New World Record for an Indian Stamp

On May 19, 2011 David Feldman sold a 1948 Rs 10 Mahatma Gandhi stamp of India overprinted Service for a World Record price of EUR 144,000 (Rs 9.2 million); this is the highest price ever paid for a single Indian stamp smashing the previous 2010 record set by the 4 Annas "Inverted Head" error. Additionally it is also believed that this sale possibly represents a World Record price paid for a modern stamp from any country.

The stamp, probably the finest remaining example out of only 18 known in existence today, was issued by the Government of India as a set of 4 commemorative stamps on August 15th, 1948 as a tribute to the father of the nation Mahatma Gandhi, who was assassinated in January of the same year. These were the first commemorative stamps of Independent India, and issued in 4 denominations $-1\frac{12}{3}$ / $3\frac{12}{2}$ / 12 Annas, and the 10 Rupees. A set of only 100 stamps (in two sheets) of Rs 10 denomination were overprinted with "Service", making these the world's least printed stamp.

In the same auction session, part of a fabulous Grand Prix winning collection of covers of Indian stamps used in Burma, attracted interest from all over the World. During a tense period of bidding, the collection was sold for a total amount of EUR 672,000 (Rs 43 million).

India Post Issues FDC with Wrongly Mapped India

In a blunder of Himalayan proportion, India Post wrongly printed the map of India on the back of the First Day Cover issued for the 2nd Africa India Forum-Summit issue of May 25, 2011. The gravity of the blunder is compounded further with the fact that Dr Manmohan Singh, Prime Minister of India, released it in Ethiopia in the presence of several African Heads of States / Government.

The unworthy postal officers occupying high positions especially in philatelic division of India Post must know that ignorance of law is no excuse and the law is that any publishing of the map of India, even the outline, requires permission from the Surveyor General of India and wrong depiction of the map is punishable with imprisonment, which may extend to six months, or with fine, or with both.

The medals awarded at INDIPEX 2011 world philatelic exhibition has stirred yet another controversy. The Silver Bronze medal is in silver colour and Silver medal is bimetal with centre in silver and outer rim in bronze! The size of the medals is same.

Ghouse Ali Zameer, member of the Governing Council of the Karnataka Philatelic Society from Bangalore, and a winner of Silver medal at INDIPEX 2011 had requested to change the medal and even opened three other boxes to find the similar medals. The committee member at INDIPEX 2011 convinced him that the bimetal medal is a Silver medal in presence of a few senior philatelists.

Look at the images and draw your own conclusions about incompetent postal officers guided by ignorant pseudo philatelists who organized this world philatelic exhibition with Rs 200 million (US\$4.4 million) of public funds.

Africa India Forum Stamps Released

Dr Manmohan Singh, Prime Minister of India, released a set of 2 stamps in the denomination of Rs 5 and 25, and a miniature sheet commemorating 2nd Africa India Forum-Summit at Addis Ababa in Ethiopia in the presence of several African Heads of States / Government.

On the sidelines of the Summit several concurrent events are also being organized including academic symposia, editors' conference; trade fair, cultural events showcasing Indian and African culture; and a film festival.

In April 2008, India hosted the First India-Africa Forum Summit in Delhi. This summit built upon the foundations of the historical relationship that existed between India and Africa, and designed a new architecture for a structured engagement, interaction and co-operation between India and Africa in the 21st century. The summit celebrated friendship and renewed our commitment to Africa. The historic documents, the Delhi Declaration and the India-Africa Framework for co-operation adopted at the end of the summit now serve as the contours for one systematic engagement with Africa in the coming years.

In order to continue and enhance the systematic engagement with Africa in the coming years, second India-Africa Forum Summit is being organized in Addis-Ababa during 24-25 May 2011. This is for the first time that a meeting between India and its African partners at the level of Heads of State/Government is being organized in Africa.

Kamleshwar Singh designed the Stamps, miniature sheet and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. Security Printing Press, Hyderabad printed 0.4 million stamps of each denomination by Wet Offset process. The miniature sheet is produced in the quantity of 0.3 million.

Buddha Stamps from Nepal & Sri Lanka

Sri Lanka issued a set of 4 stamps on May 14, 2011 to commemorate 2600th Sambuddhatva Jayanthi. Nepal also issued a set of 4 stamps on this occasion. These stamps feature Lumbini, Buddha Gaya, Saranath also known as Isipathana, and Kusinara in Nepal and India, where significant events in the life of the Buddha took place.

However in case of the stamps of Nepal Buddhists and philatelists point out inacuuracies and discrepancies in all the four stamps. One stamp locates Lumbini, the Buddha's birthplace and now in modern Nepal, in the middle of a map of India. The same stamp shows a historic pillar, erected by King Asoka to mark the exact location of the Buddha's birth, in a corner, while prominence is given to a more recent structure put up at the site. The stamp depicting Buddha Gaya, the holy site where the Gautama Buddha attained Enlightenment, gives prominence to two Hindu temples, while the Sri

Maha Bodhiya, the most venerated place of Buddhist worship, is in the background. The two other stamps also sideline the historically important Isipathanaramaya, in Saranath, and Kusinara, and give prominence to more recent structures. A senior offcier in the Ministry of Posts has been appointed to look into the matter and submit his report.
