The General Elections 2004 for the  $14^{\rm th}$  parliament have concluded on May 10, 2004. Just for the record there were 543 seats up for grabs and 5,435 candidates were vying for them at 687,402 polling stations and seeking votes from more than 671 million voters. The Cost? PICTURE CARD ON 30 YRS OF THE NUCLEAR TEST

The year 2004 is being celebrated as National Science Awareness Year and the Philatelic Society of Rajasthan is bringing out a Picture Card to mark the  $30^{\rm th}$  anniversary of India's first nuclear test at Pokaran in Rajasthan that took place on May 18, 1974.

The Cards will be released by Shrimat Pandey IAS, Secretary, Department of Science & Technology on May 18, 2004. These cards will also be posted on the same day from Pokaran Post Office and will bear cancellation of Pokaran of that date. A multicolor card in Size of 6x4 has the Picture of Nuclear Test Site at Pokaran and the logo of the Philatelic Society of Rajasthan on front and the brief history of the nuclear test at the back of the Card.

100 Sets of 200 Picture card mounted on written up Sheet with one card showing the back postally used from Pokaran on May 18, 2004 and one with front view will be sold for Rs 20 each on first come first served basis. Outstation requirements have to pay by DD/Mint Stamps along with Ordinary / Registered / Speed Post charges at actual. # FAKE STAMP SCAM UPDATES

Special judge S M Shembole on May 10, 2004 issued production warrant against the four accused in the multi-billion rupee fake stamp racket, Abdul Karim Telgi and Kadar Shah Yosuf Singoti, both lodged in the Bangalore jail; Jaiprakash Singh, who is in Yerwada jail; and Mohammed Sayeed Yasin, who is imprisoned in Mumbai. The CBI officials, through their counsel Raja Thakare, had asked for the custody of the accused for interrogation. The matter will come up for hearing on May 20.

CBI, probing the stamp scam, has given an undertaking before the Supreme Court that it would not subject the accused to the modern narco-analysis or truth serum test till further orders on appeals challenging a Bombay High Court order permitting such tests to be conducted on them. A bench of Justice K G Balakrishnan and Justice B N Srikrishna recorded the undertaking given by Additional Solicitor General R N Trivedi on behalf of the CBI during arguments on appeals filed by accused Anil Gote and M R Mehta on May 9, 2004.

Mumbai's L T Marg police on May 5, 2004 arrested a 26-year-old youth from Uttar Pradesh, Mohammad Nasim Mohammad Jahir Khan for selling fake

stamp papers worth Rs 7 to 8 million to vendors in Mumbai and Delhi through courier services. He has been remanded to police custody by the magistrate.

#### INDIA SOUTH AFRICA DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS

On October 16, 2003, the South African Post Office issued a miniature sheet to celebrate 10 years of bilateral relations between South Africa and India.

Indian mission in South Africa started from May 30, 1993 and South African Mission in New Delhi from November 1, 1993. An agreement on full diplomatic relations between the two countries was signed on November 22, 1993.

Designed by Thea Swanepoel the miniature sheet features a map that shows South Africa and India highlighting geographic relations between the two countries. Also incorporated in the design is the pot that was found at the Masorini archaeological site in the Kruger National Park, the Umgeni river in KwaZulu-Natal as well as the flower, lotus or water lily, that is the national flower of India.

The face value of miniature sheet is R 3.35 that is the postage rate for B5 size envelope. Government Printers produced the miniature sheet by Offset Litho in the quantity of 30,000.
