JHINGANS JOTTINGS

INDIPEX 54 was the first world philatelic exhibition held in India. It was held few years before we were born but it has always fascinated us as a subject to collect and research and we have done both with great enthusiasm.

Thus it hurts us a lot to see carelessness, ignorance, unwillingness to act on part of postal officers while writing derogatively about India's postal and philatelic history. This is even after repeatedly being alerted to the facts several times by several people.

The introduction to INDIPEX 2011 on its recently launched website begins "The first of such international philatelic exhibitions In India was organized in a small way in 1954 as part of the centenary celebrations of the Indian postages stamp." The fact is that it was a major world event of its time and Postal Administrations of 74 countries participated. Originally the show was scheduled for 15 days from Oct 1 to 15 but was later extended to Oct 30. It was held at Eastern court complex, New Delhi and new buildings were specially constructed for the occasion. The President of India was the Patron of the exhibition and Prime Minister inaugurated the show. Simultaneously with the stamp exhibition an International Postal Services Exhibition was held from Oct 1 to 31, 1954 by India Post. Prominent manufacturers of postal equipment and leading international air transport companies took part in the exhibition.

By no measure can this be called small. Indian postal officials should carry out an exercise in comparative history and find out how many countries in the world had organized international philatelic exhibitions till 1954 and how many shows even much after 1954 were organized in the world at the scale of INDIPEX 54.

On investigating the genesis of the expression 'small' we found out that in a pamphlet published by India Post before the Bulletin 1 of India 89 world philatelic exhibition that INDIPEX 54 was mentioned as small for the first time and since then the error has been faithfully repeated over and over again. It actually is an affront not only to Indian philately but to India Post as well.

We hope that this revelation would act as a wakeup call for the officers in charge of writing and contributing to documents and website on behalf of India Post to verify their facts before documenting things.

For example - a stamp issued in 2009 to honor Venkatarama Bhagavathar, this is a issue of 0.3 million stamps with 48 stamps per issue sheet with a total of 6250 sheets only. Take note of this issue.

Bharatiya Daktikit Sangstha, Kolkata is organizing a national philatelic exhibition 'Stamps of India National Exhibition' from December 10 to 12, 2010 at NSIC Exhibition Ground, New Delhi. Stamps of India National Exhibition is commemorating the Centenary of the Transfer of the Capital of India to Delhi from Kolkata.

Stamps of India National Exhibition is being held at an excellent venue on the main road, with virtually unlimited car parking within the Exhibition Ground, a Metro Station, and all other amenities including a Cafeteria. The Exhibition Hall is closer to the entry point at the main road and one doesn't need to walk a lot to reach it. PAYPAL OPERATIONS IN INDIA UPDATE

PayPal announced on February 27, 2010 that the Reserve Bank of India has now allowed to continue withdrawals for settlements for exports of goods and

services in to bank accounts in India. PayPal has made changes to comply with Indian regulations for settlements for exports of goods and services, and as of Wednesday, March 3, 2010 customers can use the bank withdrawal service.

Indian PayPal users (Business, Premier and Personal Account Holders) are no longer able to receive personal payments. Indian Sellers on eBay and elsewhere on the net accepting payments through PayPal now have three options to get paid by their customers by

- 1. Using the PayPal for Purchases (Goods or Services) tab
- 2. Completing PayPal checkout at Seller's website
- 3. Responding to PayPal "Request Money" instructions (invoices)

The Indian users while instructing PayPal to withdraw PayPal balance to their bank account in India, will be required to provide a purpose code for the transaction. The purpose code helps the bank furnish information that may be required by the Reserve Bank of India to identify the nature of the cross border transaction. Please note that this is different from the Importer Exporter Code (IEC) issued by the Ministry of Commerce and Industry.

Please note that according to Indian law, based on the value of withdrawal and the purpose code in declaration, the bank may require the Seller to provide documentary proofs such as invoices / goods receipt forms as applicable to reconcile with withdrawal.

PayPal is now set to be a more powerful engine for exporters in India with inclusion of purpose codes for export transactions and Foreign Inward Remittance Certificates to get the export related benefits.

INDIPEX 2011 WEBSITE LAUNCHED

INDIPEX 2011 world philatelic exhibition's website was launched last week and is now available at http://www.indipex2011.com/index.php.

India Post for the first time launched a website for a philatelic exhibition in 2000 for the Asian international INDEPEX ASIANA 2000 held at Kolkata. When the domain expired it was not renewed and was taken over by organizations that run undesirable sites. Is India Post repeating the same mistake after a decade? Well this seems to be their track record. Why was the site not launched as a sub domain of the main India Post Site? The 2008 national exhibition site was launched as a sub domain of the Tamil Nadu circle site. Well when the next international show will come along the key postal officials involved with the earlier projects either have already superannuated or will be holding a different charge far away.

The site also boldly proclaims that INDIPEX 2011 is commemorating "150th" (sic) Anniversary of the first Official Airmail of the world. This displays to the world at large the sheer ignorance on the part of the organizers and their advisors and is a fair indication for the things to come.

According to India Post's Annual Report for the year 1911 the first Official Airmail of the world was flown between Allahabad and Naini on February 20, 1911 and not on the 18th as is being celebrated.

Vice President of India, Hamid Ansari released commemorative coins in of Rs 5 and Rs 100 to mark the 125th birth anniversary of the first President of India, Dr Rajendra Prasad on February 28, 2010 at at Patna.

Rajendra Prasad was born in 1884 at Zeradei in Bihar's Siwan district. After serving for 12 years as India's first president from 1950 to 1962 he retired and was subsequently awarded the Bharat Ratna, the nation's highest civilian honor. He spent the last days of his life at the Sadaqat Ashram in Patna and died in 1963.
