Since I am trying to revive the maximaphily in India, I request you to kindly upload the attached rules for judging maximum cards collection of FIP. This document also serves as a good guideline for the collectors too. In case if anyone has any query related to maximum card they may please forward them to my email: [joydave99@yahoo.com](mailto:joydave99@yahoo.com)."

In response let us focus on the Maxim cards this time. The FIP rules for maximaphily are available on their web site at [http://f-i-p.ch/regulation/pdf/Max-Srev\\_000.pdf](http://f-i-p.ch/regulation/pdf/Max-Srev_000.pdf). These are the latest updated version approved at the Malaga, Spain on October 12, 2006. Although these rules - 'Special Regulations for the Evaluation of Maximaphily Exhibits at F I P Exhibitions (SREV)' and 'Guidelines for Judging Maximaphily Exhibits' are regarding judging exhibits of maxim cards, the Article 3 - Principles of exhibit composition, of both, defines in detail what is acceptable as maxim card and what is not.

We believe that armed with this information, you will be able to judge for yourself that several maxim cards on offer at eBay and Delcampe do not qualify as maxim cards at all, and choose accordingly.

SPICES STAMPS RELEASED

India Post released a set of 5 special postage stamps on Spices of  
India on April 29, 2009. Four stamps are in the denomination of Rs 5  
and depict Black Pepper, Cinnamon, Cardamom, and Clove. The fifth stamp  
in the denomination of Rs 20 depicts Turmeric, Coriander, and Chilly.  
A miniature sheet also accompanied the issue.

Suresh Kumar designed the Stamps and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma  
designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up  
and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and  
the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. India Security Press, Nasik  
printed 0.4 million stamps each in the sheets of 30, 6 se-tenant strips  
of 5 stamps, by photogravure process. The miniature sheet is printed in  
the quantity of 0.2 million.

I was concerned about continuous theft by Indian postal employees. I recently got a cover from Nicaragua whose stamps had been torn off by the postal authorities.

Then I went to register complain at my nearest post office (Cumbala Hill, Mumbai) the person in charge was so rude and so unhelpful. He even refused to give me a paper to write complain. Then I tried talking this out with other philatelic friends of mine and they too worried as they were going through the same ordeals. Cello taped parcels being ripped apart to steal items from inside and what not. Someone even told me that one out of every 5 parcels he receives contents get stolen and one out of every 10 goes missing.

Indian post office is not talking this problem seriously and is not trying to do anything about it. Most of the non Indian philatelic collectors refuse to trade with Indian collectors because of such incidents. I don't know about others but my collection is being hampered because of these incidents.
