on the stamp to make people aware of the objective of the issue.

British five Pound currency note carries an inscription (both text and graphics) of a cricket match of the team "all muggleton" described in Charles Dickens' "Pickwick Papers". Our Ten Rupee note could carry the graphic detail of Nishad(hunter)killing "Krauncha"(the bird)with Maharshi Balmiki chanting the 1st Sanskrit shloka "Ma Nishada Pratisthan etc".

b) Is there any way to train the postal people on how to cancel a stamp without defacing it? The worn-out seals used for cancellation are also to be replaced with thin lined characters on the seal. A corner on the stamp may be decorated and designated for such cancellation.

c) Of late, pre-affixed stamps on envelops are being cancelled by several childish zig-zag scribing in red using ball pen, especially, in case of Speed Post.

There are many such thoughts that disturb me often. Those are reserved for future installments. Could you please make someone hear me?

Today, nobody writes letter. To sell the stamps, the authority must prepare itself to endure this mild pain.
