WORLD CLASSICAL TAMIL CONFERENCE STAMP

The Department of Post has issued a special commemorative stamp for the World Classical Tamil Conference, Coimbatore on 27th June 2010. As per the Brochure the printed quantity of this issue is 300,000 i.e. approximately 8500 sheets.

I wrote in this weekly under "stamp watch" informing the philatelists that this stamp issue may turn out to be a rarity due to the unprecedented sale during the conference held for 7 days as it was well attended by more than 700,000 people from India as well as from 40 odd countries from the world and the purchasers were mostly non philatelists. I have also given the account of sale - that so and so many stamps were sold during the conference as well as the stamps supplied to the Tamil Nadu Government for their official use.

I am really shocked and hurt to learn, through some of my friends, about the gossip that I have cornered the major quantity of this stamp with an intention to speculate and gamble for my financial gains. It further pains me when some of my very close philatelic friends(?) also join hands to spread this kind of gossip.

I vehemently deny this baseless rumor and gossip. Even though I live in Coimbatore where the conference was held, I came to know about the huge sale of this stamp from a local Tamil news paper. After reading this news column I immediately approached the local philatelic bureau to ascertain the fact. On receipt of the exact details from the bureau I wrote the facts in Stamps of India Collectors Companion for the benefits of the collectors. I never thought my writing will put me into unnecessary controversy and defame me personally.

I agree with the fact that 70% of the total printed quantity was transferred to Coimbatore via Anna Road Post Office, Chennai. After the conference the officials from Anna Road Post Office visited the Coimbatore HPO and have taken the excess stock back to Chennai for onward supplies to other philatelic bureau. I don't control the Post Office and where was stock left with them for me to corner 2 to 3000 sheets? I am an investor of Indian stamps but I definitely not am a speculator or gambler of any issue.

I recall many of my previous stamp watches columns in this weekly and many of them came true as predicted because my writing is based on the facts and without any ulterior motive for a personal financial gain. My only interest is that Indian Philately should be more open and transparent and it should reach its rightful place.

It is the duty of every philatelist in India to create more collectors in our Country. As informed many a time, the population of stamp collectors in India is less than 50,000 and my intention is to purely promote this hobby and to invite the new collectors into this fold. I toyed with the idea of "Philsensex" and other related columns as an alternative investment tool.

I fail to understand why I have been made a subject of gossip for market manipulators. I know that I am better off pursuing this hobby privately but I will continue to promote the hobby in and its awareness in India with all the resources available to me.

VETHTHIRI

A Raja, the Minister of Communications & Information Technology released a stamp in the denomination of Rs 5 to commemorate the birth centenary of Veththiri Maharishi, on August 14, 2010 at Chennai in a special function presided over by M Karunanidhi, the Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu.

Nenu Gupta designed the Stamp, the First Day Cover, and the pictorial first day postmark. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. Security Printing Press, Hyderabad printed 0.3 million stamps by wet offset process.

#### RECENT & FORTHCOMING EVENTS

Aug 6-8: Shantiniketan, Exhibition on Tagore - India and Abroad  
A philatelic exhibition from the collection of Souvik Roy of, Kolkata organized by Visva Bharati at Rabindra Bhavana, Shantiniketan as a part of year long celebrations for Tagore's 150 years.

One special cover designed by Souvik Roy, with the postmark depicting of Rabindra Nath Tagore's autograph in Bengali, was provided by India Post and released by Chief Postmaster General of west Bengal & Sikkim in the presence of the Vice Chancellor of Visva Bharati, and Director of Rabindra Bhavana & Tagore Research Chair of Visva Bharati.

Three private stamp booklets with the miniature sheet of "Dakghar" of Rabindra Nath Tagore, with three different photographs of Tagore on cover, with the quotation of Mahatma Gandhi, Albert Einstein and Satyajit Ray; designed by Souvik Roy, with date and place of issue were released on the occasion.

Three picture post cards on Rabindra Nath Tagore were also issued. An exhibition brochure with the writings of Prof Udaya Narayana Singh, Director of Rabindra Bhavana & Tagore Research Chair of Visva Bharati; and Director of Indira Gandhi Centre for National Integration; and by Dipok Dey, eminent Philatelist & Designer, was also published on the occasion.

The display not only covered all philatelic issues on Rabindra Nath Tagore but all special covers, number of picture postcards issued by different agencies on Tagore, paper cuttings, event folders, one phone card and one match box label as well. All this was displayed in 72 pages.

Electronic and print media did made a wide coverage of the event. The show was a major success with active support from India Post, Visva Bharati University and Gorky Sadan, Russian Consulate.

Aug 13: Dehradun, Indian Military Academy philatelic exhibition  
Lieutenant General Sujlana, Commandant Indian Military Academy, inaugurated a philatelic exhibition in presence of Anjali Devashar, the Chief Postmaster General and Sanjay Singh, the Director Postal Service, Uttarakhand Circle on Aug 13, 2010.
