After a gap of few years we now have another postal forgery to report. It is a new postal forgery of Rs 20 definitive depicting Golden Shower (Amaltaas) flower. It was first issued on Nov 20, 2000 in the previous definitive series featuring Natural Heritage.

A pair has been used on registered letter from Patna High Court Post Office on March 5, 2010. The letter addressed to Ahmedabad was mailed by the Joint Registrar of Patna High Court.

The forgery is crude and the perforations are also poor.

MICHAEL FONSECA

I visited the Philatelic Office of the Mumbai GPO in July 2009 and deposited Rs 1000 to receive new issue stamps. Despite reminders I have not received or heard from there since. I have a receipt from the clerk at the counter. Can anyone suggest how I could get my money back?

PROF DR V K GUPTA

You have deleted the following, "Neither there is violation of any ASDA or FIP rules" from my feedback. I had requested you on phone not to edit my views. If you were not agreeable to my views, you could have commented on that, but I strongly feel that editing is unfair to my views. I request you to reprint my feedback in your next issue as it is.

EDITORS RESPONSE:

We had also corrected spellings and grammar as well as created paragraph to convey your opinion in your words in a better manner besides removing the line and all this is part of our job as editors.

We believed the removed line forms a separate stream of view requiring a separate paragraph if retained. It also needed more details to maintain the uniformity of clarity of the entire piece. Furthermore it is also a sweeping general statement which wise people will avoid to use especially in writing.

We would like to draw your attention to the fact that our report in the issue #427 on which you commented, is not about conservation at all but is about fraud. This makes the entire first paragraph of your comment redundant as only the second paragraph is relevant.

If you carefully compare both the images at the link provided in our report, before and after bleaching, you will find that in the process of "professional" chemical treatment the brittle sheet has split and lost small pieces along the vertical crease. Instead of conserving this is a clear case of damaging philatelic material.

Bleaching as is the case with the sheet in question, should clearly be covered under Modifications and Alterations which is not automatically related to conservation. The Repairs, Restorations, Modifications, and Alterations are required to be disclosed while exhibiting or selling not only under FIP regulations but also under the Code of Ethics or Conduct of almost all philatelic associations including that of dealers as well as that of philatelic auctioneers.

The conservation of paper products through lamination whether polyfilm or archival quality Japanese tissue is routinely used all over the world but is absolutely not acceptable in philately or other collectibles.

May we suggest that you contact FIP and IFSDA and obtain their opinion in writing regarding 'conservation' such as bleaching, deacidification and chemical treatment and its disclosure by the exhibitor and dealer. This, we sincerely hope, will conclusively end the debate on this subject.

We also wish to point out that we are editing a news magazine not running a blog or moderating an online forum. In over 400 issues in 10 years we have

not commented on feedback even 10 times, as publication of this digital weekly is not about promoting or imposing our individual opinions and views. It is a platform for all stake holders in philately in India and Indian philately worldwide. We will reiterate that we always have had the guts to print views against ourselves in Readers Forum unfortunately not many joined to write back on some vital issues that we aired.
