Dr Jagtap of Switzerland needs no introduction to readers of this digital weekly. We have the privilege of publishing his views in the Readers Forum of this issue on what we wrote in this space in the previous Issue #389. However we have moved the last paragraph of his views in this place and provided our response below.

Dr Jagtap wrote:

"I must bring to the notice of the readers, that nowadays several persons or associations issue their special "Stamp Booklets" and offer them at stamp exhibitions. (Surprisingly, in this bulletin there is news that a stamp booklet has been issued and is offered for sell!) All these persons and associations who offer such stamp booklets are doing so only to better their pocket and the buyers should be warned not to purchase such bogus Stamp Booklets (not worth their contents, i.e. the face-value of the stamps they contain). They are not issued officially by India Post. Such booklets should not be exhibited in any philatelic display. If done so, the Jury at the exhibition will have the right to deduct the points from the mark-sheet of such an exhibitor."

In response let us first get the errors of the fact out of the way: 1. The issue #389 referred by Dr Jagtap reported not 'a' but 2 stamp booklets.

- 2. The stamp booklets were not offered for 'sell!' anywhere in that issue.
- 3. The national and international philatelic exhibit evaluation systems in existence do not 'deduct the points'. The points are awarded on items shown and there is no provision for deducting points on account of items not shown. Properly describing the status of an item will earn

points. Properly describing includes but is not limited to, identifying a forgery, a repaired item, and a privately produced item.

To quote from the 'Jhingans Jottings' of the same issue we bemoaned that "Some stamp booklets are neither booklet nor there is any data available about their origin." Let us elaborate a little on it. A dealer in India took a picture postcard issued by a philatelic bureau of India Post showing images of stamps, folded it in half, stapled stamps in between and sold to a buyer in Europe as an official stamp booklet. We are all for private enterprise and free economy but are against frauds, fakes, forgeries. In this we seek your cooperation to document such incidents.

The privately produced philatelic items have been an integral part of the philatelic world. And we know score of persons who can be 100 times better creative than the post office products issued. We wish that the society or individual creating a stamp booklet, first day cover, special cover, philatelic numismatic cover or maxim card must print at least the name of the issuing body on the item issued. This is a good philatelic practice and makes the life easier for reporters, authors, editors, publishers, and philatelic historians. Nowadays some items are being created at desktop printer for sale on eBay or Delcampe. And for some reason the creators of these wish to remain anonymous.

On the other hand the 2 stamp booklets reported in the previous issue of this digital weekly have been designed by a living legend in the field of Art, Cinema, Philately, and Journalism - Dipok De. These have been issued by a bona fide all India philatelic organization that is over 25 years old. The quantity produced is only 200 (our suggestion would have been 500) but even these are still easily available for the issue price of Rs 100. The stamp booklets contain stamps worth Rs 50 each and cost of production is Rs 20/30 each. It is even possible to buy a few copies of these stamp booklets for less than official price because Dipok De regularly gives a few copies of his work free to his friends. We speak from our personal knowledge that Dipok De loses money on such activities but carries on solely for the labor of love.

The good philatelic practice regarding the issue of stamp booklet is that it should be available in sufficient quantity at the face value of the stamps it includes. The cost of booklet manufacturing and marketing must be recovered by way of selling advertising space in the booklet. Ideally it should be not be large, credit card size is recommended, and should contains multiples of popular denomination/s of definitive stamps. Occasionally larger stamps booklets to accommodate commemorative stamps may be issued. Stamp booklets issued should be usable as a postal product. Whether to use it or to collect it intact is a decision of the buyer of the product.

We hope this information will be useful for both the collectors and producers of stamps booklets including postal officials.

Thank you for your remarks as regards the rise of forgeries so far as philatelic matters are concerned. Having concentrated myself on collection of stamps of British India period, I had purchased some

items some 40 years ago from prominent philatelic dealers in India. At that time I was not aware that the stamps with overprint varieties or cancellations should only be purchased with an authenticity certificates, despite the warning by reputed catalogue publishers like M/S Stanley Gibbons Ltd.

After some years to my dismay, I was less happy to realize that a certain overprint on Queen Victoria stamp was forged. I sent a letter to the dealer, whom I had purchased that stamp, expressing my dismay. One dealer did write me back, saying he is very sorry that the stamp he had sold me some 20 years ago was fake! Naturally, I did not ask him for refund. It was terribly late to ask for refund! It was my fault to have trusted him that the stamp was a genuine one.

This can happen to anyone, who prefers to trust the dealer, rather than puts the condition to get the stamp expertised for its genuineness (which involves time and money). One has to take for granted that any such item (which normally is above £ 50.) offered is "forged" and one should better abstain from purchasing it, unless it is accompanied with a certificate of authenticity.

As now many people, not necessarily philatelists, who have entered into this field of stamp collecting, have spoiled this hobby. There is no control over the dealers who make money by exercising all types of forgeries and those who have no knowledge of philately are prepared to buy any type of material offered to them.
