India 1929 Air Mail Stamps: A Study of Constant Varieties

Stamps of India is pleased to announce that the publication of its new book India 1929 Air Mail Stamps: A Study of Constant Varieties; a new path-breaking work by Rohit Prasad, will be available from October 17, 2015.

6 Stamp booklets were issued during Daker Saaj, the 8th West Bengal State Philatelic Exhibition held at Kolkata from October 8 to 13, 2015.

On first day two booklets were issued, one each on International Day of Yoga and Women Empowerment. On October 9 a booklet on Nabakalebara, Shri Jagannath Dham Puri was released. The booklet issued on Oct 10 and 11 were on Samrat Ashoka and Mahatma Gandhi respectively. A booklet on FIFA World Cup Football was released on October 12, 2015.

Daker Saaj

In the historic year of 1757 Nabakrishna Deb of Sovabazar of Calcuta started Durga Puja in his house. Within few years it became famous for its gorgeous decoration and meticulous performance of rituals and started attracting elite and commoners alike. The Deb family introduced new decorations made of silver foil for the Idol of Goddess Durga. These decorations (Saaj) were imported from Germany by post (Dak) and became known as Daker Saaj. Today Daker Saaj is the most popular form of the decorations of the Goddess. The 8th state level philatelic exhibition organized by the West Bengal Circle of India Post on the eve of Durga Puja this year has thus befittingly been named Daker Saaj.

Keshari Nath Tripathi, the governor of West Bengal inaugurated Daker Saaj at the Academy of Fine Arts, Kolkata on October 9, 2015. The Governor also released a Special Cover and two Stamp Booklets on this occasion.

Following the inauguration, Rajib Sanyal conducted the Quiz in which 25 schools participated. Delhi Public School, Ruby Park won the contest while La Martiniere for Girls and Hooghly Colligate School came Second and Third respectively.

63 students from 20 schools participated in the Letter Writing Competition on October 9, 2015. 66 students in Junior Group and 76 in Senior Group participated in Sit and Draw on October 10, 2015.

The exhibition organized by the Chief Postmaster General of West Bengal continued till October 13, 2015. One Special Cover and one Stamp Booklet were released on October 9, 10, 11, and 12, 2015. Award Ceremony was held on October 13, 2015.

Eminent philatelists S C Sukhani, Dipok Dey, Mohammad Mujibullah, Moloy Sarkar, Shital Pradhan, Dilip Kumar Das, Biswanath Jhunjunwala, P C Jaiswal, Manik Jain, Babul Dey, Soma Dey, and Basudeb Ganguly participated with their exhibits in Invitee Class in 40 frames. Kolkata GPO and 2 Central Base Post Office of Army Postal Service participated with exhibits in Official Class in 10 frames.

There were 141 frames in the Competitive Class. P K Bishoi, Director of Rafi Ahmed Kidwai National Postal Academy, and Ashok Kumar Bayanwala served as Jury. S C Barmma, Chief Postmaster General of the North Eastern Circle served as Apprentice Jury.

16 Stamp Dealers participated with their Sales Stalls.

Pakistan Overprint on Service Post Cards of British India with Forms used by North Western Railway

Usman Ali Isani, the author of "Pakistan Overprint on Service Post Cards of British India with Forms used by North Western Railway" needs no introduction to the philatelic community. This is his fourth philatelic work and looking at the size and scope of this and his earlier works, it seems he is going to soon supersede the 12 tasks of Hercules.

This is a monumental work focusing on British India post cards overprinted SERVICE for official use of North Western Railway. The Railway printed 13 different standardised forms on these cards. The in-depth study Isani made of these post cards including plating of the mother sheet of 28 post cards and discovering flaws that identify the positions is truly a remarkable achievement. He has also gone on to record the quantity printed as well as census of each variety of cards recorded. The work is divided in 17 chapters and catalogues 73 main types of cards with several sub types of each. And all types including sub types are priced.

This is an indispensable book for all interested in the post cards of British India of King George V and VI period.

The book has excellent production values as always with his works. Pakistan Post Foundation has published this work of 760 A4 size all colour pages on art paper, hardbound in two volumes in a slip case.
