NEW STAMPS RELEASED

LALAN FAKIR and ALLAH JILAI BAI

India Post released a set of 2 special stamps in the denomination of Rs5 each, on noted folk musicians Lalan Fakir and Allah Jilai Bai in the Personalities Series on December 29, 2003.

Lalan Fakir was the all-time emperor of Baul songs - the most popular folk songs of rural Bengal and his contribution to making them even more popular is immense. Rabindra Nath Tagore was deeply influenced by Lalan's ideology and composed many songs based on his baul philosophy. He preached spiritual ideology based on the tenets of philanthropy, universal love and secularism.

Allah Jilai Bai was born in a traditional family of musicians. Her mother used to sing in the court of Maharaja Ganga Singh of Bikaner, Rajasthan and young Jilai Bai used to accompany her mother. Her melodious voice was found to be so captivating that she was put under the tutelage of Ustad Hussain Bakhsh when she was merely eight years old. Her forte was Maand and Lok Sangeet. She was awarded 'Padamashri' by the Government of India besides several other prestigious awards by various other Academies of art and culture.

Sankha Samanta designed the stamp, and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Information Sheet containing write-up and technical data and priced at Rs2 was issued on the occasion. The FDC is also priced at Rs2.

Calcutta Security Printers Limited of Kanpur printed the stamps by Photo Offset in four colors on Matt Chromo paper in the quantity of 0.4 million each in the sheets of 50 stamps.

MAJOR SOMNATH SHARMA

India Post released a stamp in the denomination of Rs5 on December 31, 2003 to commemorate Major Somnath Sharma, the first recipient of the Param Vir Chakra, the highest gallantry award.

Sharma was born in a family of soldiers and doctors and took to the army life reveling in the challenges of a hard life. In 1947 he was selected to be a part of the force that was sent to rescue Kashmir from tribal raiders. His company was surrounded by more than 700 enemy forces and began to sustain heavy casualties. Sharma urged his company to fight the enemy tenaciously and kept exposing himself repeatedly to heavy fire to urge his company to hold on that resulted in the reinforcements to get into position and stem the tide of the enemy advance. Major Sharma set an example of soldierly qualities seldom equaled in the history of the Indian Army.

India Security Press designed the stamp. Alka Sharma designed the First Day Cover and the pictorial first day postmark. Information Sheet containing write-up and technical data and priced at Rs2 was issued on the occasion. The FDC is also priced at Rs2.

India Security Press of Nashik Road printed the stamps by photogravure in multicolor on imported un-watermarked adhesive gravure coated stamp paper in the quantity of 0.4 million in the sheets of 40 stamps.

S NIJALINGAPPA

India Post released a stamp in the denomination of Rs5 on December 31, 2003 to commemorate S Nijalingappa who straddled the history of Karnataka and left a mark that has never been effaced.

The teachings of Nijalingappa's parents laid the foundation for a secular outlook. He became a lawyer and his guiding principles as a lawyer were truth and justice and he believed that making money was not the goal of a lawyer. He played an important role in the liberation of the motherland and participated in the flag movement in 1938. Formation of a separate Karnataka State and leading it as its first Chief Minister was a major milestone in his life. He was committed to creating a humanistic egalitarian, moral and democratic political environment. He visualized an India that was economically strong, socially vibrant and modern in outlook.

Kamleshwar Singh designed the stamp. Alka Sharma designed the First Day Cover and the pictorial first day postmark. Information Sheet containing write-up and technical data and priced at Rs2 was issued on the occasion. The FDC is also priced at Rs2.

Madras Security Printers of Chennai printed the stamp by Photo Offset in four colors on Imported Un-watermarked Stamp Paper in the quantity of 0.4 million in the sheets of 40 stamps.

RECENT & FORTHCOMING EVENTS

KARNAPEX 2003

India Post organized the 9<sup>th</sup> Karnataka state level philatelic exhibition from December 26 to 29, 2003 at Dharwad and was one of the very well organized shows.

An Information Brochure giving details of places of interest around Dharwad, and important telephone numbers was published that was very useful.

180 participants including 69 in Youth class and 10 Schools displayed their exhibits in 421 frames. In addition several internationally acclaimed exhibits were displayed in the Invitee class in 36 frames.

The Jury chaired by Chief Post Master General of Karnataka, Dr. K B H Nayar consisted of Dr Sita Bhateja and Dhananjay Desai with K Prakash and P N Ranjit Kumar as Apprentices.

K Padmanabhan, the Chief General Manager of the Bharat Sanchar Nigam Limited's Karnataka Circle, gave away the awards. There were 5 Vermeil, 13 Silver, 24 Silver Bronze, 58 bronze and 40 Diplomas awarded. 32 special prizes were also awarded.

The Department of Posts Award for the best exhibit in the School Collections Class was won by the Vijaya High School, Bangalore. Pooja Kulkarni won the Department of Posts Award for the best exhibit in the youth class and H M Ananda Murty won the Department of Posts Award for the best exhibit in the senior group.

Four special covers with special postmarks, one for each day, were released. The first day was befittingly devoted to Indian Classical Music as such greats as Panchakshari Gavai, Kumar Gandharva, Pandit Mallikarjun Mansur, and Pandit Basvaraj Rajguru all belong to Dharwad. The second day's special cover features Vijaya Nagar empire's ruins and royal emblems of other Kingdoms in Karnataka. The third day was devoted to the folk dance. The special cover for the fourth day commemorated the

death centenary of Rev. Ferdinand Kittel who compiled the first Kannada English Dictionary in 1894. A souvenir was also released on the occasion.

18 picture postcards, and 7 greeting cards, all depicting Indian stamps were also issued on the occasion. Karnataka Circle of India Post also published a full color illustrated book on permanent pictorial postmarks in Karnataka and released it during KARNAPEX. Also published was a List of Stamps from 1852 to 2003. Please contact the Philatelic Counter, Dharwad Head Post Office 580001 for availability, prices and other details.

A philatelic quiz competition, workshop on philately for School Teachers & students, Seminar on Thematic Philatelic, Jurors' Session with participants, and philatelists' interaction with postal officials were organized during the show.
