Brahm Prakash designed the Stamp and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. India Security Press, Nashik printed 400,000 stamps by photogravure process.

### **Hausburg's Digital Edition**

American Philatelic Research Library (APRL ) has released the digital edition of 'The Postage and Telegraph Stamps of British India ' by L L R Hausburg and C Stewart-Wilson. The title was published

in 1907 and unfortunately almost unusable today in original due to high acid content in the paper used. Therefore APRL has fulfilled a very great need by bringing out its digital edition. The 'Hausburg' as this title is commonly referred to by the philatelists is the acknowledged primer for every collector of British Indian stamps and covers the issues from Scinde Dawks to King Edward VII.

This digital edition was scanned from a copy of the book in the collection of the APRL, including plates inserted in a folder in the back of the book. The entire book is included in this PDF file and the text is searchable. The APRL also scanned Supplement No. 2 (The Essays, Proofs, and Reprints of the First Issued Stamps of British India of 1854-55 by E D Bacon), and included it with this book in a separate PDF file.

We wish that APRL should also have included the Supplement No. 1 (New Discoveries in the British India Stamps of 1854-5 Printed in India by L L R Hausburg, 1916) which has 4 pages of text with 3 plates. Inclusion of an Introduction to the title as well as its contemporary reviews would have added value to this digital edition.

#### **Udai Gupta, Mumbai**

In spite of the fact that the MNH or MH has become very popular and expensive in recent years yet, the usage and passion of used stamps has not gone. The MNH has its influence mainly from US stamps, where for some reasons Mint are very very popular influencing the rest of the philatelic world. But the trend also shows that the used stamps with some clear marking are also very popular. Besides the popularity of used stamps on cover or card or even on piece with clear or multi-frank has also gone up very high. Also, used stamps being relatively cheap (in most cases) also serves as the initial stimuli to generate interest in philately without running the risk of tedious maintenance procedure involved in preserving the mint and gum especially in humid and hot climate such as Mumbai. This problem is not faced by dry and colder climates of Europe / England and US etc. The one important reason for used stamps to remain popular in India and similar climates

I would think that used stamps will remain of use and philatelic interest for longer time than what the recent trend tells.

Hope above thought will contribute in some way to our philatelic interest and market.

According to the issue raised by you in your weekly daily I would like to draw your attention to the scarcity of used postal stamps and the quality available.

Foremost the used stamps are scarce as no one now-a-days uses the postal department for communication. Moreover the used stamps that are available are also in a miserable condition to be used up in the personal collection.

I personally experienced lot of problems on the used stamps. Firstly they are not available easily. The traders also charge heavily and the last hindrance is the Indian postal system doesn't allow us the facility of CTO. So, it becomes difficult for the collectors to make up their whole collection just on the Used series of stamps.

At one time collecting stamp meant used stamp, and the fun of removing stamp from envelopes collected from all over the city was great, I suppose real collectors do collect mint as well as old used as they consider it as their hobby and also in anticipation, that as less number of stamps are used in registered, and speed post envelopes, one day these used stamps would may also be appreciated once again
