DR. GARWARE STAMP RELEASED

The Lok Sabha Speaker, Manohar Joshi released a commemorative postage stamp in the denomination of Rs.5 on Dr. B D Garware popularly known as Abasaheb at a function at Mumbai on February 6, 2004.

Dr Garware was an entrepreneur who put into practice Mahatma Gandhi's precepts of trusteeship for the good of workers. He founded about seventy five Trusts for pursuing various charitable objects and for contributing funds towards research and development work. His contributions in the field of education have been invaluable. It was only due to his efforts that a number of educational institutions and projects were set up. Besides, several donations were given for schools and colleges, gymnasias, libraries, badminton halls, laboratories, etc. Annual awards and Annual Scholarships were also instituted by him to promote academic excellence among students. Abasaheb was an avid lover of Indian classical music.

He was chosen to captain institutions like the State Financial Corporation, State Bank of India and many delegations to foreign countries. He was appointed Sheriff of Mumbai in 1959. The Government of India bestowed on him the Padma Bhushan award in 1971. Recipient of an honorary D. Litt. Degree by the University of Pune in 1989, he was also awarded the Udyog Ratna by the Institute of Economics Studies in the same year.

Suresh Kumar designed the stamp, miniature sheet and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Information Sheet containing write-up and technical data and priced at Rs.2 was issued on the occasion. The FDC is also priced at Rs 2.

Calcutta Security Printers Limited of Kanpur printed the stamps by Photo Offset in four colors on Matt Chromo paper in the quantity of 0.8 million in the sheets of 40 stamps. The miniature sheet is printed in the quantity of 50,000 only.

FAKE STAMP SCAM UPDATES

Narasimha Rao, a senior Police officer was arrested on February 10, 2004 at Hyderabad by the Andhra Pradesh's Special Investigation Team (SIT) in connection with the multi-billion fake stamp scam. He was produced before first Additional Metropolitan Sessions Judge Jaganath Reddy, who remanded him to judicial custody till March 8, 2004. Rao, was the Deputy Commissioner of Police (Crime) in Hyderabad in 2001 and allegedly took a bribe of Rs200,000 from the associates of Telgi for "not taking action required as per law."

The Special Investigation Team probing (SIT) the multi-billion fake stamp paper scam arrested two policemen, Deputy Superintendent Satyanarayana Reddy and sub inspector Madhu Mohan, in Hyderabad on February 8, 2004. Reddy worked as Inspector and Madhu as Sub Inspector in Central Crime Station in 2001 when the scam was unearthed in Begumbazar police station.

Kolkata police on February 6, 2004 busted a document racket, seizing fake stamp papers, land deeds and rubbers stamps of top government officials from a resident of an East Jadavpur locality, off EM Bypass. The police have arrested Ram Prasad Mondal and two of his alleged accomplices. Over 30 fake stamp papers, valued between Rs 2,000 and Rs 5,000 were found in Mondal's home. Nearly 50 fake rubber stamps belonging to senior KMDA, income-tax, judicial and KMC officials were also found, as were several fake land deeds.

PHILATELY IN TRANSITION IN INDIA, Part 67

Mafatlal Sheth, well known professional philatelist & member of the Philatelic Advisory Committee of Government of India commented on the previous issue of this column, as follows:

"I appreciate your remarks regarding illegal appointment of Damayanti Pittie and M G Pittie as Jurors at Hong Kong 2004 stamp exhibition. The fact that both Pitie appointed themselves as Jurors illegally is terrible, they have no respect for laws and Rules and the fact that Jurors are both relatives make it more suspicious about their self appointment.

I feel at this point of time we have to act and this fact may be communicated in writing to: Ministry of Communication, Government of India, FIAP, FIP drawing their attention to the fact that appointments are illegal and in future no appointment from the Philatelic Congress of India (PCI) should be accepted as at the moment court cases are pending against them.

Also Hong Kong Postal Administration and other world Postal Authorities be now informed that at the moment there is no recognized national organization functioning in India and PCI is not legally in existence and PCI should be debarred in making any appointments which will prevent these people from appointing themselves as commissioners and Jurors.

I thank you for drawing attention to illegal activities being carried on by PCI officers.
